



# Notice of abnormal load deliveries, Risborough Road

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. We are following Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on working safely during the pandemic. The health and safety of our workforce and the communities we work within is our priority. All sites will remain under constant review. ## What are we doing?

In 2022 we began receiving deliveries of abnormal loads to our sites in the Aylesbury and North Chilterns Areas. An abnormal load is a load which due to its weight or dimensions cannot be carried on a conventional goods vehicle and requires a special vehicle and arrangements for its transport.

At the end of July, we will be receiving the delivery of a 250-tonne crane as well as a piling rig. These pieces of equipment are essential as we begin works to construct the Stoke Mandeville Relief Road Bridge. Once the Stoke Mandeville Relief Road is operational, this bridge will carry traffic over the HS2 railway line. The Stoke Mandeville Relief Road is expected to be completed in 2024.

For the safety of road users and our staff, these abnormal loads will require temporary traffic management in the form of traffic-lights at the Risborough Road Terrick roundabout, where Risborough Road meets Nash Lee Road. These are required because the loads are so wide they will need to travel the wrong way around the Terrick roundabout and will continue their journey on Risborough Road to our compound in Stoke Mandeville.

We thank you for your co-operation and apologise in advance for any inconvenience.

# When will these works take place?

Risborough Road and Nash Lee Road will have temporary traffic management on Monday 25 July 2022, between 9.00am and 3.00pm, for the delivery of abnormal loads.

#### **Duration of works**

Works will commence Monday 25 July 2022

Normal working hours:

Monday to Friday

8.00am - 6.00pm

Saturdays

8.00am - 1.00pm

Our contractors may be on site for one hour's start-up and shutdown either side of these times.

There may be a short duration outside of these times to allow for the set-up of road signage and traffic lights.

#### What to expect

The delivery of abnormal loads to our construction site along Risborough Road in Stoke Mandeville.

Noise from plant and equipment used for the works.

#### What we will do

Respond promptly to any complaints and take appropriate action.

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# Where will the works take place?

The map below, shows the location that will have temporary traffic lights at the Terrick roundabout, where Risborough Road and Nash Lee Road meet.

The traffic lights will only become operational when these deliveries are approximately 30 minutes away. Once the abnormal loads have made their way around the roundabout, the traffic lights will then be removed. We expect the traffic management will only be operational for approximately 1 hour.
