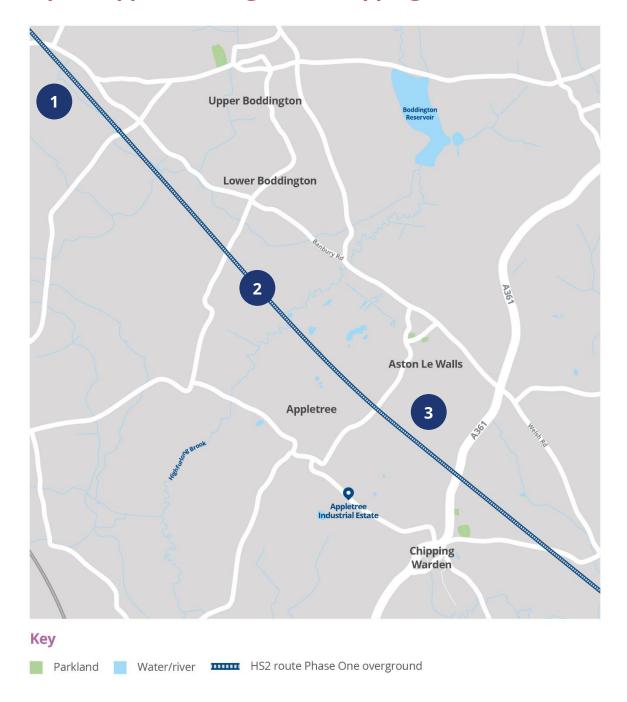
- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months

### **Construction look ahead**

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Boddington area	Ongoing	Work to the 'Heave Site' will continue through the summer where an earth embankment is being monitored.
	January to Summer 2021	South of Banbury Road will involve continued archaeological trial trench evaluation including the digging of a series of trial trenches to locate areas of significant archaeology.
	March to Summer 2021	Ecology works such as vegetation clearance and newt translocation will be taking place in this area.
	May to September 2021	Site access roads and road crossings will be formed, and earthworks expected to start in late summer.
Location 2 Lower Boddington area	May to December 2021	Earthworks activities will take place in this area. Soil excavated from the Chipping Warden Green tunnel will be transported north to this area.
	June to August 2021	Site access roads will be formed, and a temporary crossing formed across Highfurlong brook.
Location 3 Aston Le Walls and Chipping Warden area	February to June 2021	Archaeological mitigation, including topsoil excavations and hand digging to verify information collected from our ground penetrating radar surveys.
	March to June 2021	Ecology work, including vegetation clearance and newt translocation.
	June to September 2021	Earthworks for the green tunnel continuing between Aston Le Walls and Chipping Warden;
		Set up of concrete batching plant;
		Creation of temporary settlement ponds; and
		Works starting on site access roads and earth bunds. These activities will move north to Highfurlong brook where a temporary bridge

	will be formed, and move south to cross the A361.

Location 1 Culworth area	May to September 2021	<ul> <li>Preparation work, including environmental surveys, ground investigation works, vegetation clearance and fencing;</li> </ul>
	Surveys of the existing underground services with trial holes being excavated to identify the location of the services; and	
		Forming an access road along the route.

Location 2 Thorpe Mandeville and Sulgrave area (Magpie junction)	June to September 2021	<ul> <li>Construction of a concrete batching plant near to the offices already in place;</li> <li>Earthworks to the green tunnel;</li> <li>Forming temporary settlement ponds, site access roads and earth bunds; and</li> <li>Construction of a new temporary section of the B4525.</li> </ul>
Location 3 Sulgrave Road Junction / Greatworth	January to July 2021	Archaeological mitigation including topsoil excavations and hand digging which will uncover areas containing significant archaeology.
Location 4 Blackgrounds	February to Summer 2021	Archaeological mitigation including topsoil excavations and hand digging which will uncover areas containing significant archaeology.

		A main works compound is being set up to the north of the A43. Work will involve localised vegetation removal, utility and earthworks trials and set up of cabins;

## **Our Community Commitments**

- **2.** Work with communities to develop local two-way engagement and communication programmes, ensuring they are accessible and tailored to local needs.
- **3.** Make sure communities are made aware in advance of any activities taking place in their area.
- **4.** Operate a Freephone Community Helpline 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- **5.** Make health and safety a priority for communities and our workforce.
- **6.** Respect the wellbeing of communities, minimising disruption to their lives with local mitigation plans and activities, ensuring we meet the standards set out in the Code of Construction Practice.
- 7. Leave a positive and sustainable legacy for the communities in which we operate.
- **8.** Respond to questions and complaints quickly and efficiently, with an acknowledgement within two working days, and responding within a maximum of 20 working days if we cannot answer the query straight away.
- **9.** Promote awareness of all our property schemes so that anyone who may be eligible has all the information they need and is aware of the support available to them.
- **10.** Display the Residents' Commissioner and Construction Commissioner's contact details on all relevant materials, along with the HS2 Helpline information and complaints procedure.

The Code of Construction Practice forms part of the Secretary of State's Environmental Minimum Requirements for the construction of the railway from London to the West Midlands. It sets out the standards and responsibilities to protect communities and the environment during construction.
