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This forward look covers HS2 associated work in Warwickshire.


The document is a forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months.



Location 1	Ongoing throughout 2023/24	Building segments for viaducts and transporting materials to and from Kingsbury Main Compound throughout 2023/24
Location 2	Ongoing throughout 2023/24	Continuing works on the M42 Marston Box
Location 3	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	 Diverting utilities on Faraday Avenue Constructing the temporary diversion of Faraday Avenue
Location 4	Ongoing throughout 2023/2024	 Gypsy Lane compound: Pouring concrete for the pile caps to stabilise the ground while we build the Water Orton Viaducts through to early 2024 Continuing earthworks movements to and from site through to early 2024 Watton Lane compound: Piling and pouring concrete for the pile caps to
		 stabilise the ground while we construct the Water Orton Viaducts and Chattle Hill Structure. Our works will continue throughout winter 2023 and into 2024 Construction of piers for the Water Orton Viaducts throughout 2023 and 2024 Demolition of Old Saltleians Rugby Club complete Continuing earthworks movements to and from site throughout 2024 Creation of new compound access off Gilson Road completed in December 2023 Plant crossing to be constructed on Gilson Road opposite existing access during January 2024

		 Delivering piling works for Attleboro Lane Overbridge which will divert the existing road over the Water Orton cutting. Our works will continue until Spring 2024 Undertaking earthworks to build Attleboro Lane Overbridge until December 2023 (this will include topsoil stripping an embankment construction) Continue creating the Water Orton cutting to enable the railway to travel under Attleboro Lane Overbridge. Our works will continue through to Spring 2024
Location 6	Ongoing throughout 2023/2024	 Building the abutments and piers for the M42/M6 link viaduct until winter 2023 Installation of the first deck for the viaduct (M42/M6 link) to be completed by February 2024 Piling works to prepare for M42 box structure will commence in winter 2023 and ongoing into 2024 Beginning long-term traffic management from Autumn 2023 and through to Spring 2024 to prepare for M42 box structure Delivering the Green Lane Embankment, including: Surfacing the haul road Installing drainage Building piling platforms Transporting materials to site Utility work to divert sewage in Gilson ongoing from June 2023 until June 2024
Location 7	Ongoing throughout 2023/2024	 Setting up a new permanent compound to the south of the B4114 by end 2023. Creating fourth arm of the existing B4114 roundabout to create access into our Coleshill South compound in November 2023. Utility works began on the B4114 in November. Continuing piling works for the Coleshill Viaducts throughout 2023 and 2024 Starting to realign and lower the B4114 in January 2024 to enable the Coleshill Viaducts to pass over. The first phase includes closing the B4114 for four weeks to tie in a temporary diversion road. The second phase includes opening the temporary diversion road for public use. 


Map 3 – Stoneleigh to Offchurch

Location 1	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	 Maintaining the diverted public footpath to compensate for the closure of W129d and W130 over the next three years. Completing piling works to start on B4453 (Rugby Road) in 2024 Reconnecting the diverted utilities throughout 2023 Completing earthworks to build the Rugby Road overbridge. Continuing earthworks and drainage in Cubbington cutting.
Location 2	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	Completing piling works to start on the River Leam viaduct.

Location 3	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	 Delivering multiple realignments on Hunningham Road throughout the year including moving electricity pylons to the north of Hunningham Completing earthworks to build the River Leam Embankment on the south side of the river throughout 2024
Location 4	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	 Using cranes to enable us to build the Offchurch Greenway Green Overbridge throughout 2023/24 Building Fosse Way Overbridge until October 2025
Location 5	Ongoing throughout Winter 2023	 Installing Welsh Road Underbridge and realignment until late 2024 Delivering sheet piling works to the south side of Grand Union Canal for Longhole Viaduct until spring 2024 Delivering earthworks for Welsh Road Embankment and Grand Union Canal Embankment, including launching the platform for Longhole Viaduct until July 2026 Installing drainage and adding topsoil to Offchurch Cutting until July 2025



Location 1	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Construction of the cross-passages of the tunnel to lay the track bed in readiness for the rail systems programmes Multiple utility works in the vicinity of the A425 during Spring/Summer 2024 Monthly monitoring of ground conditions

Location 2 Kineton Road to Banbury Road	Ongoing to Spring 2024 Spring to Autumn 2024	 Construction of the Kineton Road overbridge; and Drainage installation for Kineton Road Overbridge, requiring some temporary closures of Kineton Road Continuation of earthworks activities including settlement ponds, temporary stockpiles and embankments in the area near Southam United Football and Bowls Clubs
Location 3 A423 Banbury Road	Ongoing to Spring 2024	 Earthworks near to the A423 to build cuttings and embankments; Banbury Road overbridge north abutment construction; A423 layby closure near Ladbroke to enable the construction of the realigned highway; and Soft verge work along the A423 in preparation for highway realignments, for safety reasons this may require temporary traffic management or short periods of closure

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Wormleighton/ Priors Hardwick	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Earthworks for the construction of cuttings and embankments near Wormleighton; Preparation for the construction of the SM101 footpath overbridge; Piling, followed by construction of the substructure for the Oxford Canal Viaduct; and Temporary closures of the Oxford Canal may be required
Location 2 Wormleighton Road	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Construction of new sections of highway to tie in the existing highway to the Banbury Road overbridge requiring approximately a onemonth closure of Wormleighton Road; and Closure of Stoneton Lane, Priors Hardwick to construct the Stoneton Lane green bridge, lasting 18-24 months

Our Community Commitments

- 1. Continue to build respectful, long-term relationships with communities and actively encourage our workforce to listen to local concerns and be considerate and accountable for their actions at all times.
- **2.** Work with communities to develop local two-way engagement and communication programmes, ensuring they are accessible and tailored to local needs.
- **3.** Make sure communities are made aware in advance of any activities taking place in their area.
- **4.** Operate a Freephone Community Helpline 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- **5.** Make health and safety a priority for communities and our workforce.
- **6.** Respect the wellbeing of communities, minimising disruption to their lives with local mitigation plans and activities, ensuring we meet the standards set out in the Code of Construction Practice.
- 7. Leave a positive and sustainable legacy for the communities in which we operate.
- **8.** Respond to questions and complaints quickly and efficiently, with an acknowledgement within two working days, and responding within a maximum of 20 working days if we cannot answer the query straight away.
- **9.** Promote awareness of all our property schemes so that anyone who may be eligible has all the information they need and is aware of the support available to them.
- **10.** Display the Residents' Commissioner and Construction Commissioner's contact details on all relevant materials, along with the HS2 Helpline information and complaints procedure.

The Code of Construction Practice forms part of the Secretary of State's Environmental Minimum Requirements for the construction of the railway from London to the West Midlands. It sets out the standards and responsibilities to protect communities and the environment during construction.
