High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty VINCI (BBV) is working in partnership with HS2 Ltd to build the new high-speed railway in your area.

The work we will be doing.

The new railway will pass over the M42 on a box structure near the Birmingham Business Park.

Working with National Highways as we progress with the build of the M42 twin box, we will need access to the central reserve of the carriage way.

To create a safe working space, we will need to install narrow lanes on sections of the M42 with some overnight closures for the duration of these works. The narrow lanes will be in-place until the M42 twin box structure has been built.

M42 northbound, junction 6-7a, will be closed for 4 nights on 19 August - 22 August between 9pm – 5am.

M42 southbound, junction 7a – 6, will be closed for 7 nights on 30 August – 6 September between 9pm – 5am.

When we close the M42 northbound on 19 August 2024, we will carry out an adjustment to the traffic management on the link road to the southbound M6, to avoid further closures in September.

The adjustments will not affect daytime journeys from M42 towards Coventry on the M6.

During the day we will have traffic management in place, with three lanes available for road users and a speed restriction of 50mph.

For the overnight closure a fully signed diversion route will be in place, please see map of diversion roots on following pages.






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M42 junction 7a to junction 6 southbound closed

At M6 Junction 4 (Coleshill Interchange) leave the M6 and follow the A446 and A452 to the A45 westbound and join the M42 at junction 6 (Bickenhill Interchange - which includes NEC/Resorts World/Birmingham Airport and Birmingham International Railway Station).
