Three-month look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Warwickshire border	Ongoing throughout 2023	Increased use of the site access road crossing on Wormleighton Road, connecting our site traffic from the Oxford Canal area down towards Boddington.

	February to June 2023	Earthworks and construction of the new Banbury Road, next to the existing highway.
Location 2 Lower Boddington	January to September 2023	 Construction of the Banbury Road overbridge, including the bridge deck and steel beam installations; Construction of the new sections of highway connecting the Banbury Road overbridge to the existing road; Vegetation removal, culvert installations and general preparations in the areas where new roads will tie into the existing highway; and Some traffic management and temporary road closures at there tie-in locations.
	Ongoing to Summer 2024 Continuing through 2023	 Closure of Claydon Road for the construction of the Claydon Road overbridge. Continuation of main earthworks activities including stockpiling of material from the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel; and Continued construction of the Highfurlong Viaduct.
Location 3 Aston Le Walls	Continuing through to spring 2023 February to March 2023	Continued stockpiling of earth from the construction of the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel. Utility diversion works at Appletree Lane in preparation for the nearby tunnel excavation.
Location 4 Chipping Warden	December 2022 to April 2023	Continued work at the A361 temporary bridge to allow construction traffic to safely pass over the A361 Byfield Road. Work will include connecting the bridge to the site access road each side of the A361.
	Continuing through to summer 2023	Continued construction of the Chipping Warden Green Tunnel from the A361 to Appletree Lane.

December 2022	On-going delivery of pre-cast segments to site
to February 2024	when required, requiring the occasional use of

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Edgcote area	February to May 2023	Earthworks will continue in preparation for the construction of the Edgcote Viaduct; and
		Some local diversions of footpaths for the construction of the Edgcote Viaduct.
	Ongoing through to spring 2023	Completion of the internal site access and haul roads between Chipping Warden and Greatworth.

Location 2 Culworth and Thorpe Mandeville	February to March 2023	Traffic management on Banbury Road, Thorpe Mandeville, to connect locally diverted water utilities.
	Ongoing to Autumn 2023	 Ongoing construction of the Lower Thorpe Viaduct; and Earthworks activities including excavation and stockpiling for the Greatworth Green Tunnel.
Location 3 Sulgrave Road and Welsh Lane	Ongoing to summer 2023	 Construction of a temporary road between Sulgrave Road and the B4525 Welsh Lane, known as the 'Greatworth T'; and Further excavation, removal and storage of earth as part of the Greatworth Green Tunnel construction.
	February to autumn 2023	 Vegetation removal near Helmdon Road in preparation for construction of the Greatworth Green Tunnel; and Increased use of a traffic-light controlled highway crossing area at Helmdon Road.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Halse Copse	Ongoing throughout spring 2023	 Asphalting of the site access road to minimise mud and dust;
		Excavation of the deep railway cutting continues with material transported using the internal access road up to Greatworth; and
	Continuation of earthworks activities in the local area, including movement and storage of	

		earthworks, the completion of temporary settlement ponds and earth bunds.
Location 2 Radstone	Ongoing throughout spring 2023	 Utilities diversions and preparatory works on Radstone Road; Works for the temporary diversion of Radstone Road to build the overbridge; Radstone Road overbridge works including soil stripping, excavation and installation of piling platform and piling activities; Asphalting of the site access road to minimise dust and mud; and Excavation of the deep railway cutting continues, including movement and storage of earth. Traffic management will be required to facilitate these works on Radstone Road.
Location 3 A43	Ongoing throughout spring 2023	 Utility diversion works along the A43 to prepare for the construction of the A43 overbridge and temporary road diversion; and Lane closures on the A43, allowing for the safe exit of specific vehicles from our site as required.
Location 4 A422	Ongoing throughout spring 2023	 Work continues on the creation of the temporary A422 road alignment and roundabout, which will include a temporary bridge; Works for the installation of the bridge deck for the temporary bridge; Completion of the A422 roundabout; and New diversion of the A422 opening to traffic.

Informing

- We will tell you about HS2 works in your area.
- We have local community websites and newsletters with regular information and updates about our work in your area.
- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

Involving

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
