

Notice of archaeological works at Wormleighton

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. A In response to the Covid-19 virus we have worked hard to ensure that our working practices are fully aligned with the Site Operating Procedures produced by the Construction Leadership Council and in line with Government and Public Health England advice. We will be keeping our local website www.hs2inwarwickshire.co.uk up to date with information on our works, and the measures we have in place to maintain the safety

Please be assured that only sites that can operate within the guidelines are operational. All sites will remain under constant review. We have postponed all face-to-face engagement events and meetings and have put in place a number of channels to communicate with communities, such as letters and phone calls, as well as updates and alerts from each of the local community websites. When will these works take place?

These works will start mid-November 2019 and will be completed by the end of June 2021.

The site is located at Wormleighton. The site will be accessed off the southern section of Leisure Drive.

What will we be doing?

We will begin archaeological investigations in the area shown on the map. These works will enable a greater understanding of significant archaeology in the area. This will require the excavation of a number of trial trenches. It will also consist of larger excavations in areas of significant interest once the trial trenching has been completed.

This work will be carried out by Connect, Fusion's archaeology subcontractor. The digging and investigations will be done by teams of five workers using a mechanical excavator. There will be a maximum of two teams on site and a small number of supervision staff visiting site to ensure the work is progressing to plan and is being done safely.

Duration of works

The works will start mid November 2019 until the end of June 2021.

Normal working hours:

Monday to Friday 8am – 6pm.

Our contractors may also be on site for one hour's quite start-up and shutdown outside of these times.

What to expect

Some additional traffic on local roads.

Noise from the equipment used for the works.

Site manned with 24hr security and temporary flood lighting.

Site storage and welfare vehicle.

What we will do

Manage any impacts, such as traffic and noise with the aim of reducing or removing them.

How may this affect you?

We will be working hard to ensure any impacts on residents are kept to a minimum during these and all our future works. You may notice a little extra traffic on the road immediately around the sites with workers moving to and from the site, and occasional delivery vehicles. There may be some noise from the machinery. All machinery will be restricted to running between the hours of 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday. There may be occasional weekend working subject to local authority consent.

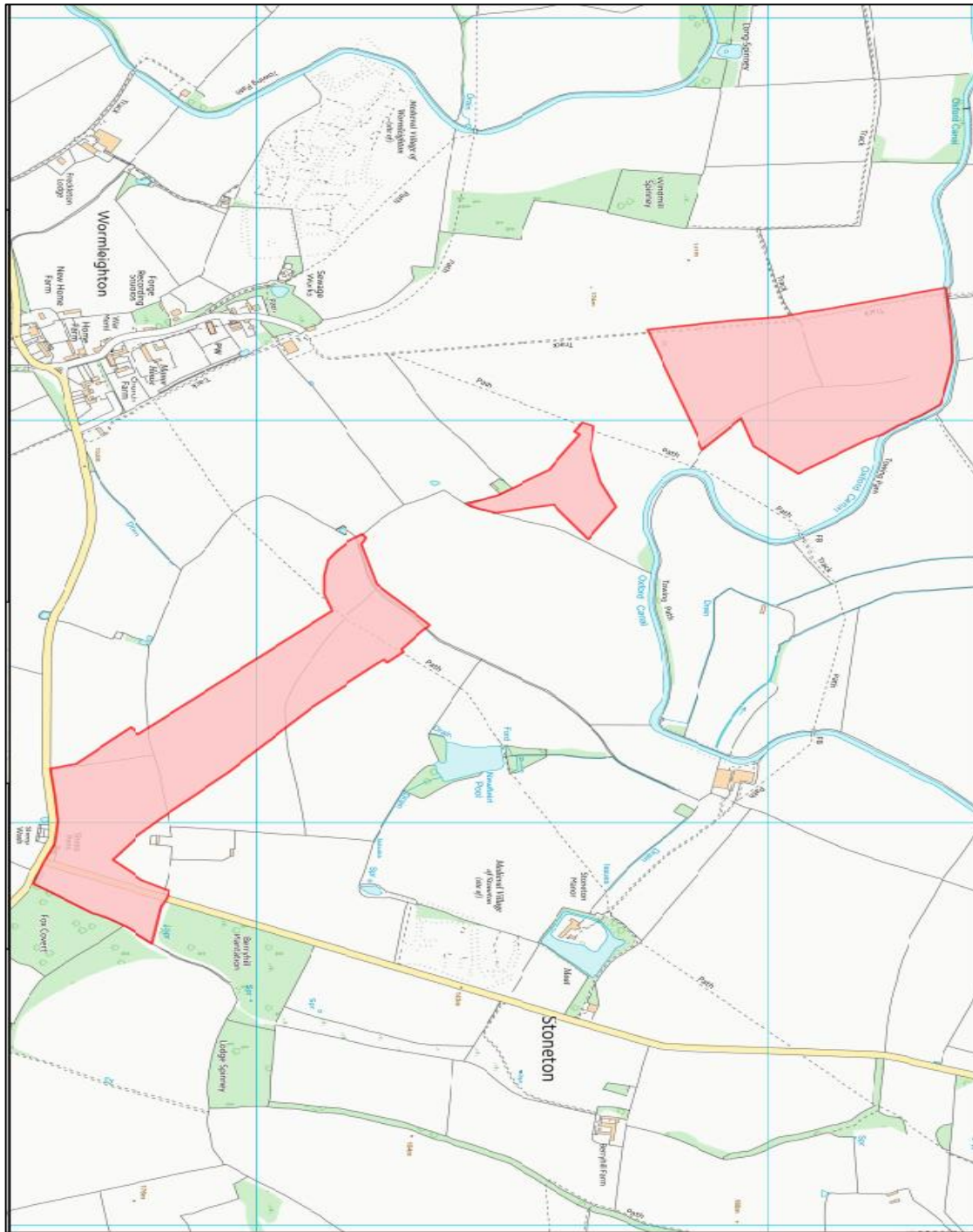
