What are we doing?

In April, EKFB will continue works for the permanent realignment of the A423 and the construction of the A423 Banbury Road Overbridge. We will be carrying out utility diversions within several sections of the A423, from the area just north of Ladbroke towards Southam.

In order to safely carry out this work, there will be daytime, two-way and three-way traffic lights, between 11 April and 5 May 2023. The exact location of the traffic lights and their duration each day will vary as the work progresses.

The A423 Banbury Road Overbridge will require construction activity close to the existing highway. To enable this the northbound A423 layby, located just north of Ladbroke, will be permanently closed just after the Easter weekend, from 11 April 2023. A new layby will be constructed as part of our highway construction and we expect this to be open in early 2025.

When will these works take place?

A section of the A423 Banbury Road will have traffic lights in place from Tuesday 11 April to Friday 5 May 2023, between 8am and 5pm.

The layby located on the northbound side of the A423 will also be permanently closed from Tuesday 11 April 2023.

These dates may be subject to change due to circumstances outside of our control, such as poor weather.

Duration of works

The A423 will have two-way traffic lights from Tuesday 11 April to Friday 5 May 2023.

Normal working hours: Monday to Friday 8am – 5pm

Our contractors may be on site for one hour's start-up and shutdown either side of these times.

What to expect

Traffic lights on a section of the A423 during April.

Permanent closure of the layby located on the northbound side of the A423 near Southam. A new layby will be available in 2025.

Access will be maintained for residents and emergency services.

What we will do

Respond promptly to any complaints and take appropriate action.

Take care to respect the community.



Notice of layby closure, A423, Southam


