High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

Thames Water update

To make way to the new HS2 railway line we need to carry out some surveys and trial holes on our sewer in Gloucester Avenue.

Our work

From Monday 27 September, we will be carrying out trial holes on Gloucester Avenue between Regents Park Road and Oval Road. Our work will take up to six weeks to complete.

The work will be carried out two phases:

Eastbound carriageway

We will be working in the eastern lane from Monday 27 September for approximately three weeks.

There will be two-way traffic lights in place and the road will remain open at all times.

We will need to suspend the bus stop next to the junction to Oval Road. Eight parking bays will also be suspended and the footpath on this side of the road will be closed. The footpath opposite will remain open.

Pedestrian access to Darwin Court will maintained at all times but there will be a footpath diversion in place.

Westbound carriageway

The two-way traffic lights will remain in place.

The western bus stop heading up to Regents Park Road will be suspended and so will ten parking bays. The footpath will be closed but access to all houses will be maintained and a footpath diversion will be in place.

This section of work will take approximately three weeks.
