High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Working on behalf of HS2 Ltd, Kier is carrying out surveys and investigating ground conditions along the Phase 2a route

What we are doing

We will be carrying out ground penetrating surveys to help us identify the location of buried utility services, such as gas, electric or water. These surveys are non-intrusive, we will use a machine that transmits an electromagnetic pulse into the ground. These pulses reflect off features in the ground, allowing us to collect data and to understand the depth of the buried utility services.

Along with ground penetrating surveys, we will carry out several other surveys with a road closures on Den lane, Mill Lane and Checkley Lane.

When the work will take place

Work will take place from **Thursday 10 March to Thursday 24 March 2022**. Please note that all our planned roadworks may be subject to change due to weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances. We will notify you in advance of any changes.

How this will affect your journey

On **Thursday 10 to Thursday 24 March** (excluding weekends) from **9am to 4pm** we need to close a section of Den Lane and Mill Lane. We will put a fully signed diversion route in place along Checkley Lane, A51 and the B5071 (**Diversion route A**). Please allow an additional 10 minutes for your journey

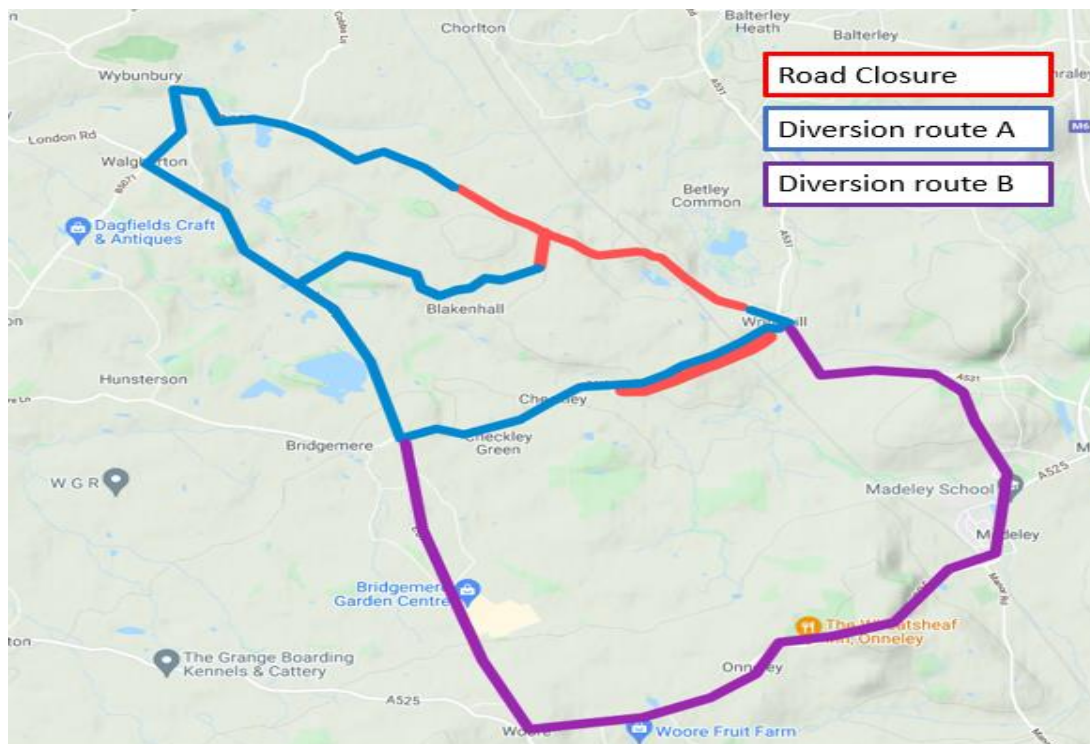
On **Wednesday 16 to Thursday 24 March** (excluding weekends) from **9am to 4pm** we need to close a section of Checkley Lane. We will put a fully signed diversion route in place along the A51, A525 and Bowsey wood Road (**Diversion route B**). Please allow an additional 10 minutes for your journey.

To minimise disruption, Den Lane and Checkley Lane road closures will take place on different days.

How we will minimise disruption

We will maintain access to all properties within the closure. In addition to our operatives manning the closure to allow access, we will install several interacting talk boards that residents and businesses can use for instant communications with our workforce to arrange access. The nature of the work is non-intrusive and should not affect nearby properties.

About our Community and Business Funds

Two funds are now open for applications from local communities and businesses affected by the construction of HS2. They are the Community and Environment Fund (CEF) and the Business and Local Economy Fund (BLEF). £5 million has been allocated to the funds for phase 2a of the railway.

The CEF is designed to give communities the opportunity to share in the benefits of HS2. It is an allocated fund that communities are able to apply for, to help to support local projects that aim to improve their local area.

The BLEF is designed to support local economies that may be disrupted by the construction of HS2. BLEF grants are for local business support organisations and local authorities to help maintain business activity in local communities.
