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This forward look covers HS2 associated work in Warwickshire.


The document is a forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months.

Location 1	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Building segments for viaducts and transporting materials to and from Kingsbury Main Compound throughout 2024 Continuing the transportation of precast segmental viaduct concrete from Kingsbury to Water Orton
Location 2	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Construction the abutments for the M42 Marston Box, due to be completed by July 2024 Continuing works on the M42 Marston Box
Location 3	Ongoing throughout 2024	 Diverting utilities on Faraday Avenue Constructing the temporary diversion of Faraday Avenue





Location 2	Ongoing throughout Spring 2024	Completing piling works to start on the River Leam viaduct.
Location 3	Ongoing throughout Spring 2024	Delivering multiple realignments on Hunningham Road throughout the year including moving electricity pylons to the north of Hunningham



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1	Ongoing to Summer 2024	 A425 periods of traffic management to construct an access road to River Itchington viaduct; A425 Learnington Road will be closed from 23 March to 12 April for water utility diversion Excavation of the cofferdam and construction on the Learnington Road (A425) cutting

Location 2 Kineton Road to Banbury	Ongoing to Summer 2024	Construction of the Kineton Road overbridge; and preparation work for the realignment of Kineton Road, requiring some short closures of Kineton Road
Road	Spring to Autumn 2024	 Continuation of earthworks activities including settlement ponds, temporary stockpiles and embankments in the area near Southam United Football and Bowls Clubs
Location 3 A423 Banbury Road	Ongoing throughout Spring 2024	 Earthworks near to the A423 to build cuttings and embankments; Banbury Road overbridge north abutment construction; and Soft verge work along the A423 in preparation for highway realignments, for safety reasons this may require temporary traffic management or short periods of closure
Location 4 Ladbroke to Radbourne	Ongoing to 2025	 Excavation of the Ladbroke Cutting, including the stockpiling of material; Construction of the Radbourne Viaducts including the installation of the viaduct decks; and Construction of farm accommodation overbridges

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Wormleighton/ Priors Hardwick	Ongoing to Summer 2024	 Earthworks for the construction of cuttings and embankments near Wormleighton; Construction of the SM101 footpath overbridge; Ongoing construction of the Oxford Canal Viaduct; and Temporary closures of the Oxford Canal may be required
Location 2 Wormleighton Road	Spring 2024 to Summer 2024	 Connect new sections of highway to the existing Wormleighton Road requiring a onemonth closure. Highway traffic will then pass over the new Banbury Road overbridge; Banbury road overbridge will have temporary traffic lights until all the permanent features of the bridge are installed; and Closure of Stoneton Lane, Priors Hardwick to construct the Stoneton Lane green bridge, lasting 18-24 months

Our Community Commitments

Through our Community Engagement Strategy and Residents' Charter we have identified ten Community Commitments which we will use as the basis for measuring our success, and that of our suppliers, in how we deliver the new railway.

We will:

- 1. Continue to build respectful, long-term relationships with communities and actively encourage our workforce to listen to local concerns and be considerate and accountable for their actions at all times.
- **2.** Work with communities to develop local two-way engagement and communication programmes, ensuring they are accessible and tailored to local needs.
- **3.** Make sure communities are made aware in advance of any activities taking place in their area.
- **4.** Operate a Freephone Community Helpline 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.
- **5.** Make health and safety a priority for communities and our workforce.
- **6.** Respect the wellbeing of communities, minimising disruption to their lives with local mitigation plans and activities, ensuring we meet the standards set out in the Code of Construction Practice.
- **7.** Leave a positive and sustainable legacy for the communities in which we operate.
- **8.** Respond to questions and complaints quickly and efficiently, with an acknowledgement within two working days, and responding within a maximum of 20 working days if we cannot answer the query straight away.

- **9.** Promote awareness of all our property schemes so that anyone who may be eligible has all the information they need and is aware of the support available to them.
- **10.** Display the Residents' Commissioner and Construction Commissioner's contact details on all relevant materials, along with the HS2 Helpline information and complaints procedure.

The Code of Construction Practice forms part of the Secretary of State's Environmental Minimum Requirements for the construction of the railway from London to the West Midlands. It sets out the standards and responsibilities to protect communities and the environment during construction.
