

Weekend road closure on Victoria Road

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

We are continually reviewing the works on our construction sites in line with Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on dealing with COVID-19.

Weekend road closure on Victoria Road to install conveyor crossing over road and rail

During 2021, we began the construction work for the conveyor system between our sites in Old Oak and park Royal to allow for the movement of excavated material between sites. The conveyor system will help reduce construction traffic on local roads while we build HS2.

As part of the system to connect the Victoria Road Flat Iron site and the Atlas Road site, we will be installing an enclosed conveyor crossing over Dudding Hill bridge on Victoria Road. These works will require the use of a 1000 tonne crane to lift the bridge segments into position.

To install the conveyor crossing safely, Victoria Road will be closed to vehicles from **9pm on Friday 24 September to 6am on Monday 27 September**. The works will be carried out during a track possession when trains are not running. This means that we will be working during the day and overnight. There will be lighting in place to support the works - this will be directed away from residential properties.

If the conveyor crossing cannot be installed on this weekend unforeseen circumstance or weather conditions that would make the installation unsafe, the works are planned on one of the following weekends: 1 to 4 October, 8 to 11 October or 15 to 17 October 2021. We will inform you in advance if we require to complete the works on an additional weekend.

From 9pm on 24 September to 6am on 27 September 2021

Full road closure between Chandos Road and Midland Terrace

Full footpath closure between Chandos Road and Midland Terrace during the lifting operations

Pedestrian transportation we be provided during footpath closure

Vehicle and pedestrian diversions will be in place

You may notice some additional noise and light during installation of the bridge

What we will do

Advise our staff to be considerate of our neighbours during the works

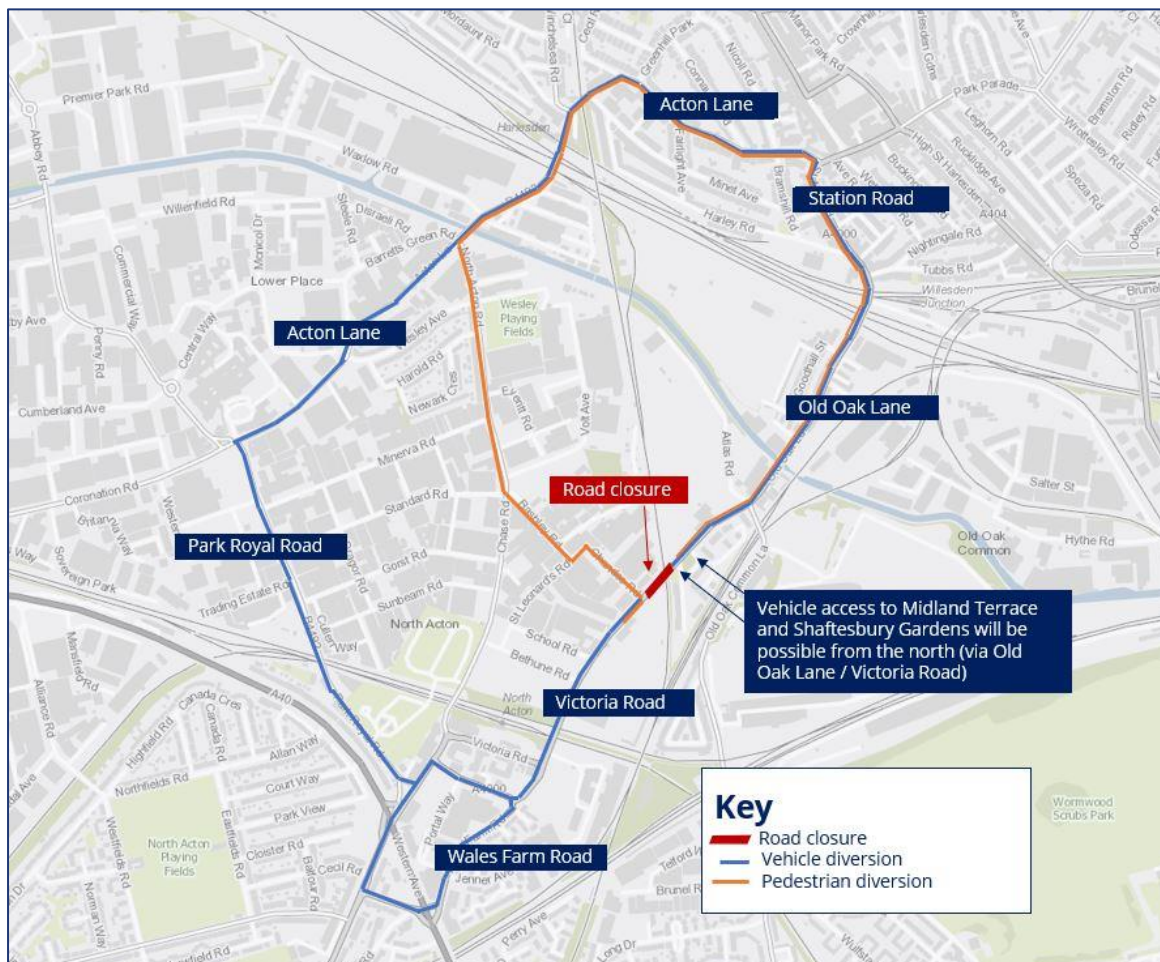
Temporary Road changes during the installation

During these works a full road closure on Victoria Road between Chandos Road and Midland Terrace, either side of Dudding Hill bridge.

A vehicle and pedestrian diversion will be clearly signed. A map of the diversions is shown below.

During the road closure, vehicle access to Midland Terrace will be possible via Old Oak Lane and Victoria Road only (please see the map below). Vehicle access to local businesses will be possible at all times via the signed diversion route.

During the works, we will be carrying out two lifting operations lasting approximately three hours each. For safety reasons during the lifting operations, there will be no pedestrian access between Chandos Road and Midland Terrace. We will be providing a shuttle service for pedestrians travelling along Victoria Road during the footpath closure. The details of the shuttle service are still being confirmed and we will provide further information to local residents ahead of the closure. We will also have traffic marshals in the area to assist pedestrians.

What to expect

During these works you may notice the following:

- The works will take place during the day and overnight
- Staff will be on site throughout the works
- We will be using a 1000 tonne crane during the works – you will be able to see the crane lifting the conveyor crossing into place.
- Due to the works taking place during overnight working hours, we will have additional lighting in place. We will direct these away from residential properties as much as possible.
- You may notice additional noise during the installation of the conveyor crossing. We will do all we can to minimise this.

We apologise in advance for any disruption you experience during these works.
