Location 1 Adelaide	March to May 2024	Ongoing works at our Adelaide Road site during this period include:
Road site		 Excavation and removal of the piling platform to enable future works and preparation for the construction of the headhouse base slab;
		Construction of the headhouse reinforced concrete base slab including earthing, waterproofing and reinforced concrete works;

		 Installation of boreholes and monitoring for future shaft construction;
		Routine checks of sheet pile ground anchors;
		 Ongoing site maintenance;
		Preparation of the site for the safe stop period; and
		De-vegetation next to railway tracks.
Various locations, Camden	March to May 2024	We will continue to carry out utility works, bridge surveys and heritage surveys in various locations along the HS2 London tunnels route.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Adelaide Road site	Summer 2024 to Summer 2025	Site activities will be brought to a safe pause from summer 2024 following the Transport Secretary's announcement.
		During the safe stop period, the Adelaide Road site will have 24/7 security in place as well as various personnel in attendance for ongoing monitoring of the site and adjacent Network Rail infrastructure. Various maintenance works may take place when required.
		We are planning to remobilise at the Adelaide Road site from April 2025 after the safe stop period. Works will include setting up for shaft construction.
Various locations, Camden	Summer 2024 to Summer 2025	We will continue to carry out utility, bridge surveys and heritage surveys in various locations along the HS2 London Tunnels route. The surveys will inform future works to protect these third-party assets during construction of the tunnels.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Vehicle holding area	Ongoing to 2033	The vehicle holding area will be in operation until 2033.
Location 1a St Edmunds Terrace, NW8 7QN	November 2023 to March 2024	Thames Water lining works of the Thames Lee tunnel. All works will take place inside the tunnel with access via an existing shaft in the Barrow Hill reservoir site on St Edmunds Terrace, NW8 7QN. Traffic management will be in place to allow
		works and emergency access: Lane closure and a one-way system with access along St. Edmunds Terrace; and Several parking bays suspended on St. Edmunds Terrace.
Location 1b Grafton Crescent, NW1 8SJ	January to March 2024	Thames Water lining works of the Thames Lee Tunnel. Traffic management will be in place for emergency access to the tunnel and ventilation through an existing manhole on Grafton Crescent (residential garden), NW1 8SJ: Lane closure and a one-way system with access via Castle Road and exit onto Castlehaven Road; and Two parking bays suspended on Grafton Crescent.
Location 2 Camden Cutting	Ongoing to 2031	Track-level weekend works Track-level surveys and monitoring within the railway cutting.

	(Easter rail possession 29 March to 2 April)	For safety, due to the proximity of the works to the tracks, these works can only be carried out overnight during the weekend when the tracks are not in use.
Location 2a Camden Cutting	June 2022 onwards	The lorry lay-by on Park Village East north will be in use for the duration of the project.
north: Park Village East	From spring 2024	Lorry lay-by north extension and site access installion
		In spring 2024 we will install a new pedestrian access to our worksite at the northern end of Park Village East. We will extend the hoarded lorry lay-by to just south of 1 Park Village East to enclose the new access and reduce the possible noise and visual impact. This access will be used 24/7 once we begin tunnelling, which is currently scheduled for 2026.
Location 2b Mornington Street Bridge	Open until 2026	Mornington Street Bridge was reopened to vehicles on 8 January 2024 with a 3-tonne weight limit in place. We will continue to monitor the bridge while critical work beneath the bridge continues. Once tunnelling starts in 2026, the bridge will be closed for five years. We will maintain access for pedestrians and cyclists throughout this period.
Location 3	June 2023 to	West retaining wall
Euston Throat worksite	summer 2024	Ongoing works to build a retaining wall in front of the Regents Park Estate. This wall will form the side of the future railway cutting.
		Excavation and concrete pours between Granby Terrace Bridge and Hampstead Road.

	May 2024	Granby Terrace Bridge works
	onwards (Including Easter possession 29	We will continue works to extend Granby Terrace Bridge. We are currently building a wall at track-level between the Network Rail and future HS2 tracks. This wall will also act as one of the supports for the new section of Granby

Terrace Bridge. We plan to start building the extension for Granby Terrace Bridge in May 2024.

For safety, some of this work must be done at night during weekends when the tracks below are not in use.

The bridge will remain closed to the public until our works are complete. We cannot safely open the bridge to vehicles or pedestrians while carrying out major construction works in this area.

We will also work during the Easter weekend from 29 March to 2 April, we will carry out noisy works during the day, and quieter works at night.

Location 3a and 3b and 3c

Hampstead Road, Stanhope Street and Ampthill Estate June 2022 to 2025

Hampstead Road utility works

Permanent utility works

We are installing a new UK Power Networks cable route from Lidlington Place to Varndell Street, to replace the existing route next to Hampstead Road. We will complete these works in two phases. Each phase requires road, lane or footpath closures and parking bay suspensions.

Temporary utility diversion


We need to divert the utilities on Hampstead Road before we can begin works to extend the bridge. We completed phase 1 of these works in Spring 2022. In April 2024, we will begin phase 2. Once we have extended Granby Terrace bridge, we will divert the utilities on Hampstead Road across Granby Terrace. We will carry out these works in six phases and will complete works in June 2025. Each phase will require road, lane or footpath closures and parking bay suspensions.

Ampthill utility works

In summer 2024, we will install two new connections from the new cable route on the main road to the substations at the bottom of Gillfoot and Oxenholme. This is to maintain the

	power supply to the buildings, when the old route through the estate is decommissioned.

Location 1 National Temperance Hospital site	Paused	Works are paused on the main HS2 station site.

Location 2 Former Maria Fidelis	On going	Work is underway to construct staff accommodation and offices. This is adjacent to the new Camden Skills Centre.
School site, North Gower		Temporary pedestrian access to the staff accommodation will be via Cobourg St South.
Street		The permanent access will be located on Hampstead Road.
Location 3 Euston Square Gardens	Ongoing until 2024	Construction of a temporary taxi set-down, pick-up and rank facility on the eastern side of Euston Square Gardens, to serve Euston Station while the HS2 station is being constructed. Some of the remaining works include:
		Installation of external wayfinding;
		Road marking on Eversholt Street;
		Painting of heritage railings in the Gardens;
		Reinstatement of kerbs and asphalt around the new taxi exit;
		Pothole repair and tactile paving reinstatement on Euston Road;
		Cycle stand reinstatement on Euston Road; and
		Removal of temporary mesh fencing.
Location 4 Cobourg St	Ongoing	Utilities works behind the hoarding on Cobourg Street include:
J		Water mains, gas main, London Underground ducts, sewer and micro-tunnelling away from the future HS2 Euston Station footprint;
		No vehicular access on Cobourg Street between the junctions of Starcross Street and Drummond Street. Pedestrian access will be maintained to the station via Drummond Street and Cobourg Street;
		Temporary footpath closure of Cobourg Street North (late May 2024);
		The hoarding line along the Drummond Street walkway linking Cobourg Street and Melton Street is to be realigned, to allow for the ongoing installation of the 1000mm diameter water main on Cobourg Street; and
		Construction of staff pedestrian access on Cobourg St South.

Location 5 Cumberland Market / Robert Street	Until late May 2024	As part of our essential programme of utilities works, we will complete and commission the new 1000mm water main with works taking place over three months in Cumberland Market and Robert Street. Works include: Lane restrictions, temporary 3-way traffic lights; Parking bay suspensions on Cumberland Market; Pedestrian alteration (access will be maintained); Partial road closure of Robert Street and the junction with Hampstead Road; and
		Approximately two days of night-time work is required in April 2024.
Location 5a Hampstead Road		We will be carrying out a change of our hoardings along Hampstead Road. During these works the southbound cycle lane will be suspended to facilitate a small pedestrian diversion into the carriageway.
Location 6 Melton Street and Euston Road	March until summer 2024	Utilities work to a water main inside our Melton Street site.
Location 6a Euston Road	March until summer 2024	UKPN ducting works.
Location 7 Gower Place	Late May until early June 2024	UKPN ducting works.
Location 8 North Gower Street / Euston Street	Ongoing intermittently until Summer 2024	UKPN ducting works. Small sections of North Gower Street will also be impacted, however, pedestrian access will be maintained. Works include parking bay suspensions.
Location 9 and 9a Eversholt Street	Until May 2024	Road markings on Eversholt Street; and Working with Thames Water to install a duct route.
Location 10 Traction sub station	Ongoing until 2026	Relocation of the existing Transport for London traction substation and vent shaft west of Euston Square Gardens (formerly Wolfson House) to enable the HS2 main station construction. Works in the coming months include:

	Construction of the building above ground; and
	Internal fit-out of the building.

Involving

We will involve you in opportunities to benefit and learn as we build HS2 including jobs, skills, education, employment and funding.

We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.

If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.

An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.

We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.

Keeping you informed

We are committed to keeping you informed about work on HS2. This includes ensuring you know what to expect and when to expect it, as well as how we can help.

Residents' Commissioner

The Residents' Commissioner oversees and monitors our commitments to you.
