

Spring Update: Works at Victoria Road Crossover Box and Flat Iron sites

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

Victoria Road Crossover Box works

Works are continuing in the Victoria Road Crossover Box site to construct the ventilation shaft and crossover box. These structures will regulate air flow, provide access to the tunnels, and allow trains to switch tracks as they enter and leave the future Old Oak Common Lane station.

Works are now focused on finalising of the base slab and associated wall and structures following completion of the box excavation works.

Please be reminded that the Victoria Road sites are permitted to operate 24 hours, 7 days a week in agreement with Ealing Council. These extended hours shift pattern will only be used when necessary.

Tunnelling Works

In February 2024 we launched our first Tunnel Boring Machine (TBM) within the Crossover Box. The second TBM launch is scheduled for March 2024. Both TBMs will be used to bore the tunnel from the Victoria Road Crossover Box westwards towards our Greenpark Way site in Ealing.

From spring 2024 we will begin the construction of our sprayed concrete lining (SCL) tunnels, which will connect the Crossover Box to the to the Old Oak Common Station site on Old Oak Common Lane.

Other ongoing works within the Victoria Road Crossover Box site include:

- Installation, maintenance and utilisation of the conveyor system
- The use of surface plant and an overhead bridge crane to support tunnelling works
- Operation of the on-site batching plant
- Excavations, concrete and steel works

Flat Iron site works

We will continue to operate the vehicle holding area at the Flat Iron site to support construction at all HS2 sites in the Old Oak and Park Royal area.

Other ongoing works within the Flat Iron site include:

- Operation of the Vehicle Holding Area.
- Installation, commission, and utilisation of the conveyor system
- Site lighting, utility connections, and maintenance works.
- Concreting, excavation, and drainage works
- Removal of low-lying vegetation and shrubs
- Ongoing use of the conveyor system

What to expect during our ongoing works

During the works outlined in this update you may notice the following in our sites:

- Noise and vibration from operating the Tunnel Boring Machines and associated plant and equipment during day and night shifts
- Noise and vibration from undertaking sprayed concrete lining tunnelling works including associated plant and equipment during day and night shifts
- Noise and vibration from concreting works during day and night shifts
- Additional lighting during the darker periods to ensure works can be carried out safely.
- Various levels of operatives on site
- Mechanical noises from crane movements at night

What we will do

To help minimise disruption from our works, we will carry out activities that may cause greater noise and vibration during our core hours and ensure that best practice methods are used throughout to minimise disruption. The alarms on plant and other large machinery will be switched off during the night shifts and replaced with less intrusive warning systems.

We will continue to monitor our working methods and implement noise reduction training to our site teams and advise them to be mindful of the community during works. We will also implement were possible further mitigation during night shifts to reduce any disruption to the community.


