

Off-peak survey and monitoring works on M25, Denham to Maple Cross, junctions 16 and 17

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. We are following Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on working safely during the pandemic. As we increase face to face engagement, in addition to virtual engagement, we will ensure all events and meetings adhere to the guidelines. What works are taking place?

HS2 contractors Align JV will be carrying out monitoring and maintenance works on the M25, on both the clockwise and anti clockwise emergency lane/hard shoulder between Junction 16 (Denham Interchange) and Junction 17 (Maple Cross Interchange).

The maintenance work will be carried out across four days on two separate occasions during the daytime. Works will take place mid-January and mid-May 2022. Details of the phasing, dates and carriageways affected are listed in the table overleaf. There will be emergency lane/hard shoulder closures in place on both carriageways from 9:30am to 4pm each day whilst the maintenance takes place.

Advance warning signage will be put in place prior to the works taking place. Whilst disruption will be kept to a minimum, we would remind road users to plan their journeys and to be aware of the temporary emergency lane/hard shoulder closures to allow the works to be carried out safely.

Please note works are 'subject to change' We aim to meet our planned working dates, but these can change due to the impact of the weather or programme changes. We will do all we can to keep you updated.

- Tuesday 18 to Wednesday 19 January 2022
- Tuesday 17 to Wednesday 18 May 2022.

What to expect

Works on the M25 between Junctions 16 and 17 with emergency lane / hard shoulder closures in both directions during the two phases between 9:30am and 4pm

You will still be able to travel in both directions during the works.

- Manage impacts such as traffic and noise with the aim of reducing these where we can
- Ensure clear signage is in place for drivers.
