





Park Lane construction compound update

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty Vinci (BBV) is working on behalf of HS2 Ltd to build the new railway in your area.

What we are doing:

To support the building of the railway, we need to construct compounds along the route including one at Park Lane.

Construction update:

LM are currently carrying out works in the area including constructing a new roundabout on the A452 and have a construction compound off Park Lane (see map below). BBV expect to start constructing their main compound in Park Lane in mid-June 2020 and will take up to eight months to complete and include office space, welfare facilities for site workers and areas to store materials.

The work will start week beginning 15th June 2020 with Portacabins being delivered to the current compound and construction will start week beginning 22nd June 2020. Once complete we will start the main civils construction work.

What are the traffic routes for this location?

The compound is located off Park Lane (please see map below) Construction traffic will access the compound off the existing road (Park Lane).





Duration of works

The work will start week beginning 15th June 2020 and will take up to 8 months to complete.

What to expect

Core working hours will be 8am to 6pm on weekdays (excluding bank holidays) and from 8am to 1pm on Saturdays with an hour before and after these times to set up or secure the site.

Some noise from on-site machinery during working hours.

What to Expect

Compound construction will begin with Portacabins being delivered to the BBV compound and will be followed by delivery of materials to carry out essential utility works in order to supply water, electricity and telecommunications to the compound and to resurface an area of land within the compound to construct a staff car park followed by the construction and connection of the offices.

Work Force Travel Plans

Once is the compound is completed in early 2021, we will produce an effective work force travel plan helping us to minimise our impact on the local communities, environment, road network.
