

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Warwickshire border	September 2022	 Manually operated traffic lights on Wormleighton Road will be operational to allow construction traffic to cross the highway safely; and Internal site access road from Chipping
		Warden Compound will become operational.
	September 2022 to September 2023	Construction of the Banbury Road overbridge.
Location 2 Lower Boddington	September to October 2022	Construction of a temporary junction on Boddington Road as part of the Banbury Road Overbridge construction.
	Continuing through autumn 2022	 Continuation of main earthworks activities including stockpiling of materials; Construction of Highfurlong Viaduct; and Utility diversions in preparation for the Claydon
		Road overbridge. Claydon Road will be closed from autumn 2022 for approximately two years.
Location 3 Aston Le Walls	Continuing through autumn 2022	Continued stockpiling of earth from the construction of the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel; and
		Utility diversion works at Appletree Lane in preparation for the nearby tunnel excavation.
Location 4 Chipping Warden	September to October 2022	Installation of a temporary bridge to allow construction traffic to safely pass over the A361 Byfield Road. Traffic management will be required during the bridge deck installation; and

	Additional traffic management at the entrance to Chipping Warden Compound to allow the safe entry and exit of vehicles at peak times.
Autumn 2022	Completion of the first phase of precast segment installation.
May 2022 to 2024	On-going delivery of pre-cast segments to site when required.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Edgcote area	Autumn 2022	Operation of a vehicle crossing area on Wardington Road. Manually operated traffic lights will be installed to allow construction
		traffic to cross the highway safely;Earthworks in preparation for the construction of the Edgcote Viaduct; and
		Temporary diversion of several footpaths near Culworth Road, Chipping Warden.

	August 2022 to spring 2023	Completion of the internal site access and haul roads between Chipping Warden and Greatworth.
	Summer 2022 to autumn 2024	Localised footpath closures (AN5, Millennium Way) for the duration of the main construction of the viaduct.
Location 2 Culworth and Thorpe Mandeville	Autumn 2022 to spring 2023	Further construction of the internal haul and access road with highway crossing areas becoming operational.
	August 2022 to October 2022	Utility diversions near Banbury Road, Thorpe Mandeville requiring some traffic management.
	September 2022	Completion of piling work in preparation for the Lower Thorpe Viaduct; and
		Start of excavation for the Greatworth Green Tunnel.
	Summer 2022 to autumn 2024	Localised footpath closures and diversions between Culworth and Edgcote (footpaths AG9, AG10) throughout construction.
Location 3 Greatworth Park	Autumn 2022	Construction of a temporary road between Sulgrave Road and the B4525 Welsh Road, known as the 'Greatworth T';
		Further construction of the internal site access road;
		Further excavation, removal and storage of earth as part of the Greatworth Green Tunnel construction; and
		Operation of the site access road crossing at Helmdon Road and Sulgrave Road.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Halse Copse	September to November 2022	 Completion of a small works compound and creation of the site access road;
		Excavation of the deep railway cutting, including movement and storage of earthworks, the completion of temporary settlement ponds and earth bunds; and

		Temporary diversion of footpath AN14 to be completed.
Location 2 Radstone	September to November 2022	 Completion of settlement ponds, site access roads and earth bunds; Utilities diversions and preparatory works on Radstone Road; and Excavation of the deep railway cutting, including movement and storage of earthworks to commence. Traffic management will be required to facilitate these works on the
		Radstone Road.
Location 3 A43	September to October 2022	Completion of the A43 compound and junction improvement works to Radstone Road.
	Autumn to winter 2022	Further localised preparation activities including vegetation clearance and utility diversions, which may require traffic management.
Location 4 A422	September to November 2022	Creation of the temporary A422 road alignment and roundabout, which will include a temporary bridge. These works will include some piling and associated traffic management.

Our commitments to you

Informing

- We will tell you about HS2 works in your area.
- We have local community websites and newsletters with regular information and updates about our work in your area.
- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

Involving

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

Keeping you informed

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
