High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. We are following Government and Public Health England (PHE) advice on working safely during the pandemic. What are we doing?

As part of our continued preparatory works for the construction of the Nash Lee Road realignment there will be temporary traffic management, in the form of daytime lane closures, on Nash Lee Road for approximately four weeks.

These lane closures will allow us to safely establish a temporary plant and vehicle crossing point further connecting our internal road network. This plant crossing will be in use until the new Nash Lee Road realignment is operational. We expect the plant crossing to be in use by late October.

To help reduce our impact on the local area, this new realignment will include a bridge for local traffic to pass over HS2 works while construction vehicles will travel under the bridge.

Throughout the course of this closure, our team will also be carrying out works to transition the drainage systems between the current system and new temporary diversion.

When will these works take place?

Nash Lee Road will have temporary traffic management, between 9.00am and 3.00pm, beginning Monday 26 September to Friday 21 October 2022.

Works will take place between 9am and 3pm – Monday to Friday. Some additional weekend work may also take place.

Duration of works

Works will commence Monday 26 September to Friday 21 October 2022.

Normal working hours:

Monday to Friday

8.00am - 6.00pm

Saturdays

8.00am - 1.00pm

Our contractors may be on site for one hour's start-up and shutdown either side of these times.

What to expect

Temporary traffic management on Nash Lee Road in the form of daytime lane closures until late October 2022.

A plant crossing on Nash Lee Road will become operational with traffic lights in late October.

What we will do

Manage any environmental impacts, such as traffic and noise.

Respond promptly to any complaints and take appropriate action.

Take care to respect the community.



Where will the works take place?

The map below, shows the temporary traffic management that will be in place on Nash Lee Road.

There may be a short duration outside of the advertised times to allow for our traffic management crews to set-up or take-down road signage and traffic equipment. Lane closures will not be operational during these times, however you may see our crews setting up within the highway.

What will the access and haul road crossing point look like?

The crossing point on Nash Lee Road will ensure local traffic are safely separated from construction traffic. By introducing this crossing, it enables us to keep plant and vehicles within the construction site and off the road network.

The crossing point will be signal controlled and to reduce disruption as much as possible, traffic lights will only be operational during our normal working hours, 8.00am to 6.00pm. They will be in use until the Nash Lee Road diversion can be completed.

The image below is indicative of what our access and haul road crossing points will look like.
