Three-month look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Willesden Euroterminal	March to May 2023	The Willesden Euroterminal site will continue to operate as a rail terminal. Works planned during this period include:
(WET) site		Receiving excavated material from other HS2 sites in the area, by road and conveyor;
		Train movements taking place 24/7 in line with the national rail freight timetable. We'll continue moving rail wagons and loading the excavated materials 24/7*;
		Refurbishment of the ground floor to create a new induction centre;
		Construction of the welcome centre in front of the main site entrance; and
		UKPN utility diversions along the Grand Union Canal and shaft near the Grand Union Canal logistics bridge.
		*From January to April 2023, there will be up to 20 loaded train departures per week. We anticipate this will increase to 25 movements a week in May 2023.
Location 3 Atlas Road	March to May 2023	At the Atlas Road site, we will continue to prepare to build the Atlas Road Logistics Tunnel from early 2023.
site		Works planned during this period include:
		Assembly of the tunnel boring machine for the Atlas Road Logistics Tunnel;
		Operation of the conveyor system to move excavated materials from other sites in the area to the Willesden Euroterminal site;
		 Installation of the gantry cranes, which will be used in the future to move concrete tunnel segments;
		Installation of the underground conveyor system from the logistics tunnel launch box to connect to the main above-ground conveyor system;
		Installation of on-site utilities connections and electrical substations;

		Installation of workshops for future tunnelling works; and
		Launch of the TBM from the Atlas Road Logistics Tunnel site to the Old Oak Common Station site.

Location 4 Old Oak Common	March to May 2023	Works are progressing well at Old Oak Common Station site. Works planned for this period include: • Construction of the internal site road and
Station site		concrete surfaces;
		Piling* and concrete wall construction;
		 Excavation of material and concrete structure works for the HS2 underground station;
		Concrete batching plant installation;
		Stamford Brook Sewer manholes construction;
		 Ground preparation works in the Great Western Mainline Station;
		Piling for the conventional station (the above ground platforms that will connect the HS2 Station to the Great Western Main Line and the Elizabeth Line services); and
		Operation of the conveyor to remove excavated materials from the Old Oak Common site towards the WET site, for transportation by train.
		*Piling = creating deep concrete foundations.
Location 5	March to May	Works planned on Old Oak Common Lane include:
Old Oak Common Lane	2023	 Ongoing traffic management associated with various construction work. This includes lane closures and traffic light signals;
		 Crossrail Depot and station access retaining wall works;
		The foundations that have been laid will be filled with concrete, between Old Oak Common Lane and completed concrete structures associated with the HS2 station box and retaining walls;
		Trial holes and surveys for Old Oak Common Lane bridges; and

		 Enabling works, earthworks, piling* and foundations for the Central Line and Old Oak Common Lane bridges.
		*Piling = creating deep foundations
	March to May	Network Rail works
	2023	Network Rail will be carrying out essential track work near Old Oak Common Lane over the next three months.
		Works planned for this period include:
		 Relocating elevated power cables along tracks to ground level;
		Relocating signalling equipment and cables;
		 Removing and replacing overhead line equipment structures;
		Lowering ground levels and sheet piling*; and
		Constructing an internal haul road and machine movements.
		*Piling = creating deep foundations
Location 6 Victoria Road Flat Iron site	March to May 2023	We will continue to operate the vehicle holding area at this site to support construction at all HS2 sites in the Old Oak and North Acton area.
		Works ongoing on this site include:
		 Increased site lighting, utility connections, and maintenance works;
		Concreting, excavation and drainage works;
		 Installation of the conveyor system from Victoria Road Crossover Box site;
		Operation of the conveyor to move excavated materials to Willesden Euroterminal; and
		 Preparation for works to build the Northolt Tunnels East from late 2023. This will include delivery and assembly of the tunnel boring machines (TBMs) and construction of the launch areas for the TBMs below ground.
Location 7 Victoria Road Crossover Box site	March to May 2023	Works will continue in the Victoria Road Crossover Box site to build the ventilation shaft and crossover box. These structures will regulate air flow, provide

		access to the tunnels and allow trains to switch tracks
		as they enter the future Old Oak Common Station.
		Ongoing works during this period include:
		 Construction of the crossover box. This includes excavation, concrete breaking and other works;
		Works to build tunnels that connect the ventilation shaft to the crossover box. These works will take place below ground and the tunnels will be dug using an excavator*;
		Construction of an on-site batching plant;
		Utility connections and maintenance works;
		Installation of additional site welfare facilities; and
		Preparation for works to build the Northolt Tunnels East from late 2023. This will include delivery and assembly of the tunnel boring machines (TBMs) and construction of the launch areas for the TBMs below ground.
		*Some aspects of these works may require extended hours of working. If extended working hours are required, we will send out information to the local community in advance.
Location 8 Wormwood	March to May 2023	Works planned at the Stamford Brook Sewer site include:
Scrubs		Removing a site compound and access road; and
		Reinstatement of the land.
		The Undertrack Crossing site will continue to be in place while utilities are diverted in the future.
Works impacting the road network	March to May 2023	The utility diversion works that required the closure of Chase Road were completed in February 2023. A short-term lane closure may be required in mid-2023 for utility connection works – this is still subject to confirmation.
		We will continue to carry out utility surveys in various locations along the HS2 tunnel route. The surveys will tell us what work is needed to protect utility services during construction of the tunnels.
		We currently anticipate that utility protection works may be required in some local areas, including:

- Park Royal Road
- Victoria Road
- Chase Road.

We will write to you in advance of any utility surveys or utility works that might impact you.

12 months advanced look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Willesden Euroterminal site (WET)	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	 The Willesden Euroterminal site will continue to operate as a rail terminal. During this period: We will continue to receive excavated material from other HS2 sites in the area by road and conveyor; We will be operating gantry cranes to move concrete tunnel segments from service trains to the storage areas. The tunnel segments will be transported from Willesden Euroterminal to the Atlas Road site via the Grand Union Canal bridge; and Trains will arrive and depart 24/7 in line with the national rail freight timetable. From April to June 2023, we anticipate there will be up to 25 loaded train departures per week. During 2023, we plan to install a new Welcome Centre near the entrance of the Willesden Euroterminal site and carry out works in the ground floor of the Logistics Hub building (the 'breadbin' building). The details of these works are yet to be confirmed and we will provide more information to the local community in advance.
Location 2 Atlas Road site	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	 During this period, the following works are planned at our Atlas Road site: Works to build the Atlas Road Logistics Tunnel using a tunnel boring machine – view our FAQs about the logistics tunnel; Operation of the conveyor system through the Atlas Road site to move excavated materials to the Willesden Euroterminal site; Operation of gantry cranes to move concrete tunnel segments into the tunnel; and

		Installation of the conveyor system from the logistics tunnel to the main above-ground conveyor system. Some of the works at this site will require extended working hours. We will keep the local community informed as works progress.
Location 3 Victoria Road Crossover Box site	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	 Works planned at the Victoria Road Crossover Box site during this period include: Construction of the crossover box; Works to build tunnels that connect the ventilation shaft to the crossover box; Operation of the conveyor system to move excavated materials to Willesden Euroterminal; Works to install concrete internal structures in the ventilation shaft; Additional site lighting to support extended working hours; Utility connections and maintenance works; Delivery, connection, launch and operation of two TBMs to build the Northolt Tunnels East, westbound from the Victoria Road Crossover Box from late 2023; and Start of work to build tunnels from the Victoria Road Crossover Box to the Old Common station site is planned from late 2023. We will provide further information to the local community in advance of our tunnelling works.
Location 4 Old Oak Common Station site	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	 Works planned at the Old Oak Common Lane site during this period include: Construction of an internal site road and concrete surfaces; Piling* and concrete wall construction; Excavation of material and concrete structure works for the HS2 underground station; Construction of tower crane foundations; Piling*, construction of foundations and platforms for the conventional station (the

Location 5 Old Oak Common Lane	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	above ground platforms that will connect the HS2 Station to the Great Western Main Line and the Elizabeth Line services); and • Building using concrete blocks. *Piling = creating deep concrete foundations. Works planned on Old Oak Common Lane during this period include: • Construction of the station access retaining wall; • Construction of the Crossrail depot retaining wall; • Sub-station foundation works; • The foundations that have been laid will be filled with concrete; • Enabling works, piling* and foundations for future bridge construction above Old Oak Common Lane; • Old Oak Common Lane utilities diversion works; • Old Oak Common Lane bridge construction; and • Traffic management associated with various construction work. This can include lane / road closures and traffic light signals. *Piling = creating deep foundations.
Location 7 Victoria Road Flat Iron site	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	We will continue to operate the vehicle holding area at this site to support construction at all HS2 sites in the Old Oak and Park Royal area. The conveyor system will be operating in this site to move excavated materials from the Old Oak Common Station site and Victoria Road Crossover Box site to Willesden Euroterminal. We will be receiving concrete tunnel segments to this site to support the future construction of the Northolt East Tunnels.

Location 8 Wormwood Scrubs	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	The Stamford Brook Sewer site will be completely removed and the land on Wormwood Scrubs will be reinstated. The Undertrack Crossing site will remain in place.
Works impacting the road network	Summer 2023 to summer 2024	We will continue to carry out utility and bridge surveys in various locations along the HS2 tunnel route. The surveys will tell us what work is needed to protect utility services and bridges during construction of the tunnels.
		We currently expect that utility protection works will be required in the Old Oak and North Acton area, including:
		Park Royal Road
		Victoria Road
		Atlas Road.
		We will write to you in advance of any utility surveys or utility works that might impact you.

- We have local community websites and newsletters with regular information and updates about our work in your area.
- We have local community teams who know your area. They will hold local events and run projects to keep you informed.

Involving

- We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.
- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

Keeping you informed

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.
