

Notice of change to Ashow Road and Crewe Lane closures

Notification



High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty VINCI (BBV) is working in partnership with HS2 Ltd to build the new high-speed railway in your area.

The work we will be doing

Following an overrun on other highway works in the area, we need to delay the start of the phase 2 closure from 6 March to 13 March 2023. The completion date will remain the same.

BBV need to install new pipes and infrastructure for the permanent drainage, required on both Ashow Road and Crewe Lane, this drainage will enable further works in the future.

We will be carrying out multiple phases of work over six weeks from **27 February 2023 to 6 April 2023** detailed below.

Phase 1: 27 February to 6 March 2023, three-way temporary traffic lights at the Junction of Ashow Road and Crewe Lane to enable works to be undertaken safely in the verge on the south side of Ashow Road and Crewe Lane.

Phase 2: 13 March to 27 March 2023, there will be a full road closure of Crewe Lane from the junction of Ashow Road. During this road closure there will also be two-way traffic signals on Ashow Road. This will provide a safe working area for works in the carriageway of Crewe Lane.

Phase 3: 27 March to 3 April 2023, three-way temporary traffic lights at the Junction of Ashow Road and Crewe Lane while we install new drainage in the verge on the north side of Ashow Road and Crewe Lane.

Phase 4: 3 April to 6 April 2023, two-way temporary traffic lights on Ashow Road while the drainage is installed in the verge and carriageway.

Our working hours will be from 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday. Our workforce maybe on site one hour before and one hour after to set up and secure our equipment.

Duration of works

Phase 1: 27 February to 6 March, three-way temporary traffic lights, Ashow Road and Crewe Lane

Phase 2: 13 to 27 March,
A full road closure of Crewe Lane

Phase 3: 27 March to 3 April, three-way temporary traffic lights, Ashow Road and Crewe Lane

Phase 4: 3 April to 6 April, two-way temporary traffic lights on Ashow Road

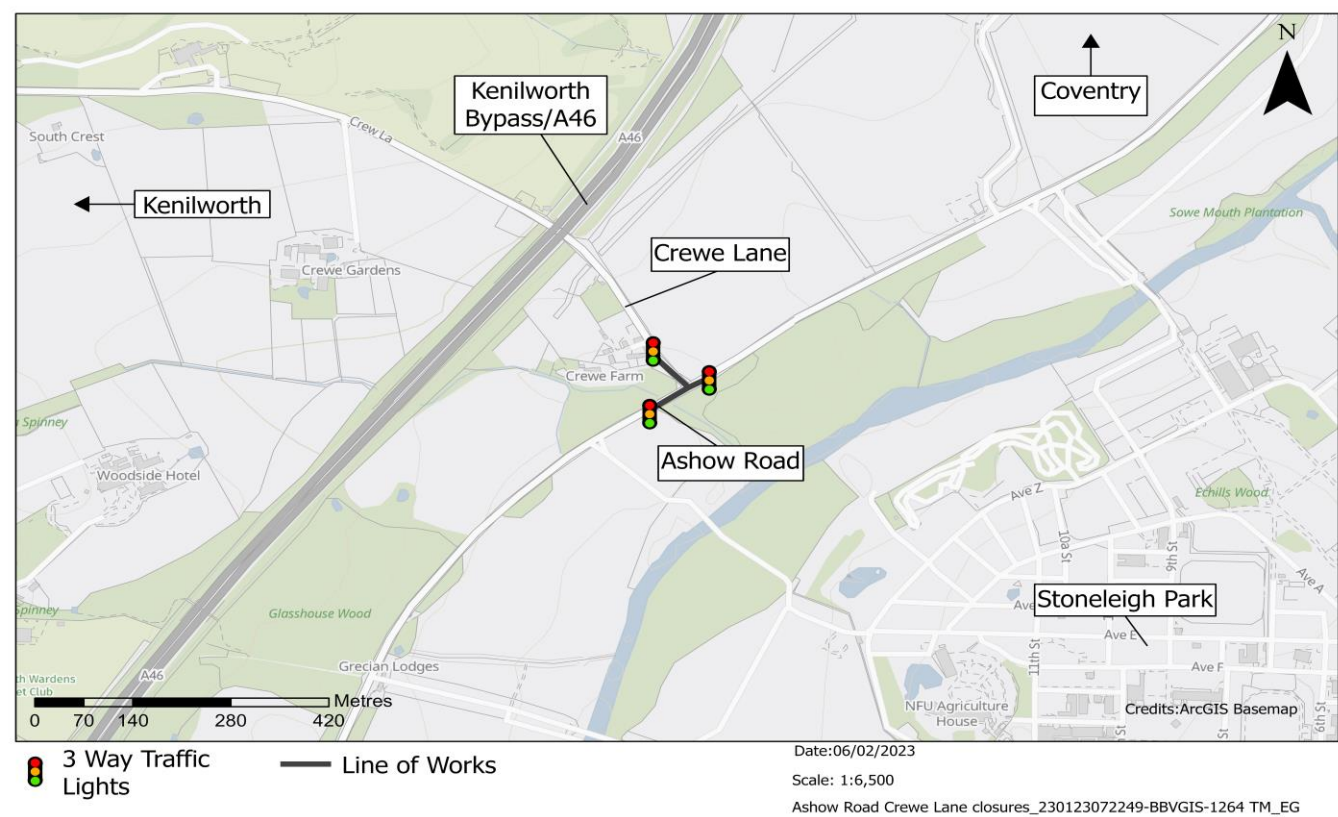
What to expect

Fully signposted diversion, some disruption to travel times. Access to properties will be maintained. Access for cyclists and pedestrians will be maintained during the work.

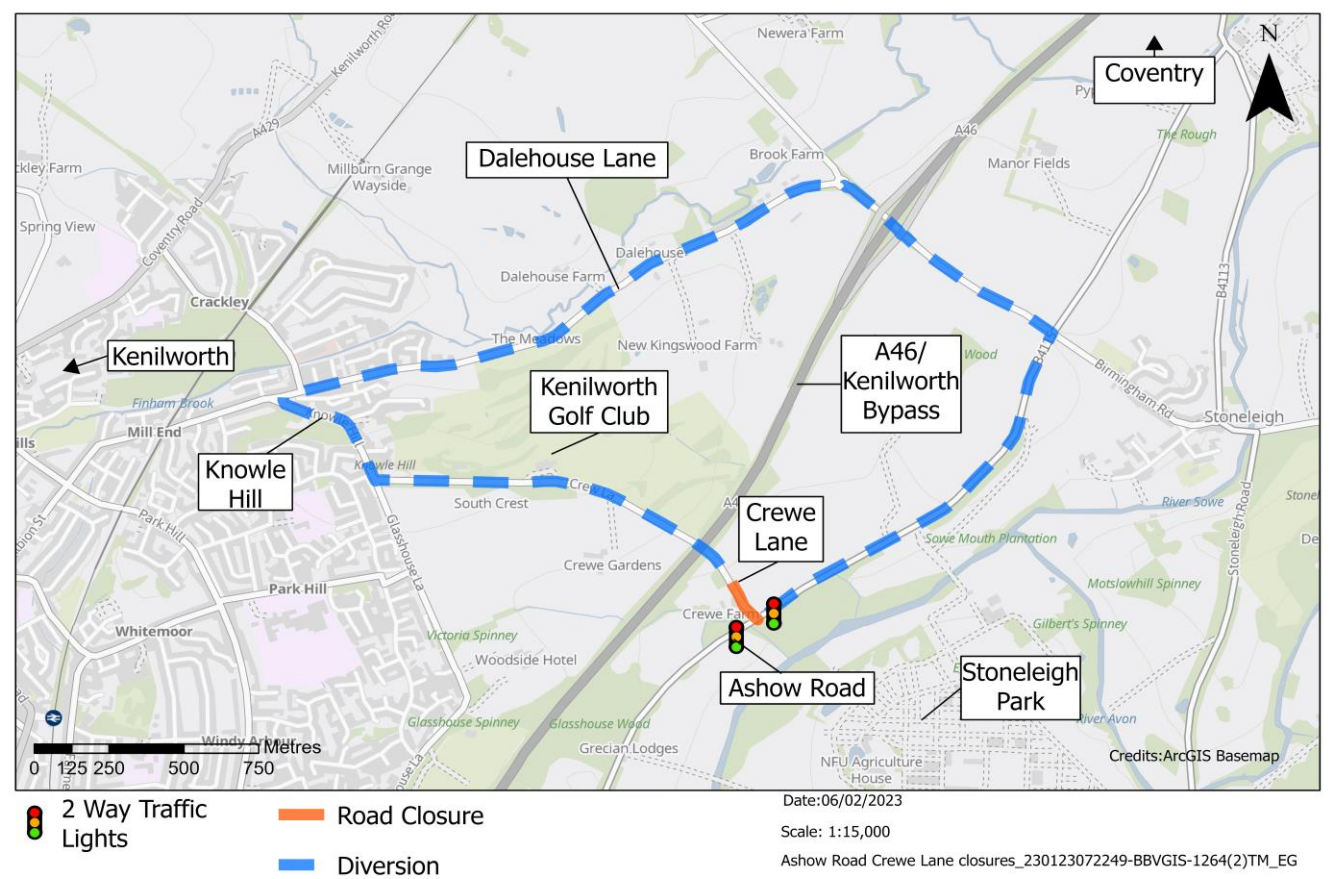

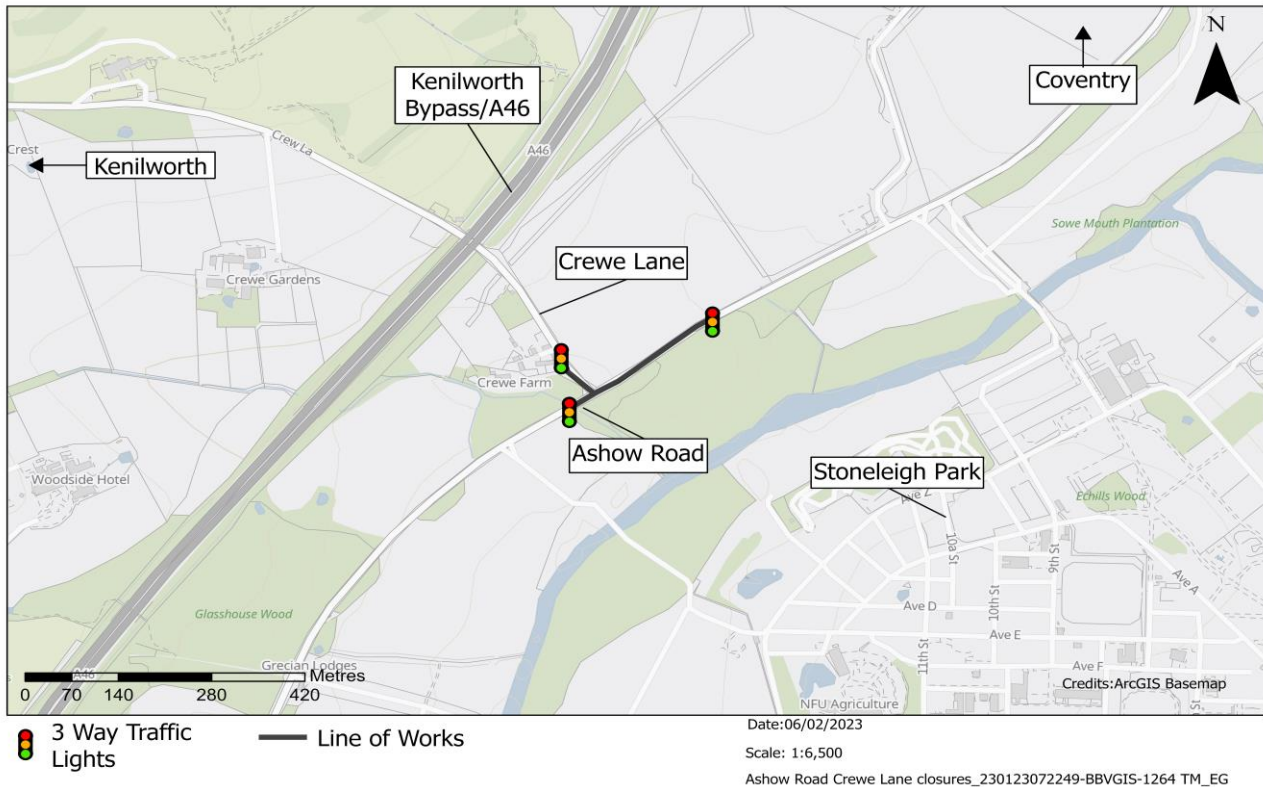
Phase 1 - 27 February to 6 March 2023, three-way temporary traffic lights



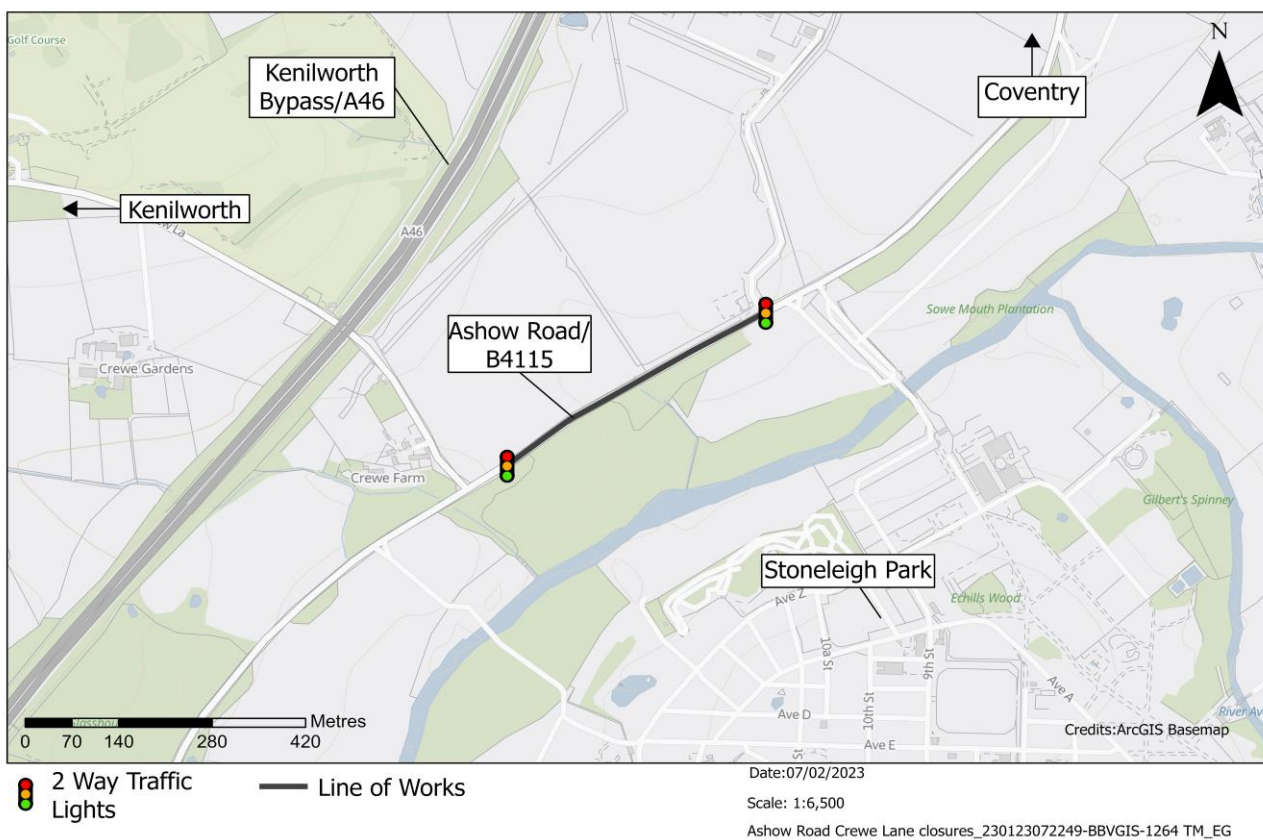
Phase 2 - 13 March to 27 March 2023, full road closure on Crewe Lane
