This forward look covers HS2 associated work in Staffordshire.


The document is a forward look at construction activities planned for the next three months.


Map 1 - Fradley and Handsacre



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	December 2022 and throughout 2023	We have created a working area and compound on land off Shaw Lane. We will be undertaking preparatory work to build the Bourne Brook Viaduct, including: • Piling test trials • Vegetation clearance.
Location 2	December 2022 and throughout 2023	We will be constructing two bellmouths at Wood End Lane and Watery Lane.

We will be delivering work in this location in three sections, including north, central and south. North section Prepare to build the Curborough Brook **Underbridge and Viaduct** • Divert utilities Survey and clear our sites **Central section** • Build the Fradley South bellmouth • Complete our new compound by **Netherstowe Lane** • Divert utilities on Wood End Lane and Netherstowe Lane • Prepare to build the Wood End Lane Underbridge • Clear our sites South section Build new haul roads • Introduce temporary bunds Divert utilities • Survey our sites and build trial holes Deliver earthworks to build the Curborough Embankment. Area-wide December 2022 and We will undertake a range of surveys in this area, throughout 2023 including utility, environmental and ground investigation surveys, that may require temporary traffic management. Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works	
Location 1	December 2022 and throughout 2023	We will be building a bridge to take the A38 over the HS2 line. The new line will run beneath the main carriageway, slip roads and existing railway lines	
		 Our initial work will include constructing the supporting foundations and structure for the bridge. We will begin excavating for the A38 southbound slip road and carriageway overbridges too 	
		 To carry out this programme safely, we are introducing phased traffic management. This began with the total closure of the A38 southbound slip road at Streethay from Monday 1 August 2022 for 15 months 	
		The southbound slip road closure diversion route will affect road users travelling into Streethay and parts of North Lichfield who	

		 would usually use the A38 southbound slip road to the A5127. The diversion will be clearly signed and will take road users to the next exit at Swinfen Island During later phases of work, we will be initiating a total closure of the A38 northbound slip road and lane closures on the carriageway in the Streethay area
		 There will continue to be a closure in place for PRoW Fradley and Streethay 6 in preparation for the construction of haul roads, stockpile areas, and earthworks to progress Streethay Cutting We are continuing pilling works in
		preparation for the West Coast Mainline overbridge. Our work will include earthworks, drainage, and installation of structures. This may also include some overnight closures of the West Coast Mainline at this location.
Area-wide	December 2022	We will undertake work in this area, including utility, environmental and ground investigation surveys, that may require temporary traffic management. Our activity will include: Excavating 'trial holes' Utility diversions Dismantling of properties Installation of fencing Setting up of satellite compounds Translocation of vegetation Construction of haul roads and access points Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) surveys to help locate existing utilities Surveys to check existing ground levels Surveys of water bodies Archaeological investigations Ecological surveys.



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	December 2022 and throughout 2023	 We will continue works at our Whittington compound, constructing a haul route, undertaking early earthworks, drainage and installation of structures. Utility diversions across Lichfield Road with traffic management required and diversion of PRoW Whittington 16 Construction at Whittington Heath Golf Club, including continuing vegetation clearance, installation of additional security fencing,

		diversion of the PRoW and ground investigation surveys.	
Location 2	December 2022 and throughout 2023	 We will continue creating a working area and compound on land off the A5. This will include: Deliveries of materials and equipment to the site Installation of temporary fencing Construction of a satellite compound with welfare facilities for staff Investigating ground conditions, including ground penetrating radar (GPR) surveys Removal and storage of topsoil within the work area Delivery of some environmental & ecological mitigations and removal of some existing vegetation Continuing work at Bucks Head Farm, including property demolitions and a temporary PRoW diversion. 	
Location 3	December 2022 and throughout 2023	We have started earthworks to construct the Hints cutting. We will continue works, including: Realigning Rookery Lane Constructing Brockhurst overbridge.	
Area-wide	December 2022	We will undertake work in this area, including utility, environmental and ground investigation surveys, that may require temporary traffic management. Our activity will include: Excavating 'trial holes' Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) surveys to help locate existing utilities Surveys to check existing ground levels Surveys of water bodies Ecological surveys Demolition of properties.

Our Community Commitments

- **2.** Work with communities to develop local two-way engagement and communication programmes, ensuring they are accessible and tailored to local needs.
- **3.** Make sure communities are made aware in advance of any activities taking place in their area.
- **4.** Operate a Freephone Community Helpline 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- **5.** Make health and safety a priority for communities and our workforce.
- **6.** Respect the wellbeing of communities, minimising disruption to their lives with local mitigation plans and activities, ensuring we meet the standards set out in the Code of Construction Practice.
- 7. Leave a positive and sustainable legacy for the communities in which we operate.
- **8.** Respond to questions and complaints quickly and efficiently, with an acknowledgement within two working days, and responding within a maximum of 20 working days if we cannot answer the query straight away.
- **9.** Promote awareness of all our property schemes so that anyone who may be eligible has all the information they need and is aware of the support available to them.
- **10.** Display the Residents' Commissioner and Construction Commissioner's contact details on all relevant materials, along with the HS2 Helpline information and complaints procedure.

The Code of Construction Practice forms part of the Secretary of State's Environmental Minimum Requirements for the construction of the railway from London to the West Midlands. It sets out the standards and responsibilities to protect communities and the environment during construction.
