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This forward look covers HS2 associated work in the London Borough of Hillingdon. The document includes:


- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months

### Map 1 - Hillingdon overview



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	Ongoing until	Colne Valley Viaduct, A412 North Orbital Way
A412 North Orbital Way, Bucks	2024	For access to the viaduct pier locations in the Korda, Savay, and Harefield lakes, we have built temporary jetties - temporary bridge structures - across the lakes. These allow us to use the jetties as a platform to support cranes, and other plant, as part of pier and Colne Valley Viaduct construction, as well as an providing an internal haul road to move equipment and materials. All piling for the piers and jetties is now complete.
		The Colne Valley Viaduct has now been constructed over the A412 and the launching girder – Dominique – is now building the viaduct towards the River Colne which it will cross in spring 2023.
Multiple locations	Ongoing until December 2024	Continuing with water quality sampling from the River Colne, River Pinn, Newyears Green Bourne and The Greenway.  Small samples of water are taken from streams in the area each month. This is done by staff on foot taking a jam-jar sized sample for analysis.
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Map 2 - Colne Valley lakes and Harvil Road



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Moorhall Road	Ongoing to 2025	Moorhall Road north and south compounds are now fully operational and supporting the construction of the south embankment as well as pier construction for the CVV. Construction vehicles are using the internal haul road to access the pier locations. Permanent road traffic signals are operating on Moorhall Road (managed by TFL) to control traffic movements at the junction with Moorhall Road and the work compounds.

		The lanes of Moorhall Road will be narrowed in mid April 2023 to allow for the ground to be prepared either side of the road for the crossing of the Colne Valley Viaduct later in 2023.
Location 2	Ongoing until	Compound fencing has been extended on Harefield
Colne Valley lakes	November 2024	Moor to accommodate earthworks. The permissive path between the Colne Valley Trail and Harvil Road around the fence line has been diverted to allow for temporary stockpiling of soil on land next to Dews Lane.  The stockpiled material will be used to create the South Embankment of the Colne Valley Viaduct, next to Harvil Road from October 2023 to November 2024.  As part of our ongoing construction works to build the piers in the lakes and on the ground to support the Colne Valley Viaduct, an overhead scaffold frame to carry a water treatment pipeline across the Grand Union Canal has been built.
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Location 3 Dews Lane/South Embankment	Ongoing until November 2024	A works compound and offices are operational at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activity Centre (HOAC) site at the end of Dews Lane/South Embankment. This compound is the operation centre for the construction of the temporary jetties and the permanent viaduct structure between the former HOAC site and the Grand Union Canal south bank.
		Dews Lane is operating as a temporary haul road with secure access at the junction with Harvil Road.
		Access is permitted for local business (RAC Garages) and other community groups that require access from Harvil Road.
Location 4 Harvil Road	Ongoing until2025	Permanent lights are now installed to control construction traffic movement at the junction with Harvil Road, in Hillingdon.

Location 5, 7 and 3 Denham Country Park to Harvil Road	Ongoing until Spring 2023	National Grid's pylon diversion scheme reinstatement work in Denham Country Park won't begin until around mid-late April 2023. This includes removing the remaining temporary trackway, bridges, fencing and associated equipment, and tree planting. It's expected the work will take 4-6 weeks to complete.  The footpath (permissible track-path) near Flagmore Ditch will remain open but Stop/Go boards will be in use to close the path temporarily for vehicle movements.
Location 6 Dews Lane / Newyears Green Bourne	To August 2024	Works to create the foundations for the viaduct piers south of Harvil Road have now been completed. Works taking place on site include the construction of the piers from Moorhall Road to the South Embankment and the construction of the South Embankment where the Colne Valley Viaduct will meet the land having crossed the lakes.
Location 7 Savay Lake to Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	September 2021 to 2024	Piling and cofferdam construction is now complete.  Construction is now taking to create the permanent structures – piers – for the Colne Valley Viaduct.  Towpath access along the Grand Union Canal will remain open throughout these works.
Location 8 Harefield Lake No2	October 2021 to March 2024	From June 2022 a short section of the access track/National Cycle Route 6 on the southern side of Harefield Marina was diverted to enable access to build the pier foundations on the southside of the Grand Union Canal. A temporary pontoon has been built in the canal to carry light vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists around the worksite.

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Location 9 Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	February 2022 to December 2023	The existing bridleway leading from U34 to Harvil Road is diverted to allow for soil stockpiling north of HOAC. Access to the fishing locations and Dellside track are not affected, however users of the footpath are diverted around a perimeter fence.  Material stockpiled in this location will be moved to site via the existing site entrance and access road at Harvil Road.  The stockpile is being used to build the Colne Valley Viaduct South Embankment.
		Works to establish a small compound on land between the south bank of the Grand Union Canal and the HOAC lake began in early April 2022. These works enabled the construction of the ground pier in this location and required a diversion of the access path and Colne Valley Trail / National Cycle Route 6. This path will remain open during the works.
Location 10 Colne Valley Viaduct South Embankment	February 2022 to December 2023	Piling for the Colne Valley Viaduct south abutment, where it will meet the land after crossing the Colne lakes is now complete. Construction is now taking place to build the abutment and the South Embankment

Location 1 Copthall North	Ongoing until May 2023	<ul> <li>Copthall tunnel:</li> <li>Construction of the Copthall Tunnel continues at the Western Portal. Current phase of works at the portal end involves constructing the walls, the bridge deck, extended walls and props and waling beams. In order to enable the permanent works, various temporary works schemes will be implemented at the Western Portal in 2023 which will be visible to the public from Harvil Road.</li> <li>Progress further east into the central section of the tunnel and commence the steelwork for the temporary works scheme and erecting the temporary structures to support the permanent structure of the tunnel.</li> <li>TBM material delivery via lorry and soil treatment temporarily stored near MSD building north of the</li> </ul>

		Chiltern Lian railway, west of Breakspear Road South.  Harvil Road North  Ongoing construction of the embankment for the road realignment using the material excavated from the Copthall cut and cover tunnel.
Locations 2 Harvil Road	Ongoing until May 2023	<ul> <li>Chiltern Line Bridge</li> <li>Ongoing construction of the new bridge over the Chiltern line railways, including backfill works.</li> <li>Harvil Road South</li> <li>Skip Lane new junction works, including drainage works.</li> <li>Temporary traffic management to carry out the main utility works and constructing the new road realignment, including earthworks and highway build up.</li> </ul>
Location 3 Copthall South	Ongoing until June 2023  Ongoing into 2024	<ul> <li>Construction of the treatment silos and TBM material testing area, including roof and pugmill installation.</li> <li>Conveyor installation works</li> <li>Temporary TBM material storage</li> <li>Southern Sustainable Placement area</li> <li>Earthworks, soil compacting works and soil movement across the SSPA area</li> <li>Attenuation ponds and water management works, including siltbuster in operation</li> <li>Drainage and water management work</li> </ul>

TBM Sushila and TBM Caroline are constructing the Birmingham Downline and London Upline respectively.

		Ickenham Close, Blenheim Crescent, Herlwyn Avenue, Lawn Close, Almond Close, Cherry Close, Roundways, Bridgwater Road and Rabournmead in the London Borough of Hillingdon and Mandeville Road and Greenpark Way in the London Borough of Ealing.
		TBM Sushila is in the vicinity of Herlwyn Avenue and TBM Caroline is expected to arrive at the same location around one month later (subject to tunnelling programme).

#### **Utility** works

Borough of Hillingdon and Rabournmead Drive, Mandeville Road and Greenpark Way in the London Borough of Ealing.

The alignment of the Northolt Tunnels West means that a number of roads pass over the tunnel route. To mitigate the effects of tunnelling settlement (ground movement) on utilities, a programme of protection and diversion works will be carried out ahead of when the tunnel boring machines pass nearby.

- Water and gas main diversions
- Water and gas main replacement
- Sewer lining

Due to the location of utilities within the highways and footways, there will be a series of temporary traffic management in place whilst the protection and diversion works are being carried out.

- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.
