



Notice of night time closure of **Moorhall Road for temporary** lane narrowing

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. We will be narrowing the lanes on Moorhall Road to support the construction of the Colne Valley Viaduct over the road.

Night time closure of Moorhall Road

We will be constructing the section of the Colne Valley Viaduct over Moorhall Road in late summer 2023. Before we do so we need to prepare the road and working areas on either side of the crossing point.

To provide space for these works we will need to temporarily narrow the carriageway on both sides of Moorhall Road. To do this we will close Moorhall Road in the early hours of Monday 17 April 2023 between the River Garden public house and the junction with Link Way/ Savay Lane whilst operatives work in the highway. The closure will take place from 12.15am on the morning of Monday 17 April 2023, after the last bus on route 331 has passed through. The road will reopen again at 5am.

The lane narrowing is expected to be in place on Moorhall Road until late autumn this year, after the viaduct crossing has been completed. Moorhall Road will be reinstated to its normal width at this time.

The map of the closure area is on page two. There will be signage on approach to each end of the closure points, with access maintained for local residents and businesses. Emergency services will be allowed through the road closure, as required.

The diversion route for these works is on page three.

If for any reason we cannot work due to poor weather, we will not close the road



What are the closure points?

Moorhall Road will be closed in both directions from the junction of Moorfield Road/Savay Lane/Link Way, to just near to the River Garden public house for just under 5 hours from 12:15am to 5:00am on Monday 17 April 2023.





The formal signposted diversion route during the closure in the early hours of Monday 17 April is shown on the map below. The route is via the A412, A40, Denham Roundabout, Swakeleys Roundabout/Western Avenue, Swakeleys Road and Harvil Road.
