What are we doing?

In May and early June, EKFB will continue to divert utilities for the permanent realignment of the A423 Banbury Road and the construction of the Banbury Road Overbridge. There will be two-way and three-way traffic lights installed on the A423 Banbury Road. The lights will be in the area just north of Ladbroke towards Southam. The exact location of the lane closure areas will very as work progresses. The duration will also vary day-to-day, and some lane closures may need to remain overnight. We will remove lane closures as quickly as we can, once each section of the work is complete.

Drivers may notice that in some locations, the road surface is not affected by our utility diversions. On these occasions, due to the speed of the road, the lane closures will still be required to provide a safe working space for our workforce. They may be working close by on the soft verge or ditches.

There will be a one day closure of the A423 at the same location, to complete the utility connections.

When will these works take place?

A section of the A423 Banbury Road between Ladbroke and Southam will have traffic lights in place from Monday 22 May to Saturday 17 June 2023, 24 hours a day.

The same section of road will be closed on Saturday 10 June, from 8am to 10pm.

These dates may be subject to change due to circumstances outside of our control, such as poor weather.

Duration of works

The A423 will have two-way traffic lights from 22 May to 17 June 2023,

24 hours a day

The road will be closed on Saturday 10 June, 8am to 10pm

Our contractors may be on site for one hour's start-up and shutdown either side of these times.

Access will be maintained for residents and emergency services.

Take care to respect the community.



Notice of Road Closure, A423, Southam




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Where will the works take place?

The map below shows the location of the road closure on the A423, which will be on Saturday 10 June 2023

Access will be maintained for residential properties within the closure area, including properties on Kingfisher Drive. Business access will also be maintained for the Warwick House Industrial Estate, as well as local farm access.
