Update on SCSJV section of conveyor system

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

Conveyor update

The conveyor structure in the Old Oak and North Acton area has been jointly built by HS2's contractors, SCSJV and BBVS. It allows us to move excavated material between sites and reduce construction traffic on local roads while we build HS2.

The **BBVS** section of the conveyor from Old Oak Common Station site to Willesden Euroterminal site has been fully operational since October 2022.

It operates between 8am and 6pm, Monday to Friday, and maintenance takes place on Saturdays between 8am and 1pm.

SCSJV began testing and commissioning their section of the conveyor (see diagram on following page) from mid-December 2022. It became fully operational on 19 April, running 24 hours a day, five days a week.

During the running of the belts, you may notice mechanical, humming, and rumbling noises from the conveyor. Noise from the conveyor safety start-up alarm may also be audible for short periods. We will ensure that noise is kept within permitted levels and use best practicable means to minimise any impact on our site neighbours.

Both BBVS and SCSJV will continue to monitor the conveyor systems and carry out maintenance to ensure the system is running safely and disruption is kept to a minimum.

Duration of works

BBVS conveyor section has been fully operational since October 2022, running between 8am to 6pm Monday to Friday.

SCSJV section of conveyor fully operational from 19 April 2023, running 24 hours a day, five days a week.

There may be an audible humming noise and rumbling when the conveyor runs, and you may notice noise from the safety start-up alarm for short periods.
