High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain.

Utility works on the A40 Western Avenue

We wrote to you in May about works to protect and upgrade the main gas pipe below the A40 Western Avenue between Alperton Lane and Hanger Lane Gyratory. These works were planned to take place between 27 May until late October 2024.

There have been some changes to the dates of the phases of the works which are outlined in the table on the following pages.

We will continue working with utility providers, Transport for London and Ealing Council to coordinate works on the local road network, wherever possible.

How this might affect you

We are digging a number of trenches across the road to reach the depth of the main gas pipe as the existing metal pipe will be replaced with plastic.

To ensure the safety of the public and our staff, temporary changes will be in place on the A40 Western Avenue for the duration of these works. Please see the following pages for the dates and traffic management measures that will be in place, throughout the works.

Below you can find more detailed information for each of the traffic management phases throughout the works.

These dates are subject to change

| 27 May to 30 October 2024 | Changes to diversion routes and contraflows will occur throughout the works. Signage will notify drivers of any diversion routes in place. |

| Phase 1: from 27 May – 11 July 2024 | Day time from 6am to 10pm*, lane closure on eastbound and westbound carriageway. |
| | Overnight 10pm to 6am, lane closure on east and westbound carriageway. Traffic diverted over Hanger Lane gyratory. |

^{*}These hours may change to 5am to 9pm and 9pm to 5am pending confirmation from TfL.

| Phase 3: 28 July to 12 August 2024 | There will be a lane closure in place for both eastbound and westbound traffic. Traffic will be maintained in both directions via a contraflow system running in the remaining open lanes. |
| Phase 3 to 4 change over | 2 nights: Full Eastbound and Westbound A40 closure between Target Roundabout and Hanger Lane Gyratory * Diversion in place. Westbound entry slip road closed from Hanger Lane. |
| Phase 4: 12 to 28 August 2024 | There will be a lane closure in place for both eastbound and westbound traffic. Traffic will be maintained in both directions via a contraflow system running in the remaining open lanes. |
| Phase 4 to 5 change over | Night 1: Full eastbound A40 closure from Target Roundabout to Hanger Lane Gyratory * Diversion in place. 2 westbound lanes closed Night 2: Full westbound A40 closure from Hanger Lane Gyratory to Target Roundabout to including entry slip road from Hanger Lane * Diversion in place. 2 eastbound lanes closed. |

| Phase 5: 28 August to 10 September 2024 | There will be a lane closure in place for both eastbound and westbound traffic. Traffic will be maintained in both directions via a contraflow system running in the remaining open lanes. |

| Phase 6: 10 September to 8 October 2024 | There will be a lane closure in place for both eastbound and westbound traffic. Traffic will be maintained in both directions via a contraflow system running in the remaining open lanes. |
| | Drivers who wish to access the A406 from Hanger Lane Gyratory should use lane 1 eastbound. |
| | Drivers travelling into Central London should use the contraflow lane for eastbound traffic. |
| Phase 6 to 6a change over | 1 night – East-bound exit slip road closure |
| Phase 6a to 7 change over | Night 1: Eastbound exit slip road closed |

| Phase 7: 8 to 24 October 2024 | Lane closure will be in place on both carriageways |

- * Westbound diversion will be to the south via the A406 Gunnersbury Avenue, A4 Great West Road and the A312 The Park Way.
