The document includes:


- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	Ongoing until	Colne Valley Viaduct, A412 North Orbital Way
A412 North Orbital Way, Bucks	2024	A programme of rotary piling has commenced on land adjacent to Denham Water Ski Club. These works are progressing southwards along the line of the viaduct.
		Cranes and piling rigs are being used and concrete for the bored piles is being delivered using our internal haul road to reduce HGVs on local roads.
		For pier locations above the lakes, we are building jetties - temporary bridge structures – across the lakes. To do this, we will drive and vibrate piles into the ground and place decking on top to form a working platform. This platform is used to support cranes and rigs which bore permanent piles for the piers into the ground under the lake.
		These piling works will create some noise and are likely be to be noticeable in the local area throughout the year. We will be carrying out targeted engagement with local residents to keep them updated on our progress.
Multiple locations	Ongoing activity	Continuing with water quality sampling from River Colne, River Pinn, Newyears Green Bourne and The Greenway.
		Small samples of water are taken from streams in the area each month. This is done by staff on foot taking a jam-jar sized sample for analysis.

Proposed Iuration	Description of works
September 2021 until March 2023	The northern construction site off Moorhall Road is now complete and fully operational. It is being used to construct the decking and other apparatus that will be used to construct the jetties that will stretch over the lakes within the Colne Valley. Site compound setup and haul road construction is still taking place to the south of Moorhall Road. This site is now being used to build construction

		apparatus that will be used to complete the works to the viaduct. To the south of Moorhall Road the haul road that will be used by construction vehicles to work on the Colne Valley Viaduct is still being constructed.
Location 2 Colne Valley lakes	Ongoing until November 2024	An existing works access point on Moorhall Road/Dellside is being used for limited works access. Public access to the Colne Valley Trail is not affected, however, part of Public Right of Way U34 has been diverted.
Location 3 Dews Lane	Ongoing until November 2024	A works compound and offices are operational at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activity Centre (HOAC) site at the end of Dews Lane. This compound is the operation centre for the construction of the temporary jetties and the permanent viaduct structure between HOAC and the Grand Union Canal south bank.
		Dews Lane is operating as a temporary haul road with secure access at the junction with Harvil Road. Access is permitted for local business (RAC Garages) and other community groups that require access from Harvil Road.
Location 4 Harvil Road	Ongoing until 2025	Permanent lights are installed to control construction traffic.
Location 5,7 and 3 Denham Country Park to Harvil Road	Ongoing until 2022	National Grid pylon diversion: National Grid has re-routed and raised the height of a line of electricity pylons in Colne Valley to achieve safety clearance for HS2 Ltd. Our remaining work focuses on the reinstatement of our working areas in consultation with stakeholders.
		To meet the requirements of London Borough of Hillingdon Council's reinstatement plan we'll work around the base of the old pylon tower near the Grand Union Canal. We'll remove the foundations and a stone crane pad. We'll also import topsoil to aid with replanting the area.
		This work involves use of the Dellside access gate during w/c 31 January, Monday to Friday between


		7.30am and 5pm. We expect to have 30 lorry movements over the five days.
		Replanting will be done when the weather is warmer, hopefully late next month.
		Remaining activities:
		Further reinstatement of work areas (including removal of haul road and bridges) following consultation with stakeholders
		Lifting of footpath closures – currently in place until April
Location 6 Dews Lane / Newyears Green Bourne	September 2021 to May 2022	Works are underway to excavate a temporary flood storage pond at a small section of Newyears Green Bourne to divert the stream in advance of the construction of the viaduct piers south of Harvil Road.
Location 7 Savay Lake to Grand Union Canal	September 2021 to March 2023	Sheet piling, cofferdams and jetty building will be followed by rotary piling for the ground and lake piers progressing south from Moorhall Road across Savay Lake and crossing the Grand Union Canal.
/ Harefield Marina		This work will create the permanent structures for the Colne Valley Viaduct.
		Towpath access along the Grand Union Canal will remain open throughout these works.
		From early 2023, the viaduct decking (the sections of decking which link the piers and form the surface of the viaduct) will be installed in this section by a large segment erection girder.
		The deck construction started in winter 2021 from the North Embankment near Denham Water Ski Club, Bucks, progressing from north to south along the viaduct.
Location 8 Harefield Lake No2	October 2021 to March 2024	Sheet piling, cofferdams and jetty building are underway across Harefield Lake No2 from the works compound at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activities Centre (HOAC).
		This will be followed by rotary piling for the ground and lake piers from HOAC to the southern bank of the Grand Union Canal.

		From March 2022 – 2024 a short section of the access track/National Cycle Route 6 on the southern side of Harefield Marina will be diverted to enable access to build the pier foundations on
		the southside of the Grand Union Canal. In the first phase, the path will be diverted around the edge of the worksite whilst a temporary pontoon is built in the canal to carry light vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists around the worksite. For a short period, a small worker welfare cabin will be located at this site.
		From early 2023 the viaduct decking (the sections of decking that link the piers and form the surface of the viaduct) will be installed in this section by a large segment erection girder, completing the permanent structure of the viaduct by early 2024.
Location 9 Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	February 2022 to December 2023	The existing bridleway leading from U34 to Harvil Road is diverted to allow for soil stockpiling north of HOAC. Access to the fishing locations and Dellside track are not affected, however users of the path are diverted around a perimeter fence.
		Material stockpiled in this location will be moved to site via the existing site entrance and access road at Harvil Road.
		The stockpile will be used to build the Colne Valley Viaduct South Embankment.
Location 10	February 2022 to December 2023	To build the embankment that will carry trains over the Harvil Road we will be working in three phases:
Colne Valley Viaduct	December 2023	Phase 1 - February 2022 to late March 2022:
South Embankment		We will be sheet piling to create retaining walls and working platforms on land to the western side of Harvil Road.
		Phase 2 - Late March 2022 to late April 2022:
		We will be carrying out rotary piling in the SCS compound on the eastern side of Harvil Road. During this time there will be an increase in site traffic entering the HS2 compound as concrete deliveries are required to complete the pile structures.
		Phase 3 - May 2022 to August 2022:

We will resume piling at the compound to the western side of Harvil Road. This driven piling will provide the foundations for the South Embankment.

In October 2023 – December 2023, once Harvil Road has been permanently realigned by SCS, Align will complete piling and platform works in the sections next to the new road, closing the gap on the new railway bridge over the Harvil Road.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 South Ruislip vent shaft	Ongoing until June 2022	 Works are ongoing to set up the South Ruislip site for future construction of the ventilation shaft and headhouse: Continuation of construction of the Diaphragm wall for the vent shaft Pipeline being laid along Network Rail land to Yeading Brook for the purpose of discharge water from dewatering process Piling
Location 2 Various locations along the Northolt	2022 to early 2024	Tunnel boring machines will be launched one month apart from the West Ruislip portal to commence excavation of the five-mile twin bored tunnels between West Ruislip and Greenpark Way in Ealing. The tunnels broadly follow the alignment of the London Underground Central Line and Chiltern Mainline Railway. They will be constructed near the following residential roads:

Tunnels West route

Ickenham Close, Blenheim Crescent, Herlwyn Avenue, Lawn Close, Almond Close, Cherry Close, Roundways and Bridgwater Road in the London Borough of Hillingdon and Rabournmead Drive, Mandeville Road and Greenpark Way in the London Borough of Ealing.

The alignment of the Northolt Tunnels West means that a number of roads pass over the tunnel route. To mitigate the effects of tunnelling settlement (ground movement) on utilities, a programme of protection and diversion works will be carried out ahead of when the tunnel boring machines pass nearby.

- Water and gas main diversions
- Water and gas main replacement
- Sewer lining

Due to the location of utilities within the highways and footways, there will be a series of temporary traffic management in place whilst the protection and diversion works are being carried out.

Location 3 Northolt Tunnels West - various locations

Spring/Summer 2022 to early 2024

Various locations near Ickenham Close, Blenheim Crescent, Herlwyn Avenue, Lawn Close, Almond Close, Cherry Close, Roundways, Bridgwater Road and Rabournmead Drive.

Monitoring of ground movement before, during and after tunnelling will be carried out and protection put in place where necessary on structures and bridges.

Ground movement from tunnelling is expected to have minimal or no impact on residential properties near the route.

- Properties identified as experiencing 10mm or more ground movement (ground movement occurs naturally at anything up to 10mm a year) qualify for a pre-condition survey and homeowners will be contacted directly by letter.
- Pre-condition surveys will be carried out 3 months ahead of tunnelling near properties

- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
