Notice of works Princes Risborough to Aylesbury Line

What are we doing?

Throughout 2023, we have been working to prepare for a period of construction where we have an interface with Network Rail. There is a programme planned for a 10- week closure of the Princes Risborough to Aylesbury line, known as a blockade, while we undertake our works.

During this time, we will be constructing, moving and commissioning the new line. The realignment, which is only around 20m from the original line, is integral to keeping the Network Rail line open as HS2 passes through.

We will also be installing additional noise hoarding either side of the railway line by the Hawkslade Estate. There may be some vegetation clearance required to enable this.

Network Rail will then be conducting some safety upgrades on Marsh Lane crossing to make the crossing compliant post realignment works, which will be in place until Spring 2024.

There will be a closure of the Princes Risborough to Aylesbury Line for 12 weeks, which includes 2 weeks of Network Rail culvert repair works.



When will these works take place?

- July/August Noise hoarding installation
- Monday 7 August to Friday 18 August closure of the Princes Risborough to Aylesbury Line and the Wendover Line for Network Rail works
- Friday 18 August after 8pm Marsh Lane crossing closed for Network Rail works until Spring 2024
- Saturday 19 August and Monday 30 October 2023 HS2 Blockade works begin.

These dates may change due to conditions outside of our control. Please refer to the HS2 website regularly to check for any changes and updates.

Wherever possible, we will minimise the impact on highway users by coordinating deliveries to avoid peak times.

What to expect

What we will do

Minimise disruption as much as possible for the community by implementing noise mitigation.

Provide updates for communities and maintain regular contact points for the duration of the work.

Where will the works be taking place?

The map below indicates the main works area during the blockade. We are also working further up the line towards Aylesbury, on the outskirts of the Hawkslade housing estate as we will be removing and re-instating the line.

All bridges and culverts needed for line upgrade have already been completed. We are working carefully in line with Network Rail regulations to construct the new line upgrade around regular passenger and freight services.



Will there be 24hr working?

It was agreed with Network Rail and Chiltern Railways that the works to connect the new alignment would take place within a 10-week programme to shorten the period of disruption for rail users and residents. During this time there will be periods that we will be working 24hrs a day, subject to consents, to allow the live railway to switch from the existing line onto the new track.

We aim to complete the majority of noisy 24 hour works during the summer holidays as we have taken into consideration Booker Park School which is situated next to the railway line. This specialist SEND school teaches an array of students with varying degrees of sensitivity to noise. Due to this we have agreed to reduce the amount of disruption to pupils by limiting noisy works during their school hours 8:30am to 3:30pm.

What impacts will it have on residents?

We will be applying for consent from the council which agrees working hours, site noise levels and other measures prior to work starting. As we are planning to work 24hrs a day, there will be some operational noise during the overnight works. Please note, tower lighting will be installed so that works can occur safely during the night shift. We have conducted noise modelling around the planned activities and some properties based on their locations, may be impacted for short periods of time. We will be contacting these residents separately.

For information on ground borne noise and vibration and the defined thresholds please refer to the HS2 Information Paper E23 which outlines the measures that will be put in place to control noise and vibration during the construction of HS2. This can be found on the gov.uk website.

Road users for North Lee Lane during the Marsh Lane crossing upgrade will have to follow the suggested diversion route. We would suggest allowing for additional journey time during this period. There will also be a replacement rail service for those who use the Princes Risborough to Aylesbury line.


How will you minimise disruption?

We will be installing noise hoarding alongside the Princes Risborough to Aylesbury Line at the back of Hawkslade estate. This will help to reduce the operational noise to properties close to the railway line during the works. To conduct these works we may need to complete some de-vegetation to properly install the hoarding.

To the south of the estate, earth bunds are already in use which form a barrier of protection from our site noise. We will also be using acoustic blankets and other equipment measures to mitigate the noise towards the Aylesbury direction.

It was agreed with Network Rail and Chiltern Railways that the works to connect the new alignment would take place within a 10-week programme, to shorten the period of disruption for rail users and residents. Network Rail and Chiltern Railways booked these dates near the end of the summer holiday period to reduce the impact on travellers.

We will be working under full possession of the railway as we want to maximise the working time. By decommissioning and removing the track it is unable to be reopened until all the work is completed.



The map above shows indicative locations for noise mitigations. Some locations may vary due to ground conditions.

What will the noise levels be like?

In preparation to these works and for gaining consent to work outside of our core hours, we have undertaken modelling to gain an understanding of what the predicted noise levels will be like for day and night works.

We have used several receptors or monitoring points located around the PRA line, which cover a wide area of potential disturbance from the Hawkslade Estate to Lower Road, Marsh Lane and Old Risborough Road to name a few.

From these locations we established baseline ambient noise levels that already exist and were able to model it against the expected noise from our works.

From this modelling and our programme, we anticipate the first three weeks of works to cause the most noticeable potential disturbances, but none of which exceed harmful levels of noise.

To put into context, the diagram to the right shows some known levels of noise thresholds from everyday items. We anticipate the noise from our works to range from 30db to 90db.

The noise is modelled on average time working, therefore will not be continuous but there may be peaks of activity which is noticeable.

We have conducted noise modelling around the planned activities and some properties based on their locations, may be impacted for short periods of time. We will be contacting these residents separately.


HS2 recognises that, in some instances, buildings and the people who live in them may not be properly protected by our policies and that we need to consider these 'special cases' individually.

What will the lighting levels be like?

We will have 24/7 working during the blockade and therefore we need appropriate lighting for the safety and welfare of our staff.

We will be using tower lights and keeping them targeted on the works were practicable. However, we ensure all lighting is correctly positioned and monitored in line with HS2's Code of Construction Practice.



Will there be vibration?

There will be vibration associated with these works. We have undertaken modelling to gain an understanding of what the predicted vibration levels will be like for day and night works.

From this modelling and our programme, we anticipate the first three weeks of works to cause the most noticeable potential disturbances, but none of which exceed harmful levels of vibration. Please note: We will be contacting residents separately based on their property locations, who may be impacted for short periods of time.



What is the diversion for the Marsh Lane crossing?

Whilst the PRA line is closed, Network Rail are taking the opportunity to upgrade the crossing points. During this closure of the crossing, there will be a diversion of North Lee Lane which will travel from Marsh to Little Kimble, then to Princes Risborough and past Terrick and back onto to A4010 Risborough Road.

What will Network Rail be doing in this area?

Prior to the blockade Network Rail engineers will make repairs to a Victorian drainage culvert that passes underneath the railway in Aylesbury.

Faults were found in the structure earlier this year and have since led to repeated short-notice closures of the line causing disruption for passengers. For more information please visit Network Rail's dedicated website: www.networkrail.co.uk/pra
