What are we doing?

We have some upcoming works along the A413 London Road that support the construction of the A413 re-alignment and the Small Dean viaduct.

We have three phases of construction coming up that will have short duration impacts on the road from June into July;

- Overnight closures for ground investigations
- A weekend closure for utility diversions
- Traffic lights for a lane closure to continue utility diversions

When will these works take place?

- Monday 19 June to Friday 24 June overnight road closures 8.30 pm to 5.30am
- Friday 30 June to Monday 3 July weekend closure 8.30pm on Friday night to 5.30am on Monday morning
- Friday 7 July to Monday 10 July traffic lights and lane closure 8.30 pm on Friday night to 5.30am on Monday morning.

To minimise disruption, we will provide a signposted diversion route and have chosen to work outside of peak traffic hours.

These dates may be subject to change due to circumstances outside of our control.

What is the ground investigation?

In order to build the Small Dean Viaduct, we need to temporarily realign a small section of the A413 London Road.

To prepare for the main utility diversions we need to investigate below the surface of the tarmac covering the road around the utility services.

This work will involve excavating into the road to investigate the subbase, which sits below the tarmac surface, therefore will require a road closure on the area being investigated.

These works require the carriageway to be empty, therefore the road will be closed overnight only between Monday 19 June to Friday 24 June.

What is the weekend closure for?

In preparation for this realignment we have to permanently divert existing utility services next to the carriageway. We will need to work over one full weekend on the A413 to complete this.

This will involve digging trenches diagonally across the road to insert connecting pipework and cable ducts and backfilling to return the road to its original condition. To complete these works as quickly as possible we will be working 24 hours a day throughout the weekend.

How long is the lane closure for?

We will also need to introduce a lane closure in the same area for the weekend commencing Friday 7 July, this is to allow us to continue these utility diversion works following on from the weekend closure.

Access will be maintained to and from Wendover, controlled by two-way traffic lights which will be in operation throughout this lane closure.

The temporary diversion of the A413 is expected to be operational for road users from late summer 2023 with the Small Dean Viaduct construction being completed in 2026.



The above illustration shows an indicative location for the utility diversions which cross the carriageway to be carried out over the weekend closure.



Where will the road closure be?

The map below, shows the area of road that will be closed on the A413 overnight from Monday 19 to Friday 24 June and over one full weekend from Friday 30 June to Monday 3 July, a fully signposted diversion route will be provided.

The map below also shows the area for lane closure and two-way traffic lights over one full weekend from Friday 7 July to Monday 10 July.
