

Three-month look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Warwickshire border	Summer 2022	 Manually operated traffic lights will be operational to allow construction traffic to cross the highway safely; Further construction of internal haul and access roads; and Continued piling works in preparation for the main construction of the Banbury Road overbridge.
Location 2 Lower Boddington	Summer 2022	 Continuation of main earthworks activities including stockpiling of materials; Piling works in preparation for Highfurlong Viaduct; Creation of water management ponds; and Start of enabling activities including surveys and utility diversions in preparation for the Claydon Road overbridge, which may require some local traffic management.
Location 3 Aston Le Walls	Summer 2022	 Increasing excavation activity and stockpiling as part of the construction of the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel; and Start of utility diversion works at Appletree Lane in preparation for the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel excavation.
Location 4 Chipping Warden	May to July 2022	Installation of a temporary bridge to allow construction traffic to safely pass over the A361 Byfield Road.
	May 2022 to 2024 June 2022	 On-going delivery of pre-cast segments to site when required. Concrete batching plant to become operational for use in the area; Chipping Warden relief road maintenance; and

		Site access construction on A361 and Byfield Road.
	Summer 2022	 Chipping Warden relief road maintenance; and Start of installation of the pre-cast tunnel segments.
M40 junction 11	Summer 2022	Maintenance work to the traffic management loop system.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	May to August	Completion of a vehicle crossing area on
Edgcote area	lgcote area ²⁰²²	Wardington Road. Manually operated traffic lights will be installed to allow construction traffic to cross the highway safely;
		Earthworks in preparation for the construction of the Edgcote Viaduct; and
		Temporary diversion of several footpaths near Culworth Road, Chipping Warden.

	June to August 2022 Summer 2022	 Completion of internal site access and haul road between Chipping Warden and Greatworth. Completion of two site access roads crossing at Wardington Road and Culworth Road with manually operated traffic lights; and Continued excavation and translocation of a marsh land.
	Summer 2022 to autumn 2024	Localised footpath closure (AN5, Millennium Way) for the duration of the main construction of the viaduct.
Location 2 Culworth area	Summer 2022	 Further construction of the internal haul and access road; and Start of earthworks and piling work in preparation for the Lower Thorpe Viaduct.
	Summer 2022 to autumn 2024	Localised footpath closures and diversions between Culworth and Edgcote throughout the duration of construction.
Location 3 Greatworth Park	Summer 2022	 Construction of a temporary road between Sulgrave Road and the B4525 Welsh Road, known as the 'Greatworth T'; Further construction of the internal haul and access roads;
		 Closures and diversions of some local footpaths; Further excavation, removal and storage of earth in preparation for the Greatworth Green Tunnel; and Completion of site access road crossing at Helmdon Road, with manually operated traffic lights installed to allow construction traffic to cross the highway safely.

Three-month look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Halse Copse	Summer 2022	Completion of a small works compound and creation of the site access road;
		Excavation of the deep railway cutting, including movement and storage of earthworks, forming settlement ponds and earth bunds; and
		Temporary diversion of footpath AN14 to be completed.

Location 2 Radstone	Summer 2022	 Completion of settlement ponds, site access roads and earth bunds;
		• Utilities diversions on Radstone Road; and
		Excavation of the deep railway cutting, including movement and storage of earthworks to commence. Traffic management will be required to facilitate these works on the Radstone Road.
Location 3 A43	Summer 2022	 Continue the A43 compound set up and junction improvement works to Radstone Road; and
		 Creation of the new Radstone Road junction from the A43, including a temporary closure of Whitfield Road and narrow lanes on the A43 northbound section.
Location 4	Summer 2022	 Compound set up to be completed and operational; and
		 Creation of the temporary A422 road alignment and roundabout, including a temporary bridge installation. These works will include some piling works and associated traffic management.

Our commitments to you

Informing

- We will tell you about HS2 works in your area.
- We have local community websites and newsletters with regular information and updates about our work in your area.
- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

Involving

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

Keeping you informed

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
