Painting of white lines at Old Oak Common Station – 23 and 24 September

On Saturday 23 September, between 8am and 6pm and Sunday 24 September between 9am and 4pm, we will be re-painting some white lines on the internal construction roads, as well as renewing the white lining paint on the two “Keep Clear” boxes at the junction between the site and the highway.

Some of these works need to take place when vehicles are not entering or leaving the construction site, and therefore we will be working longer working hours over the weekend. We have a road closure at the front of site this weekend, so this will allow us to complete the highway lining renewal at the same time, to minimise disruption.

These works are weather dependent and therefore might take place on the following weekend. If this does happen, we will re-notify residents.
