

| Location 1 Vehicle Holding Area | Ongoing to 2033 | The vehicle holding area will be in operation until 2033. |
| Location 1 Parkway | March to October 2023 | Parkway utility mitigation works We will strengthen, monitor and divert utility services beneath Parkway ahead of tunnelling. We will carry out works on Parkway, Gloucester Avenue, Albert Street and Delancey Street. The works will include: Overnight sewer surveys; Construction of a Thames Water sewer lining along a stretch of Gloucester Avenue where it meets Oval Road; Installation of monitoring equipment beneath Parkway; Replacement of pipework at the north side of Albert Street; and Diversion of the UKPN cables on Delancey Street and Parkway. |
| | March to April 2023 | Thames Water sewer lining works at the Gloucester Gate end of Parkway. This will take approximately one week during March 2023. Following the sewer lining we will be working on the water main at the Gloucester Gate end of Parkway outside the North Bridge House preparatory school. This will take between one to three weeks during April 2023. |

| | (Easter rail possession) | Surveys and monitoring of the bridges and structures at track-level within the railway cutting to inform and assess the impact of our works. For safety, due to the location of these structures beside, above, and below the railway tracks, we can only carry out these surveys during a rail closure. |
| | | We will carry out surveys to investigate the ground underneath Mornington Street bridge. We do not expect residents to notice these surveys as they are quiet. |
| | | Concrete platform for Network Rail access |
| | | Installation of a concrete platform at track level to later install Network Rail access from Mornington Street bridge. We do not expect residents to notice these works as they are quiet. |
| Location 2 Mornington Street Bridge | Closed until 2028 | Mornington Street bridge will now remain closed to public traffic until 2028, when nearby HS2 tunnelling works are finished. |


| | | The bridge will remain open to cyclists and pedestrians. By keeping the bridge closed to general traffic, we can limit the weight on top of the bridge while continuously monitoring it. |

| | | This monitoring gives us the information we need to finalise plans with Network Rail for bridge strengthening works, due to start in May 2023. |
| | | There will be times when HS2 and Network Rail vehicles will use the bridge, in agreement with site teams, who will coordinate any use of the bridge with site works and ensure the weight on it is carefully managed. |
| | | Network Rail vehicles will enter and exit the bridge at the Mornington Street end, and not travel across the bridge. |
| Location 2a Camden Cutting north: | June 2022 onwards | Lorry lay-by operational on Park Village East north from June 2022 for the duration of the project. |
| Park Village East | February 2022 | UK Power Networks will be constructing a new electricity substation within the lay-by next to 1 Park Village East. |

| | | In spring we will install a new pedestrian access to our cavern worksite within the lorry lay-by at the northern end of Park Village East. We will extend the lay-by and install the new access through the brick wall within the extended area of our lay-by. The lay-by hoarding will help to reduce noise and visual impacts. |

| Camden Cutting north worksite | September 2023 | In summer we plan to install a new, three-storey welfare and office building above the Camden Cutting north worksite on top of a large frame. This frame is a gantry crane, which will lift equipment and move materials across site. |
| | | This building is for the tunnelling team, who will work 24 hours a day, seven days a week, mostly underground, to build the Euston Approaches tunnels. |
| | | The building needs to be as close as possible to the tunnel entrance, so people working inside the tunnels can access the office during breaks, accidents and emergencies. |
| | | The building will include bathrooms, changing rooms, a kitchen, a medical room and a small office for the tunnelling team. There will be staircases at the northern and southern ends of the building and a covered walkway around the building. |
| Location 2c | January to May | Hoarding replaced on Park Village East south |
| Camden Cutting south: Park Village East | 2023 | We are replacing the existing hoarding on Park Village East south with new timber and framework. We require traffic management to carry out this work including pavement closures and parking bay suspensions. |
| | March 2023 | Lorry lay-by install on Park Village East south |
| | | In winter, we will start major works to extend Granby Terrace Bridge. These works will block site access to working areas north of Granby Terrace. |
| | | To maintain access for deliveries to, and collections from, our Camden Cutting worksite, we will install a lorry lay-by at street-level on Park Village East. We will use the tower cranes to lift equipment and materials over the wall from the street to the worksite and vice-versa. |
| Location 3 | Ongoing until summer 2024 | Piling between Granby Terrace and Hampstead Road. |

| | February to June 2023 (Including Easter possession 7 to 10 April) | Granby Terrace Bridgeworks We are preparing to extend Granby Terrace bridge over the HS2 railway. Works will take place to clear the existing section of the bridge so we can add the extension. For safety, some of this work must be done at night during weekends when the tracks below are not in use. We will clear the street signage and furniture, before removing the surface of the road. Residents may notice periods of increased noise as we use large machines to scrape off the surface of the road and vacuum loose materials. We will also work during the Easter weekend from 7 to 10 April. We will carry out noisy works during the day, and quieter works at night. |
| Location 3a Hampstead Road Lidlington Place to Varndell Street | June 2022 to 2024 | Hampstead Road utility works We are installing a new cable route from Lidlington Place to Varndell Street via Granby Terrace, so we can remove the existing cable and clear our worksite before we begin to extend Hampstead Road bridge. We will carry out these works in phases, with each phase requiring road, lane or pavement closures and parking bay suspensions. |
| Location 4a Georgiana Street / Camden High Street / Pratt Street | July/August to November 2023 | UK Power Networks utility connection works on behalf of HS2. Works include: • Traffic management; • Site set-up and hoarding; and • Excavation and installation. |

Involving

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we
 will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do
 things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
