High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. If you have any questions or enquiries about our work, please contact our Helpdesk to find out more. You can sign up for regular updates in your local area at www.hs2inyourarea.co.uk.

What are we doing?

At the end of May, we will be temporarily diverting Nash Lee Road and Nash Lee Lane. We have been working to construct these diversions since last summer and they are now ready to be brought into use for the public.

To allow us to connect the temporary diversion to the existing road, we will need to close the road for the safety of road users and our workforce.

Once the connections are established, road users will travel along the new temporary Nash Lee Road which is to the West of the existing road. Nash Lee Lane will be accessible directly from Nash Lee roundabout, rather than from Nash Lee Road.

Access to local businesses and residents will be maintained.

When will these works take place?

The road closure will be in effect from Saturday 27 May to Sunday 4 June.

These dates are subject to change due to circumstances beyond our control. Should we finish the works early, the lane closures will be removed.

Duration of works

Works will take place between Saturday 27 May to Sunday 4 June.

Traffic management will be in place 24 hours.

What to expect

Varied activities with both quiet and busier periods.

Full closure of Nash Lee Road and Nash Lee Lane.

Fully signposted diversion route.

Temporary road layouts for the area during construction.

What we will do

Manage any environmental impacts, such as traffic and noise.

Respond promptly to any complaints and take appropriate action.

Take care to respect the community.

Provide local community drop in sessions where you can find out more information about our works in the area.

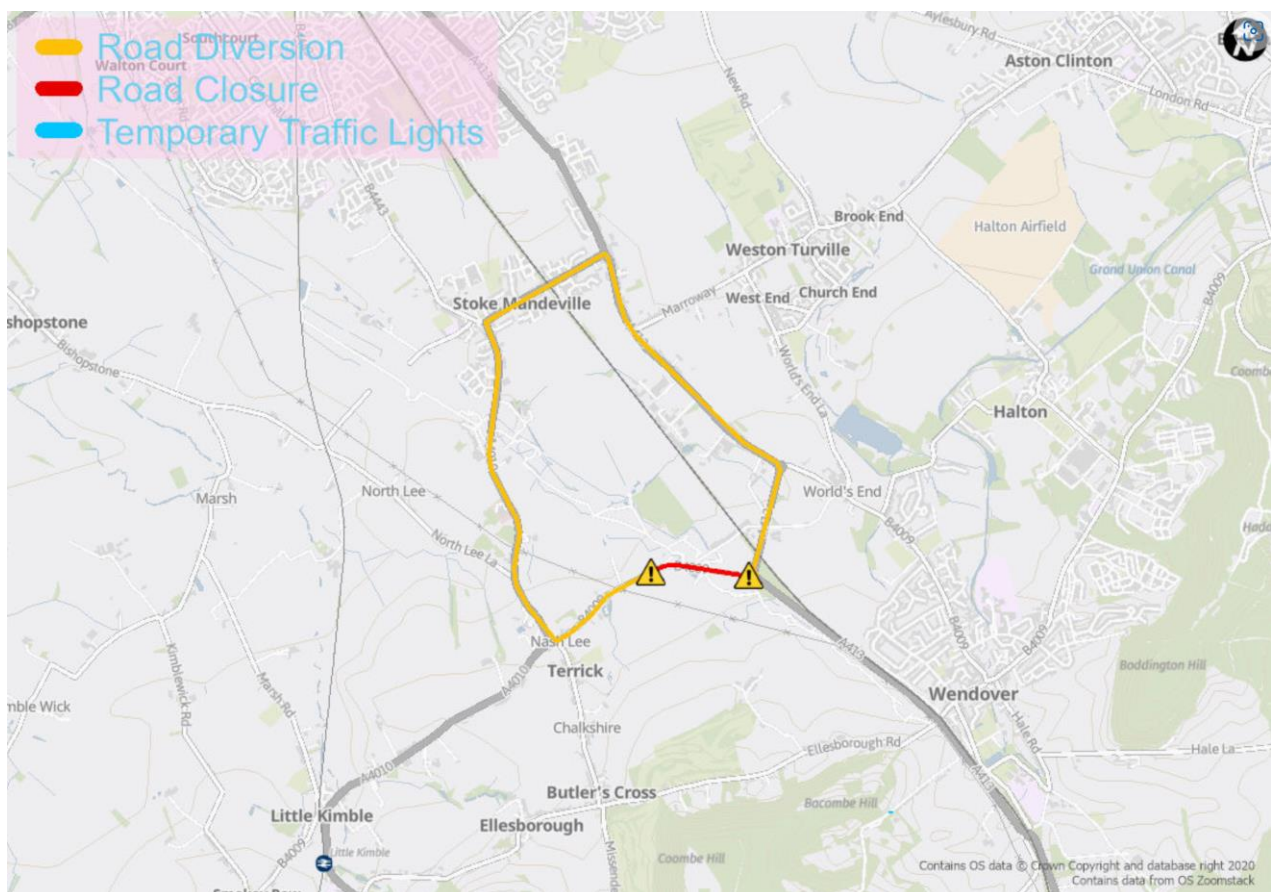


What other works will be happening?

During this closure, we will be working collaboratively with Buckinghamshire Council who are proposing to resurface Nash Lee Road as part of their capital renewal works programme. This will mean that the stretch of road up from the A4010 to the A413 will undertake a road surface upgrade at the same time we are completing the new diversions.

Where will the road closure be?

The map below shows the road closure that will be in place on Nash Lee Road between Saturday 27 May - Sunday 4 June. The diversion route shown in yellow, will take road users up to Stoke Mandeville and across to join the A413, Wendover Road. Access to local business and residents will be maintained.

Why do you need these diversions?

The purpose of these diversions is to allow us to begin work on the permanent Nash Lee Road and Nash Lee Lane alignments.

The temporary diversion of Nash Lee Road will include a 55m span road bridge to take road traffic over our construction site, this enables us to complete the HS2 works without impacting road users. This bridge and the temporary roads will be removed after works are completed.

The new alignments of the roads will include a permanent 150m bridge on Nash Lee Road that will carry traffic over the HS2 line.

How does this affect me?

Full access to all residential properties on Nash Lee Lane and Road will be maintained throughout our temporary traffic management and diversion works.

We are utilising the existing roundabout at the top of the Wendover Bypass by creating new spurs which will divert traffic onto both of these new road diversions, this means there will be a change to the existing road layout.

The stretch of road from the roundabout down past the existing turning for Nash Lee Lane will be closed.

Residents and road users looking to access Nash Lee Lane will no longer have access from the existing turning off Nash Lee Road onto the lane.

The HS2 trace will eventually run through this section of the road. The change of access will now come from a new northern spur off the bypass roundabout.

For users of Nash Lee Road, you will follow the change in road layout to the west of the roundabout to connect onto the Wendover Bypass or continue along Nash Lee Road towards the Terrick roundabout.
