HS2 Update

Chiltern Tunnel | Winter 2022

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. The tunnel boring machines digging the Chiltern Tunnel have now passed beneath the village centre of Chalfont St Giles and are heading towards the third ventilation shaft in Amersham.

Tunnelling progress update

Florence and Cecilia, the two tunnel boring machines (TBMs), have now passed beneath our second ventilation shaft at Bottom House Farm Lane, Chalfont St. Giles, where they stopped briefly for maintenance in late summer. Their cutterheads. more commonly known as "teeth", were changed manually by hand, by highly skilled operatives. This took approximately two weeks to complete and once finished, the TBMs set off again, and are tunnelling to our third ventilation shaft in Amersham, where we expect them to arrive in early 2023.

The fourth ventilation shaft. off the A413 at Little Missenden, is being prepared to receive TBMs in summer 2023, followed by the final intervention shaft off Chesham Road near Hyde Heath at the end of 2023. The final stop for Florence and Cecilia will be the North Portal, South Heath near Great Missenden. This is where the twin-bore Chiltern Tunnel emerges, and the railway line will continue in a cutting across the valley towards Wendover. The TBMs are due to arrive here in early 2024.

Diesel-free sites

AlignJV is pleased to confirm that seven construction sites in the Chilterns and Colne Valley have eliminated diesel from their operation – generators, welfare facilities, crawler cranes and piling rigs.

These construction sites have achieved 100 per cent diesel-free status. The project continues to reduce its carbon emissions.





Vent shaft site updates

What have we done so far

We have now fully waterproofed all our ventilation shafts at Chalfont St Peter, Chalfont St Giles, Amersham, Little Missenden and Chesham Road. We are now constructing the basements of the buildings which will sit above each shaft. The picture opposite shows a bird's eye view of the **Chalfont St Peter** site. The depth of the shaft is an impressive 66.5 metres. Internal works within the shaft are well underway and include the fitting of a staircase and waterproofing of the basement.

Works on the internal shaft structure at **Chalfont St Giles** are progressing as the TBMs have passed.

Basement works will include the creation of shallow reinforced concrete slabs and walls.

At **Amersham** our focus is the arrival of the TBMs in early spring in 2023. Once they have passed through the shaft, we will finish the inner shaft wall.

At **Little Missenden** (pictured to the right) we are 'steel fixing' a capping beam which ties everything together on top of the shaft.

Main works at the intervention shaft at **Chesham Road** consist of constructing the building basement.

Finally, at the **North Portal** the 96 barrettes required to strengthen the ground around the future Chiltern Tunnel portals have now finished. Works for the next few months consist of constructing internal roads and drainage installation.
