This forward look covers HS2 associated work in Warwickshire.


The document is a forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	Ongoing until Winter 2021/2022	 Establishing a worksite, including setting up a site compound, creating accesses and constructing internal haul roads We will continue archaeological investigations on land just off Church Lane in Middleton We will also complete corridor preparation works such as vegetation clearance in Bodymoor Heath.
Location 2	Ongoing until Summer 2022	Construction of a main compound off Kingsbury Road, including car parking, offices, and welfare units that will be used by staff during construction. We will: • Work on setting up the engineering and manufacturing buildings on site. • Install lane closures along Kingsbury Road to allow us to protect utility pipes and commence construction of a roundabout which will be the permanent access to the compound. • Complete surveys, drainage works, internal access roads and utility works • Install telecommunications and utilities connections. • Divert / close footpaths / bridleways that are located in our working area.
Location 3	Winter 2021/2022	 Complete preparatory works for the Marston Box bridge. This will require closure of the M42 motorway between Junction 9 and 10 for one week (24 to 31 December 2021) Undertake utility diversions on and around Marston Lane Works on a section of the Marston Lane overbridge to stabilise it for our future construction activity

Location 4	Spring 2022	 Erection of two tower cranes, which we will use to construct the bridge that will cross the M42 motorway We will be undertaking further corridor preparation works, such as vegetation clearance. Construction of a haul road between the A4097 Kingsbury Road and Faraday Avenue Creation of an access point for the haul road at Hams Lane.
Location 5	Ongoing until Winter 2021/2022	 Gypsy Lane compound: Continued works to set up this compound for BBV to begin working out of here in early 2022 Watton Lane compound: Development of the compound infrastructure including welfare facilities, office space, storage and a car park Continue archaeological investigations at Gilson Road.
Location 6	Ongoing until Winter 2021/2022	 We will have two-way traffic lights in place on the B4118 Birmingham Road throughout December. This is to facilitate works to create a new site access and complete utility diversions The creation of internal haul roads will continue in our site to the south of the B4118 Birmingham Road The diaphragm wall construction for the Bromford Tunnel East Portal will continue throughout 2021 Works to create the Water Orton cutting will continue from November until Summer 2023.
Location 7	Ongoing until Winter 2022	From November and throughout 2022, BBV will complete enabling works to set up a compound to the south of the B4114

	Ongoing until Summer 2022	 Ongoing archaeological investigations at Coleshill Manor and to the south of Birmingham Road Demolition works on former agricultural buildings and B&B on Birmingham Road. These works will require the implementation of traffic management from April 22 for around 17 weeks.
Location 8	Ongoing until end of 2021 Ongoing until end of 2021 Ongoing until mid-2022	 Work on land off the A446 to create a utility bridge, including some traffic management measures Works to enable the future construction of a 'box structure' to carry the railway over the A446. This includes diverting existing watercourses, creating accesses and preparations for piling work We are building a temporary haul road and a metallic bridge to cross the River Tame Work on land off the A446 to create a utility bridge, including some traffic management measures.
Location 9	November - January 2022 Ongoing until end of 2021	 We have installed a long-term single lane traffic management system on the M42/M6 link road westbound to enable our works for the M42/M6 link viaduct. The single lane traffic management will be in place until Summer 2023. This will include a series of night closures in January to allow us to adjust our traffic management Ongoing archaeological work off Attleboro Lane, Water Orton.
Area-wide	Ongoing throughout 2021	 Ground investigation and environmental surveys including: Excavating 'trial holes' Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) surveys to identify existing utilities

- Surveys to check existing ground levels
- Surveys of water bodies
- Ecology surveys

We will undertake general site preparations including the removal of some existing vegetation.

Archaeological surveys and ecological surveys, as well as site preparations, including the removal of some existing vegetation will also take place.







- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.
