This forward look covers HS2 associated work in the London Borough of Hillingdon. The document includes:


- A forward look of construction activities planned in the next three months

Map 1 - Hillingdon overview



Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 A412 North Orbital Way, Bucks	Ongoing untilJune 2025	Colne Valley Viaduct, A412 North Orbital Way For access to the viaduct pier locations in the Korda, Savay, and Harefield lakes, temporary jetties - temporary bridge structures – were built across the lakes. These allowed us to use the jetties as a platform to support cranes and other plant, as part of the pier and Colne Valley viaduct construction. It also provided an internal haul road to move equipment and materials. We started to remove these jetties in June 2024, and this will be done in phases as they no longer become needed.
	Ongoing until October 2024	The Colne Valley viaduct has now been constructed over the A412, the River Colne, Korda Lake, Moorhall Road, Long Pond in Savay Lake and has just crossed over the Grand Union Canal. It has now crossed Harefield No2 lake and reached the South Embankment.
Multiple locations	Ongoing until December 2024	Continuing with water quality sampling from the River Colne, River Pinn, Newyears Green Bourne and The Greenway. Small samples of water are taken from streams in the area each month. This is done by staff on foot taking a jam-jar sized sample for analysis.

Map 2 - Colne Valley lakes and Harvil Road




Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Moorhall Road	September 2025	Moorhall Road north and south compounds are fully operational and supporting the construction of the viaduct across Harefield No 2 lake as well as the jetty removal works. Permanent road traffic signals are operating on Moorhall Road and these are managed by Align. These lights control traffic movements at the junction with Moorhall Road and the work compounds.

Location 2 Colne Valley lakes	Ongoing to October 2024	The launching girder, which is constructing the Colne Valley viaduct, has now reached the South Embankment off Dews Lane where it will complete its journey and the build of the viaduct. The launching girder will then be dismantled and removed from site in sections.
Location 3 Dews Lane/South Embankment	Ongoing until November 2024	Compound fencing has been extended on Harefield Moor to accommodate earthworks. The permissive path between the Colne Valley Trail and Harvil Road around the fence-line has been diverted to allow for temporary stockpiling of soil on land next to Dews Lane. The stockpiled material is being used to create the South Embankment of the Colne Valley viaduct, next to Harvil Road. These works started in October 2023 and will continue until November 2024. A works compound and offices are operational at the former Hillingdon Outdoor Activity Centre (HOAC) site at the end of Dews Lane. The South Embankment is where Align interfaces with SCS Railways who are constructing the railway line from this point heading south from Harvil Road. Dews Lane is operating as a temporary haul road with secure access at the junction with Harvil Road.
Location 4 Harvil Road	Ongoing until September 2025	Permanent lights are now installed to control construction traffic movement at the junction with Harvil Road, in Hillingdon.

Location 5, 7 and 3 Denham Country Park to Harvil Road	Summer 2024	National Grid has removed the remaining temporary bridge over the River Colne and is removing the associated infrastructure that's been in place for its HS2 pylon diversion scheme and now reinstating the area. Work is expected to be complete by the end of July (including demobilising National Grid site offices). There may be some low-level noise, but we don't expect any disruption to residents. To complete the work in the timeframe they'll work alternate weekends. This began 6 April. Weekend working hours are 8am to 1pm on Saturdays and 8am to 3pm on Sundays.
Location 6 Dews Lane / Newyears Green Bourne	Ongoing until September 2024	Pier construction is now completed at the South Embankment where the Colne Valley viaduct will complete its journey. Earthworks continue in this location to prepare the area for the viaduct.
Location 7 Savay Lake to Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	Ongoing to June 2025	The viaduct has now been constructed in this location, with finishing works to follow, including the removal of jetties and landscaping.
Location 8 Harefield Lake No2	Ongoing to September 2024	Since June 2022, a short section of the access track/National Cycle Route 6 on the southern side of Harefield Marina has been diverted to enable access to build the pier foundations on the southside of the Grand Union Canal. A temporary pontoon has been built in the canal to carry light vehicles, pedestrians, and cyclists around the worksite. This will be removed and the area landscaped in summer 2024.

Location 9 Grand Union Canal / Harefield Marina	July 2024	The existing bridleway leading from U34 to Harvil Road is diverted to allow for soil stockpiling at the South Embankment. Access to the fishing locations and Dellside track are not affected, however users of the footpath are diverted around a perimeter fence.

Location 1 West Ruislip (and west along the northern side of the Chiltern Line)	Ongoing until September 2024	 Storage of tunnel segments for the TBM Segment delivery to TBM as it moves east: by rail during out of hours and some deliveries via lorries during core hours. Construction of two permanent attenuation tanks north of the Portal Main conveyor in operation Removal of the temporary conveyor structure

Location 2 Breakspear Road South (Both sides of Breakspear Road South)	Ongoing until October 2024	 River Pinn realignment works and permanent drainage installation Earthworks to construct West Ruislip Retained Embankment (east of Breakspear Road South) and Gatemead Embankment (west of Breakspear Road South) Installation of drainage - including culverts, piped networks and open channels - throughout all work areas across west and east of Breakspear Road South near the rail bridge
Location 3 Golf Course area	Ongoing until August 2024	 Reopening part of Ruislip Golf Course, including grass cutting and removing overgrown vegetation within the field and along the fence line, performing an ecological check for any protected species, and removing fencing along the area Maintenance of the newly constructed wildlife habitat Ongoing maintenance of fencing and hoarding along the area which will include some strimming. Access to the golf course for the public will be maintained via the approved footpaths Maintenance of the diverted section of the U44 footpath

Location 1 South Ruislip vent shaft	Ongoing until August 2024	 During this period, we will: Build the internal reinforced concrete structures in the main and satellite shafts Build the ventilation shaft basements including excavation and concrete works Build the southern, western and eastern site boundary walls including pre-cast concrete panels and blockwork Carry out utility connections along the site boundary and within the site Groundworks along the southern, eastern and northern site boundary Build underground reinforced concrete tanks Build the concrete foundations and steel frame structures for the headhouse Prepare to build the headhouse building

Location 2 Various locations - Utility work	Ongoing until end of Summer 2024	 Decommission the Yeading Brook Pipeline Build underground services Build the autotransformer station (ATS) building We will carry out utility works on Breakspear Road South in the West Ruislip area. Post Tunnel Boring Machine condition surveys and utility works are being undertaken in London Borough of Hillingdon at the following locations: Blenheim Crescent West End Road Bridgewater Road Station Approach
Location 3 Various locations along the Northolt Tunnels West route	Ongoing to Autumn 2024	Northolt Tunnels West broadly follow the alignment of the London Underground Central Line and Chiltern Mainline Railway. TBM Sushila and TBM Caroline are constructing twin tunnels: one for trains travelling from the West Midlands to London, known as the London tunnel and one for trains travelling from London to the West Midlands known as the Birmingham tunnel. The tunnels route is near the following residential roads: Ickenham Close, Blenheim Crescent, Herlwyn Avenue, Lawn Close, Almond Close, Cherry Close, Roundways, Bridgwater Road and Rabournmead Drive in the London Borough of Hillingdon. Both TBMs, Sushila and Caroline, are now in Northolt in the London Borough of Ealing. TBM Sushila has now reached the Mandeville Road Vent Shaft and TBM Caroline is due to reach the vent shaft towards the end of July. Cross passages are being constructed at approximately every 500 metres along the route. Cross passages have a key role in providing a safe operational railway. In an emergency, they allow the safe evacuation of passengers. We have completed construction of the cross passages between Ickenham High Road and South Ruislip. The remainder of the cross passages in Hillingdon should be completed by Autumn 2024.

- We will ask you about the design of specific parts of the railway.

Responding

- Our dedicated HS2 Helpdesk is available 24 hours a day, every day of the year, to help with any questions or concerns you have about HS2 or our work.
- If things go wrong, we have a complaints process and a dedicated complaints team.
- An independent Construction Commissioner monitors how we manage and deal with complaints.

Consulting

- We will hold formal consultations with you while we seek permission to build Phase 2b of HS2.
- We now have permission to build Phase One and Phase 2a. This means we will only
 formally consult on this part of HS2 when we need permission to do things that fall
 outside the terms of the legislation agreed by Parliament.
