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This forward look covers HS2 associated work in the London Borough of Hillingdon. The document includes:


- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1		Colne Valley Viaduct, A412 North Orbital Way
A412 North Orbital Way, Bucks		A programme of rotary piling has commenced on land adjacent to Denham Water Ski Club. These works are progressing southwards along the line of the viaduct.
		Cranes and piling rigs are being used and concrete for the bored piles is being delivered using our internal haul road to reduce HGVs on local roads.
		For access to viaduct pier locations in the Korda, Savay, and Harefield lakes, we have built temporary jetties - temporary bridge structures – across the lakes. These allow us to use the jetty as a platform to support cranes and rigs that bore permanent piles for the viaduct piers into the ground under the lake.
		These piling works will create some noise and are likely to be noticeable in the local area throughout 2022. We will be carrying out targeted engagement with residents to keep them updated on our progress.
		The Colne Valley Viaduct has now been constructed across the A412, and no further overnight road closures are required at this time.
Multiple locations	Ongoing until December 2024	Continuing with water quality sampling from the River Colne, River Pinn, Newyears Green Bourne and The Greenway.
		Small samples of water are taken from streams in the area each month. This is done by staff on foot taking a jam-jar sized sample for analysis.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Moorhall Road	September 2021 until March 2023	The northern construction site off Moorhall Road is now complete and fully operational. The jetties and haul road linking the Moorhall Road compound with the North Embankment, Denham and South Portal in West Hyde are now open. Construction vehicles are using the internal haul road to access the pier locations.
		To the south of Moorhall Road, the haul road and jetty that will be used by construction vehicles to


		work on the Colne Valley Viaduct has been built and is now being used to access pier locations in Savay Lake to build the permanent structure. Permanent road traffic signals are operating in Moorhall Road to control traffic movements at the junction with Moorhall Road and our work compounds.
Location 2 Colne Valley lakes	Ongoing until November 2024	An existing works access point on Moorhall Road/Dellside, is in use for limited works traffic. Public access to the Colne Valley Trail is not affected, however, part of the Public Right of Way U34 has been diverted.
		Compound fencing has been extended on Harefield Moor to accommodate earthworks. The permissive path between the Colne Valley Trail and Harvil Road around the fence line has been diverted to allow for temporary stockpiling of soil on land between Dews Lane and the Babcock works access.
		The stockpiled material will be used to create the southern embankment of the Colne Valley Viaduct, next to Harvil Road from October 2023 to November 2024.
		As part of our ongoing construction works to build the piers in the lakes and on the ground to support the Colne Valley Viaduct, an overhead scaffold frame to carry a water treatment pipeline across the Grand Union Canal has been built.
Location 3 Dews Lane	Ongoing until November 2024	A works compound and offices are operational at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activity Centre (HOAC) site at the end of Dews Lane. This compound is the operation centre for the construction of the temporary jetties and the permanent viaduct structure between the former HOAC site and the Grand Union Canal south bank.
		Dews Lane is operating as a temporary haul road with secure access at the junction with Harvil Road.
		Access is permitted for local business (RAC Garages) and other community groups that require access from Harvil Road.
Location 4 Harvil Road	Ongoing until 2025	Permanent lights are now installed to control construction traffic movement at the junction with Harvil Road, in Hillingdon.

Location 5, 7 and 3 Denham Country Park to Harvil Road	Ongoing until Spring 2023	National Grid's pylon diversion scheme is finished but the reinstatement work in Denham Country Park won't be completed until spring 2023. This includes removing remaining temporary trackway, bridges, fencing and associated equipment, and tree planting. To date the footpaths near Flagmore Ditch have been closed for health & safety reasons and to maintain access to our compound areas. We'll open up these footpaths at the end of November 2022 for the benefit of the community, meaning the circular path in this area is once again accessible. To do this we've reconfigured fencing and trackway to aid public access - effectively creating two fenced compounds, rather than one, for our remaining work. The footpaths will need to be closed again temporarily in the spring when we commence our reinstatement work to aid the removal of trackway, fencing, bridges etc safely. We'll keep stakeholders informed in advance about dates.
Location 6 Dews Lane / Newyears Green Bourne	August 2022 to January 2023	Works are underway to create the foundations for the viaduct piers south of Harvil Road.
Location 7 Savay Lake to Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	September 2021 to March 2023	Sheet piling, cofferdams and jetty building will be followed by rotary piling for the ground and lake piers progressing south from Moorhall Road across Savay Lake and crossing the Grand Union Canal. This work will create the permanent structures for the Colne Valley Viaduct. Towpath access along the Grand Union Canal will remain open throughout these works.

		From early 2023, the viaduct decking (the sections of decking which link the piers and form the surface of the viaduct) will be installed in this section by a large segment erection girder.
		The deck construction started in May 2022, from the North Embankment near Denham Water Ski Club, Bucks, progressing from north to south along the viaduct.
Location 8 Harefield Lake No2	October 2021 to March 2024	Sheet piling, cofferdams and jetty building are underway across Harefield Lake No2 from the works compound at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activities Centre (HOAC).
		This will be followed by rotary piling for the ground and lake piers from HOAC to the southern bank of the Grand Union Canal.
		From June 2022 a short section of the access track/National Cycle Route 6 on the southern side of Harefield Marina was diverted to enable access to build the pier foundations on the southside of the Grand Union Canal. In the first phase, the path will be diverted around the edge ofthe worksite whilst a temporary pontoon is built in the canal to carry light vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists around the worksite. For a short period, a small welfare cabin for staff will be located at this site.
		From early 2023, the viaduct decking (the sections of decking that link the piers and form the surface of the viaduct) will be installed in this section by a large segment erection girder, completing the permanent structure of the viaduct by early 2024.
Location 9	February 2022 to	The existing bridleway leading from U34 to Harvil
Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	December 2023	Road is diverted to allow for soil stockpiling north of HOAC. Access to the fishing locations and Dellside track are not affected, however users of the footpath are diverted around a perimeter fence. Material stockpiled in this location will be moved to site via the existing site entrance and access road at
		Harvil Road.
		The stockpile will be used to build the Colne Valley Viaduct South Embankment.

		Works to establish a small compound on land between the south bank of the Grand Union Canal and the HOAC lake began in early April 2022. These works will enable construction of the ground pier in this location and will require phased diversion of the access path and Colne Valley Trail / National Cycle Route 6. This path will remain open during the works.
Location 10	February 2022	Rotary piling is ongoing at the compound to

South	December	provide the foundations for the South Embankment of the Colne Valley Viaduct.
Embankment	2023	Once Harvil Road has been permanently realigned by SCS, Align will complete piling and platform works in the sections next to the new road, closing the gap on the new railway bridge over Harvil Road.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Copthall North	Ongoing until April 2023	 Construction of the Copthall Tunnel continues at the Western Portal. Current phase of works at the portal end involves constructing the walls, the bridge deck, extended walls and props and waling beams. In order to enable the permanent works, various temporary works schemes will be implemented at the Western Portal in 2023 which will be visible to the public from Harvil Road. Progress further East into the central section of the tunnel and commence the steelwork for the temporary works scheme and erecting the temporary structures to support the permanent structure for the tunnel soffit.

Location 3 Various locations along the Northolt Tunnels West route	Autumn 2022 to Spring 2024	The tunnel boring machine (TBM) constructing the Birmingham tunnel was launched on 30 September from the West Ruislip Portal, adjacent to the Ruislip Golf Course. The TBM constructing the London Tunnel was launched on 27 October. The initial phase of tunnelling involves testing and commissioning the complex machinery within the TBM before it can operate at its expected capability of building up to 15 metres of tunnel a day. Depending on this initial phase, the first TBM will be in the vicinity of the nearest residential properties towards the end of November and the second TBM will arrive at the same location around one month later. The tunnels broadly follow the alignment of the London Underground Central Line and Chiltern Mainline Railway. They will be constructed near

the following residential roads:

Ickenham Close, Blenheim Crescent, Herlwyn Avenue, Lawn Close, Almond Close, Cherry Close, Roundways and Bridgwater Road in the London

Borough of Hillingdon and Rabournmead Drive, Mandeville Road and Greenpark Way in the London Borough of Ealing.

The alignment of the Northolt Tunnels West means that a number of roads pass over the tunnel route. To mitigate the effects of tunnelling settlement (ground movement) on utilities, a programme of protection and diversion works will be carried out ahead of when the tunnel boring machines pass nearby.

- Water and gas main diversions
- Water and gas main replacement
- Sewer lining

Due to the location of utilities within the highways and footways, there will be a series of temporary traffic management in place whilst the protection and diversion works are being carried out.

- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.
