Notice of works on **Cobourg Street**

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Mace Dragados is the Construction Partner building the new HS2 station in Euston.

Utility works on Cobourg Street from late November 2022

We are undertaking an essential programme of utilities diversion works to the west of Euston Station. As part of this, we need to carry out multiutilities works and hoarding move on Cobourg Street from late November 2022 to September 2023. This will mean no vehicular access and on-street parking.

Phase 1 water main works on Cobourg Street from late November

Phase 1 water main works is anticipated to take approximately three weeks to complete from late November 2022. There will be no vehicular access and on-street parking on Cobourg Street between the junctions of Starcross Street and Drummond Street. A parking bay will be suspended on Starcross Street to create a turning circle for vehicles. Pedestrian access to Euston Station via Cobourg Street will remain. The site will be bounded by Heras fencing.

Duration of works

Late November 2022 to September 2023

What to expect

Phase 1 and 2 water main works, and hoarding move (north): no vehicular access on Cobourg Street between the junctions of Starcross Street and Drummond Street

Phase 3 water main works and hoarding move (south): Full vehicular closure on **Cobourg Street**

Pedestrian access will be maintained



New hoarding alignment works on Cobourg Street (north) in December 2022

Following phase 1 water main works, the existing hoarding at Cobourg Street (north) will be extended to the western edge of the pavement. This is anticipated to take place in December for approximately two weeks and will remain in place until September 2023 (subject to change).

It is vital that the hoarding is moved to enable multi-utilities works to be carried out safely within the site, to move existing utilities away from the future HS2 Euston Station footprint. Multi-utilities work required include water mains, gas main, UKPN ducts, London Underground ducts, sewer and microtunelling.

This will mean that there will be no vehicular access to Cobourg Street (north) and no on-street parking. <u>Pedestrian access to the station via Drummond Street and Cobourg Street will remain.</u> Approximately one parking bay on Starcross Street and three parking bays on Drummond Street will be suspended.



Phase 2 water main works on Cobourg Street (north) in December 2022

At the same time as the hoarding move (north), phase 2 water main works will take place for a week. This will extend to the junction of Cobourg Street and Drummond Street. This will mean that there will be no vehicular access to Cobourg Street (north) and no on-street parking. Pedestrian access to the station via Drummond Street and Cobourg Street will remain.

Approximately one parking bay on Starcross Street and three parking bays on Drummond Street will be suspended.



Phase 3 of water main works on Cobourg Street in January 2023

Phase 3 water main works will be carried out at Cobourg Street (south) in January 2023. There will be no vehicular access to Cobourg Street. Pedestrian access will be maintained.

Approximately one parking bay on Starcross Street, three parking bays on Drummond Street and four parking bays on Euston Street will be suspended. The site will be bounded by Heras fencing.



New hoarding alignment on Cobourg Street (south)

Following phase 3 water main works, the Heras fencing will be removed and the existing hoarding at Cobourg Street (south) will be extended to the edge of the western pavement to cover the worksite. Additional lighting and CCTV will be added to the hoarding. Pedestrian access along the western pavement will be retained. This is required to enable multiutilities works which will be ongoing until September 2023 (subject to change).



What to expect

We recognise that construction work can be disruptive to those living or working nearby. The nature of our work often means some disturbance is unavoidable, but please be assured that every effort is made to minimise any unnecessary noise.

Please note that changes to the programme may occur and if these changes are likely to cause any disturbance, we will write to you again.

Works will include:

- New site boundary established with water barriers and Heras fencing for water main works
- Hoarding blocks to be put in place with use of excavator following water main phases 1 and 3
- Saw cutting and breaking out road surface
- Use of floor saw, vacuum excavator, excavator, hand tools, compressor, generator, and dumper
- Traffic management will be in place and kept to a minimum
- We expect our works to be noisy at times however we will work to minimise disruption wherever possible.

Working hours

- 8am to 6pm weekdays (excluding bank holidays)
- 8am to 1pm Saturdays
- On occasions it may be necessary to work 8am to 6pm Saturday and Sundays
- We will start-up and close-down activities up to one hour before and up to one hour after normal working hours above
- Intermittent delivery of materials to site before 7am and after 7pm for materials not permitted on London roads during the day.
