# Notice of 24/7 working on the West Coast main line at Streethay

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty VINCI (BBV) is working in partnership with HS2 Ltd to build the new high-speed railway in your area.

# The work we will be doing

Since early 2022 we have been constructing Fulfen Wood Overbridge, on land next to the West Coast main line railway in Streethay. The bridge will allow HS2 to pass under the West Coast main line. The Fulfen Wood Overbridge will be installed during a nine day closure of a section of the railway between Rugby & Stafford in July 2023. During the closure we will:

- Remove the signals, railway tracks and excavate the embankment.
- Use specialist transport vehicles to lift and install the bridge in place.
- Complete works and surveys to the bridge and re-open the railway.

#### When we will do the work

We have been working in partnership with Network Rail to plan the temporary closure of the West Coast main line between Stafford and Rugby. The closure will commence on 15 July 2023 and we will install the bridge and re-open the railway on 24 July 2023. Over this period, we will be working 24/7.



### Where we will be working

The map below shows our working area.



## Network Rail - Improving future journeys.

During the closure, Network Rail will complete works as part of a £58million investment to improve future journeys on this important stretch of the West Coast main line, through the West Midlands. This includes replacing 4000 metres of track, 3300 railway sleepers and installing new signalling equipment at Colwich Junction between Saturday 15 and Sunday 23 July ahead of commissioning a new signalling system at the junction next year. If you are travelling over this period, then please plan ahead as passenger journeys will take longer and will include rail replacement bus services and changes to timetables.

- Avanti West Coast will have an amended timetable and diversions will result in extended journey times for passengers travelling to and from London Euston.
- London Northwestern Railway services between Crewe and London Euston will run between Rugby and London Euston only. There will be a replacement bus service between Rugby and Stafford.
   Passengers are advised to use alternative services between Stafford and Crewe.
- West Midlands Railway will have replacement bus services between Hednesford and Rugeley Trent Valley and between Bermuda Park and Nuneaton.

There will also be changes to services on Sundays throughout July 2023.

# **Fulfen Wood Overbridge**

Fulfen Wood Overbridge is the structure that will enable HS2 to pass underneath the West Coast main line railway at Streethay.

The West Coast main line will need to be closed for nine days to allow Fulfen Wood Overbridge to be installed. During the nine day railway closure the new 56m long and 19m wide overbridge, weighing 6500 tonnes, will be driven into place using specialist lifting and transport equipment.

As we have developed the design of the HS2 railway in Streethay we have reduced the length of wall structures in the cutting for the railway from 1.6 kilometres to 420 metres, meaning 80% less concrete will be needed, supporting HS2's ambition to cut carbon on the project. This will save around 70,000 cubic metres of concrete, the equivalent to 6,700 concrete mixer lorry loads. In total, around 420,000 tonnes of carbon has been saved in this area of the project.

The railway will pass through Streethay in a cutting, and the shortening of the retaining structures also means the community will experience less noise and disruption during construction because fewer large machines will be needed on site. Once complete, HS2 which will transform journeys between London, the Midlands and the North, by making space on the existing railway network for more freight and local services.
