

# Update: Old Oak Common tunnel and site setup

## HS2-SCS-25-1141

### Location

Old Oak Common

### Duration

**Tunnelling works ongoing until December 2026.** Surface works on the Old Oak Common station site: 8am to 6pm Mondays to Fridays, 8am to 1pm on Saturdays. Below ground works 24/7.

### What we are doing

Continuing to build the Old Oak Common tunnel between our Victoria Road Crossover Box site and Old Oak Common station, and setting up a site at the station.

### What to expect

**Minimal impact until 12 June 2026.** Below ground works becoming noisy during and outside core hours from 12 June 2026. We will contact impacted residents in advance of these works. We will also need to deliver large equipment by abnormal load twice to the site from 15 June 2026.

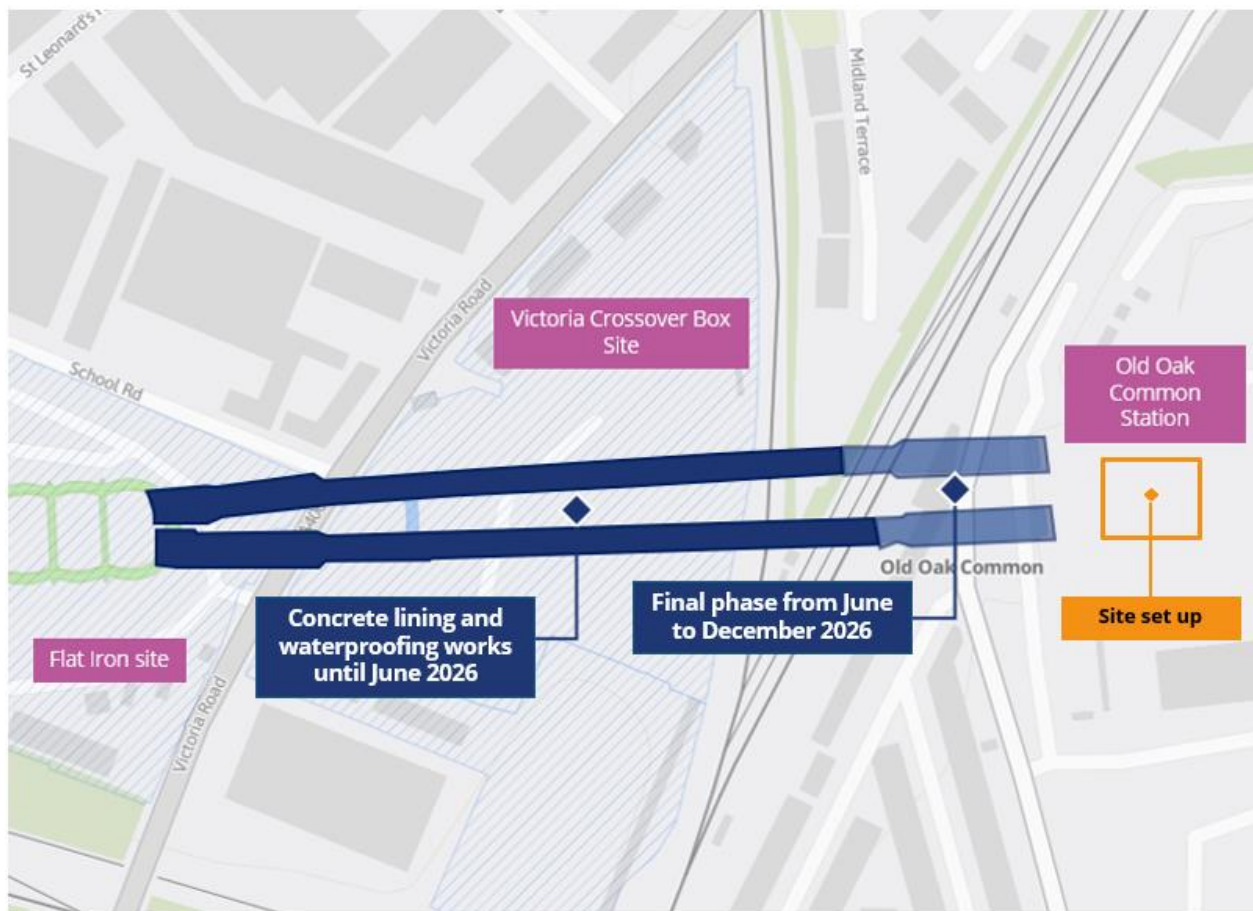

## Additional information

We are building the Old Oak Common tunnel using the sprayed concrete lining (SCL) method. A narrow tunnel is first dug out and then enlarged to create the final tunnel, which needs concrete lining and waterproofing before it is complete. We are continuing the concrete lining and waterproofing from our Victoria Road Crossover Box site towards Old Oak Common until June 2026. We will then start our final phase, of tunneling underneath Old Oak Common Lane before connecting to the Old Oak Common station site. During this phase there will be noisier works seven days a week and sometimes in the evening. To support these works we will be setting up a site in the station site. From 15 June 2026 we will also need to deliver large equipment by abnormal load twice to the site. The abnormal loads do not need police escorts or stopping of traffic.
