## Notice of works on Hampstead Road

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Mace Dragados is the Construction Partner building the new HS2 station in Euston.

#### **Utility works on Hampstead Road from October 2022**

We are undertaking an essential programme of utilities diversion works to the west of Euston Station. As part of this, we need to carry out potable (drinking) water works on Hampstead Road in four phases **from October 2022 to March 2023** which will require partial lane, junction and footpath closures.

### Phase 1 Hampstead Road Southbound Lane – anticipated October 2022

A trench will be excavated in the existing footpath to allow for installation of a new water pipe. A temporary footpath will be available. Vehicles can enter Robert Street from Hampstead Road however, access onto Hampstead Road is via Drummond Street.



#### **Duration of works**

October 2022 to March 2023

#### What to expect:

Traffic management including partial road closure, cycle lane closure, signalised traffic

Temporary footpath in place around worksite

Phase 1 & 2: Vehicles can enter Robert Street from Hampstead Road but not exit

Phase 3: Full closure of junction between Robert Street and Hampstead Road

Noise and vibration

#### What we will do:

Put diversion routes in place

Aim to reduce noise and vibration as reasonably practicable



#### Phase 2 Hampstead Road Southbound Lane - anticipated late October/ November 2022


Following phase 1, a trench will be excavated in the southbound lane of Hampstead Road to continue pipe installation. The temporary footpath at phase 1 will be removed and the existing footpath will reopen. There will be northbound and southbound access for vehicles on Hampstead Road. Vehicles can enter Robert Street from Hampstead Road however, access onto Hampstead Road is via Drummond Street.



#### Phase 3 Hampstead Road Northbound Lane - anticipated late November/ December 2022

Following phase 2, a new water pipe will be installed on the northbound lane of Hampstead Road and will be connected to the existing pipe location on Robert Street. There is a full closure of the junction between Hampstead Road and Robert Street. There will be a temporary footpath crossing around the work site. Hampstead Road will remain open for traffic in both directions. Access to Robert Street is via Drummond Street/ Stanhope Street.

Access onto Hampstead Road from Robert Street is via Stanhope Street/ Drummond Street.



#### Phase 4 Robert Street - anticipated December 2022 to March 2023

Following phase 3, the new water pipe will be installed on Robert Street and will be connected to the existing pipe from December 2022. The potable water main connection is anticipated to go live in March 2023.

There will be a full closure of the junction between Hampstead Road and Robert Street. There will be a temporary footpath crossing around the work site. Hampstead Road will remain open for traffic in both directions. Access to Robert Street is via Drummond Street/ Stanhope Street. Access onto Hampstead Road from Robert Street is via Stanhope Street/ Drummond Street.



#### What to expect

We recognise that construction work can be disruptive to those living or working nearby. The nature of our work often means some disturbance is unavoidable, but please be assured that every effort is made to minimise any unnecessary noise. Please note that changes to the programme may occur and if these changes are likely to cause any disturbance, we will write to you again.

#### Works will include:

- Temporary work sites where potable water main works is taking place
- Vacuum excavator will be used to break the concrete and tarmac to access the works area
- Traffic management will be in place and kept to a minimum including signalised traffic, closure of cycle lane and partial road closure
- We expect our works to be noisy at times however we will work to minimise disruption wherever possible.

#### **Working hours**

- 8am to 6pm weekdays (excluding bank holidays)
- 8am to 1pm Saturdays
- On occasions it may be necessary to work
   8am to 6pm Saturday and Sundays
- We will start-up and close-down activities up to one hour before and up to one hour after normal working hours above
- Intermittent delivery of materials to site before 7am and after 7pm for materials not permitted on London roads during the day.
