High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty VINCI (BBV) is working in partnership with HS2 Ltd to build the new high speed railway in your area.

The work we will be doing

Subject to consents being accepted we will be implementing trial holes near the M42 junction 7 and 7a northbound.

When these works will take place

The works will take place overnight on Monday 12 July and Tuesday 13 July on junction 7. They will then take place on junction 7A overnight on Wednesday 14 July and Thursday 15 July. The works will take place from 9pm - 5am. To carry out our works safely we will:

- Implement a full overnight closure of the M42 Junction 7 northbound on 12 July and 13 July
- Implement hard shoulder closure of the M6 Junction 4 exit slip road on 12 July and 13 July
- Implement a full overnight closure of the M42 Junction 7A northbound on 14 July and 15 July
- Implement temporary lane closure on lane 2 of the M6 Junction 4 exit slip road on 14 July and 15 July


Diversion

Map to outline the location of works

Below, map 1 shows the location of traffic management on the M42 junction 7 in red. The diversion route, shown in green, runs north on the M42 from junction 7 towards the Dunton Island at junction 9. From here it runs back south on the M42 to the M42/M6 link road to route westbound back to the M6.

Map 2 shows the location of traffic management on the M42 junction 7a in red. The diversion route, shown in green, runs north on the M42 from junction 7a as far as the Dunton Island at junction 9 and runs back south down the M42.

The below map shows the location of traffic management on the M6 junction 4 slip road in red. The diversion route, shown in green, runs east on the M6 from junction 4 until a roundabout U turn at junction 3 which routes back westbound to M6 Junction 4 exit slip road.
