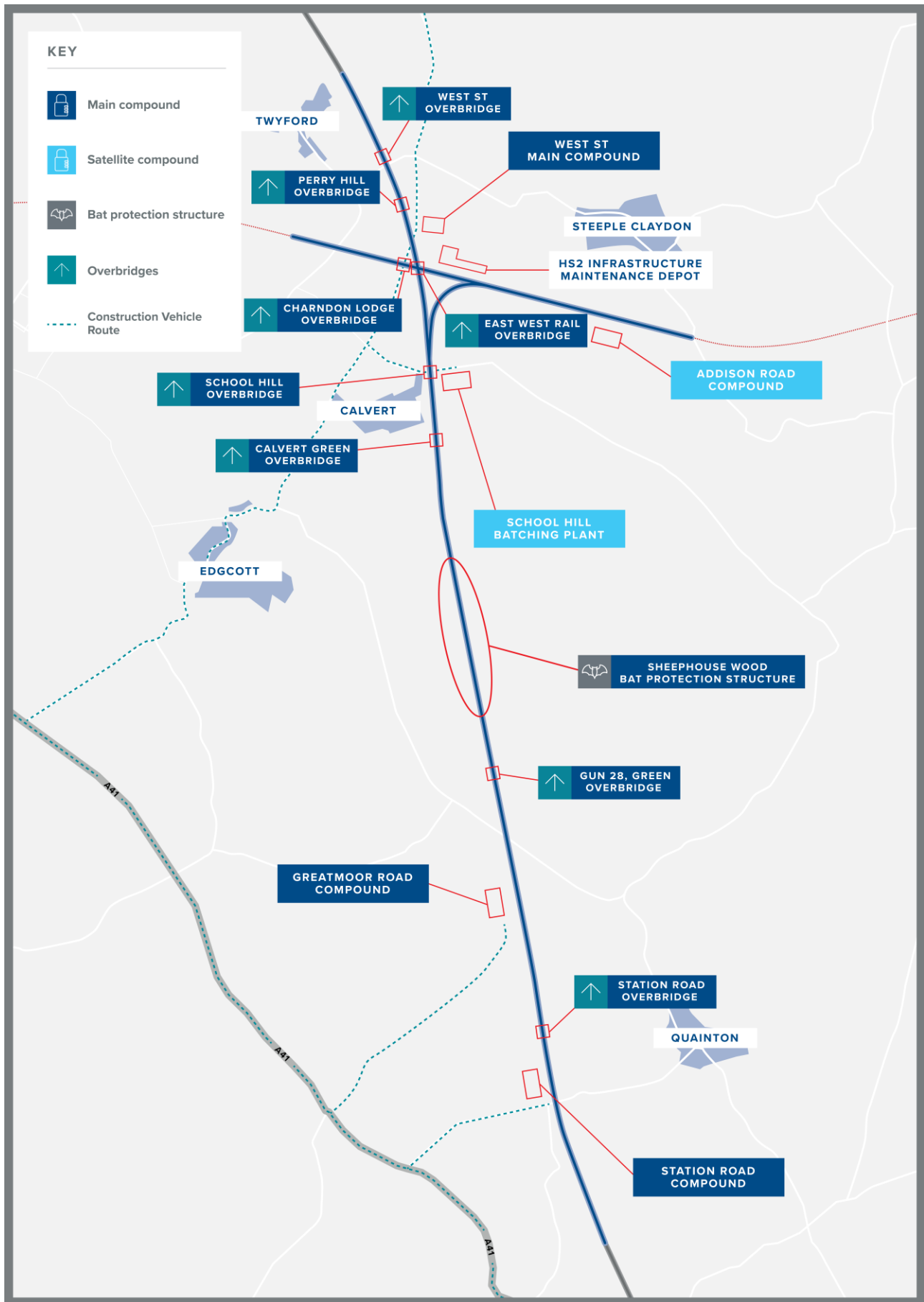
Fly over footage – see Calvert from the air...

What's Happening in Your Area?

Perry Hill/Gawcott Road realignment

At the end of May, utilising a 600 tonne crawler crane, we successfully completed the installation of the 824 tonne steel deck for the new Perry Hill overbridge. The weight of the steel deck is equivalent to that of 140 adult African elephants.

For the remainder of 2023, we will be undertaking the installation of the concrete deck of the bridge and permanent utility diversions. These diversions will allow us to construct the new permanent realignment of Gawcott Road which will be tied into the new bridge in spring 2024. This bridge will carry traffic over the new HS2 railway line.

GUN28, Green overbridge

In late 2022, we completed our piling works for the green overbridge known as GUN28. GUN28 is at the top of Creighton Road adjacent to the FCC Energy from Waste processing centre.

Throughout the spring the piles were capped. This is where a reinforced concrete slab is constructed on top of the piles to evenly spread the load they are to carry. Our teams are now constructing the concrete walls and will install the bridge deck at the end of 2023.

Station Road

Throughout 2023, we have been carrying out utility diversion work for overhead cables located along Station Road. To facilitate the new overbridge and realignment of Station Road, these cables will be moved underground this autumn. Subject to consents, we will also be completing the tie in works for the new permanent realignment of Station Road to the existing road network. We expect to begin on the east side of the crossroads this autumn.

Sheephouse Wood bat protection structure

To facilitate the construction of the bat protection structure we began sheet piling in the autumn 2022. This included over 1km of sheet piles and were completed in early summer. These sheet piles enable us to carry out deep excavation works and bring in suitable aggregate to support the structure. Following on from the excavation works, we will begin building the walls for the bat protection structure this autumn.

This year we have also begun construction on the future pedestrian passageway that will travel underneath the structure. Subject to consents, we will also begin early works for the green overbridge, known as SL13. This overbridge will allow wildlife as well as pedestrians to travel over the new HS2 railway line.



Spotlight on Our Structures

West Street overbridge

We have been completing preparatory works for the construction of the new bridge, including utility diversions, which will allow us to begin excavation works this summer. The team are currently preparing for piling works for the foundation of the bridge. Piling activities will take place throughout the rest of the year and the old approach bridge is expected to be demolished this autumn.

Addison Road overbridge

Throughout the spring, we have been making progress on the structure of the bridge. Currently we are finalising the drainage and deck before the bridge is completed. We are also carrying out work on the embankments and permanent realignment of Addison Road. The bridge and road realignment are expected to be open later this year once a road safety audit has been completed by the local authority.

Charndon Lodge underbridge

The Charndon Lodge underbridge was completed this spring. Our teams are now finalising the backfill on both sides of the structure and waterproofing of the structure to increase the life span of the bridge.

School Hill Green overbridge

The works for School Hill overbridge will be taking place later this year and a road closure of School Hill/Werner Terrace will be put in

place. Details of these works and the timing will be provided in advance once they are finalised. We expect to demolish the existing bridge in late autumn and then commence with piling activities for the foundations of the bridge.

East West Rail overbridge

Our teams completed the abutments for the bridge last year and began lifting the bridge deck into position in early December of 2022. This summer we will be pouring concrete to complete the deck prior to handing the bridge over to East West Rail later this year.

Calvert Green overbridge

EKFB have been assisting FCC in migrating some of their facilities into the southern area of the Calvert section. These works will free up the required working space to commence excavation in summer in 2023 and begin piling works for the new bridge in the autumn. To undertake the piling in this area, a small bentonite plant is being built to help aid the team in controlling expected ground water and granular fill whilst works progress.

Edgcott Road overbridge

In early June we completed the piling works for the foundations of the new bridge. In August we expect to begin work for the bridge abutments and piers.

Great Moor Sailing Club and Scout hut

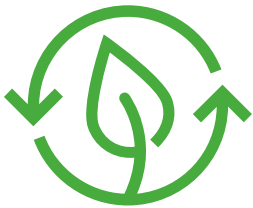
Earlier this year, Great Moor Sailing Club received some fantastic new enhancements to

Steeple Claydon Angling Club

In April, we were thrilled to be able to support Steeple Claydon Angling Club with their planting

project. In need of saplings to plant 70 meters of new hedgerow, EKFB provided a mixture of blackthorn, sessile oak and silver birch saplings to complete the project.

These varieties are in keeping with hedgerows in the surrounding area and will help support local wildlife such as the black hairstreak butterfly. When matured, the new hedgerow will also provide screening and a wind break for the anglers using the lake.

Infrastructure Maintenance Depot (IMD) update

Earthworks activities for the future IMD are progressing with works focusing on the construction of the rail platform and landscape bund.

The total volume for the IMD platform is 280,000 m³. The IMD landscape bund has volume of a 1,000,000m³. Earthworks are scheduled to be completed by the summer of 2024 which will then be followed by drainage works.
