Location 1 Addison Road	Ongoing until February 2021	Under track crossing to divert existing Anglian Water sewer route. Sewer will be diverted using horizontal directional drilling and bore holes. Works will include topographic surveys.

Location 2 Infrastructure Maintenance Depot	Ongoing until December 2020	Archaeology evaluation works at Shepherds Furze Farm (Infrastructure Maintenance Depot site).
Location 3 Great Moor Sailing Club	Ongoing until Winter 2020/21	Constructing a new vehicle and pedestrian entrance, a hard-standing area within the sailing club, a concrete slipway and floating pontoon.
Location 4 Sheephouse/ Decoypond Wood	Ongoing until Spring 2021	 Ancient woodland translocation. This includes transferring deadwood and woodland soil which contains seed stock to the new sites. Further tree planting will be done at Sheephouse Wood and Decoypond Wood.
Location 5 Gawcott Road and Calvert Jubilee Nature Reserve	Ongoing until Spring 2021	Vegetation clearance works alongside the HS2 route within the Calvert Jubilee Nature Reserve
Location 6 Calvert Road Site Compound	Winter 2020 – Winter 2021	Calvert Road site compound completion.



Location 1 Station Road	Ongoing until Summer 2021	 Internal access road construction, which includes highway crossing points and culverts. Lodge demolition at Doddershall Estate ahead of utility diversion works.
	Winter 2020 – Summer 2021	Station Road highway improvements and junction improvement works. Works include resurfacing of the carriageway and additional vehicle passing bays.
		Works require road diversion and night works, and the closure of Station Road for 24 hr weekday closures. The road will be open from 7am on a

		Saturday and close again at 9am on the following Monday.
Location 2 Doddershall	Ongoing until Winter 2020/21	Archaeological investigations, including a full soil stripping record of the medieval village at Doddershall Estate.





Location 1 Chalfont St Peter	Ongoing	Vent shaft D-walling completion; main shaft excavation

Location 2 Colne Valley	Ongoing until April 2021	Tree planting to compensate for the loss of woodland in the Colne Valley and screen views of the main construction compounds from nearby properties.
Location 3 Denham	Ongoing until February 2021	Construction of a site entrance, haul road crossing and internal haul road from the South Portal site across the A412.
		Works include compound setup, fencing and some local stockpiling of materials, as well as ongoing archaeological and ecological works.
		The existing lane closure on the A412 will be in place until February 2021, operating 24 hours per day 7 days a week. This will be managed by temporary two-way traffic lights to allow traffic to continue in both directions.

Our Community Commitments

- 1. Continue to build respectful, long-term relationships with communities and actively encourage our workforce to listen to local concerns and be considerate and accountable for their actions at all times.
- **2.** Work with communities to develop local two-way engagement and communication programmes, ensuring they are accessible and tailored to local needs.
- **3.** Make sure communities are made aware in advance of any activities taking place in their area.
- **4.** Operate a Freephone Community Helpline 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- **5.** Make health and safety a priority for communities and our workforce.
- **6.** Respect the wellbeing of communities, minimising disruption to their lives with local mitigation plans and activities, ensuring we meet the standards set out in the Code of Construction Practice.
- 7. Leave a positive and sustainable legacy for the communities in which we operate.
- **8.** Respond to questions and complaints quickly and efficiently, with an acknowledgement within two working days, and responding within a maximum of 20 working days if we cannot answer the query straight away.
- **9.** Promote awareness of all our property schemes so that anyone who may be eligible has all the information they need and is aware of the support available to them.
- **10.** Display the Residents' Commissioner and Construction Commissioner's contact details on all relevant materials, along with the HS2 Helpline information and complaints procedure.

The Code of Construction Practice forms part of the Secretary of State's Environmental Minimum Requirements for the construction of the railway from London to the West Midlands. It sets out the standards and responsibilities to protect communities and the environment during construction.
