High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. We are following Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on working safely during the pandemic. As we increase face to face engagement, in addition to virtual engagement, we will ensure all events and meetings adhere to the guidelines. What we are doing

In preparation for the start of tunnelling later this year, we will be carrying out a series of utility surveys on Eastcote Lane, Mandeville Road, Badminton Close and Belvue Road from the 21 February to 23 March 2022. These surveys will provide us with information on the condition of the existing utility services and help us to decide how best to protect them. Detail of dates and locations are shown on the maps overleaf.

We will investigate the condition of the sewer system using a CCTV camera mounted on a small robot. Should we find a blockage we may need to flush the system using a high-pressure water jet in order to carry out the investigation.

How the surveys might affect you

Temporary traffic management, lane closures and parking bay suspensions will be in place for the duration and dates shown on the maps overleaf. We will reinstate after each investigation has been completed.

Carr Road and Mandeville Road junction closed overnight only on 23 and 24 February.

Parking bay suspensions will be in place to support traffic management. Your utility services will not be affected.

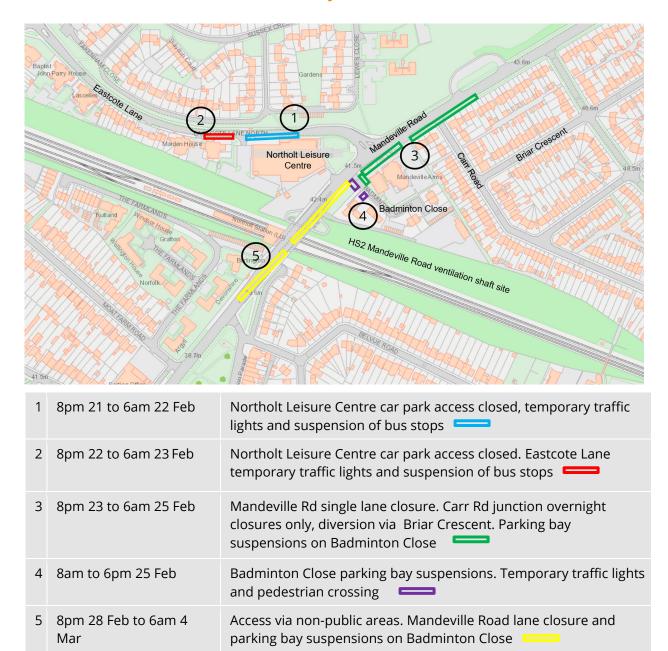

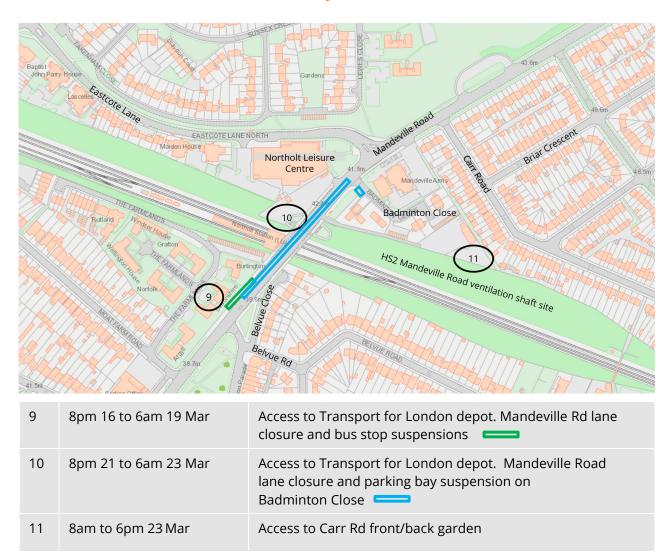
