High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

Excavation of HS2 station box is ongoing

The new state of the art HS2 station building and platforms, will be made of reinforced concrete, both on the surface and underground. To construct the HS2 station (site location shown on page 2), we will excavate down within the boundaries of an area called a 'box' and pour concrete to form the outline of the structure.

Before excavation begins in each section of works, we will break down the top of the existing concrete diaphragm wall (D-wall). The D-wall runs underground along the outside of the station box, to help support the area whilst excavation takes place. After removing the top of the D-Wall, a concrete 'capping beam' is placed on top to stiffen the perimeter ahead of the excavation phase. We are in the process of pouring concrete for the capping beam around the outline of the station box.

Excavation is ongoing in the western end of the site and from September 2022, the excavated material will be removed by the conveyor system that takes materials to the Willesden European Terminal (WET) for onward use.

Extended working hours for concrete pours

From 19 September until April 2026, we will start pouring concrete to construct the underground floors of the HS2 station box. This will initially take place in the west side of the Old Oak Common site, as shown in the map on Page 2.

For safety reasons a concrete pour must be completed in one session, otherwise the concrete can be weakened. For larger concrete pours, this is not always achievable within the current working hours and therefore requires longer working hours to complete the pour successfully. On the day of these concrete pours, we will work for extended working hours from 8am until 9pm on weekdays and 8am until 5pm on Saturdays.

Duration of works

Concrete works are ongoing and is expected to complete in 2026 in the HS2 Station Box. Our working hours will be between 8am and 9pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 5pm on Saturdays.

What to expect

Site operatives working until 9pm on days of overruns and leaving site later.

What we will do

We will use best practical means to ensure minimal disruption to our site neighbours.

The conveyor will start to move excavated materials in September 2022 removing additional lorries from the road.

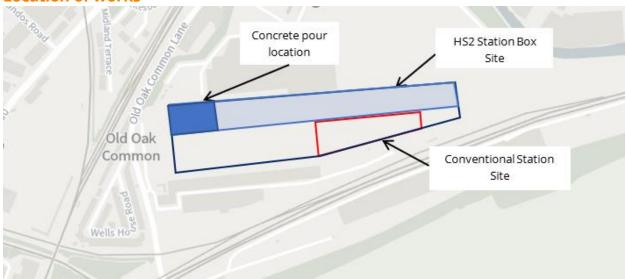
Construction of the Conventional Station platforms

Alongside the HS2 Station Box, Old Oak Common will have eight ground level platforms for Crossrail and Great Western Mainline services. These will be accessed in the Conventional Station building when the HS2 station at Old Oak Common opens.

From 30 September 2022, we will start the concrete works of the Conventional Station platforms and accompanying building's basement and structure.

The Conventional Station building is a reinforced concrete frame structure approximately 230m long and triangular in plan. It is split over four levels; basement, ground, first and second floor levels and the location of works is identified in red on the map below.

Noise and dust

We will continually monitor noise and dust levels throughout the works. To manage potential dust, we will be damping down (wetting the ground) during excavation and lorries moving excavated material on site will be covered. To mitigate for possible noise, we will use acoustic blankets whenever possible and all staff, operatives and contractors will be reminded of their responsibilities to be respectful to our site neighbours. Briefings will also be made prior to works regarding site noise management.
