High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Early works for HS2 are being carried out by a joint venture between Laing O'Rourke and J. Murphy & Sons, known as LM.

We're working around the Stonebridge Island area

As part of our preparation works for future construction of the HS2 railway route, we are undertaking roadside vegetation clearance. To safely carry out our works, we will install temporary traffic measures when necessary. We will be working on and around Stonebridge Island, including sections of the A452, A446 and A45.

We'll be working throughout January, February and March

Subject to obtaining the relevant consents, we will be carrying out the following temporary traffic measures in January, February, and March (see maps on page 2):

- Temporary road closure of Packington Lane and lane closures along sections of the A446 and A452 southbound, from 09:30am to 3:30pm each weekday, between Monday 24 January to Friday 18 February.
- Temporary lane closures along sections of the A452 and A45 near Stonebridge Island, from 09.30am to 3.30pm each weekday, between Monday 21 February to Friday 4 March.

Maintain access to all buildings and businesses in the area.



= temporary road closure = temporary lane closure




Location of temporary lane closures near Stonebridge Island

About our Community and Business Funds
