High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Balfour Beatty VINCI (BBV) is working in partnership with HS2 Ltd to build the new high-speed railway in your area.

Extending the period of lane and on-slip closure

A new high-speed railway station is being built within Solihull, near the M42, A45 Coventry Road and A446, close to the NEC and Birmingham Business Park.

We recently communicated a lane closure and on-slip closure to undertake some vegetation clearance to create the safe working areas for our workforce and the road realignment works.

To carry out these works safely, we will need to extend the period of these closures as below.

- A452 on slip full closure from Monday 10 February to Friday 4 April 2025 between the hours of 9.30am and 3.30pm.
- A446/A452 southbound single lane closure from Monday 10 February to Friday 4 April 2025 between the hours of 9.30am and 3.30pm.
- Packington Lane A452 southbound access/exit closure from Monday 10 February to Friday 4 April 2025 between the hours of 9.30am and 3.30pm

A452 Packington Lane access

Access to Packington Lane between Monday 10 February to Friday 4 April 2025, will be from the northbound access only via the A452 northbound between the hours of 9.30am and 3.30pm weekdays.

A452 southbound on slip closure and Packington Lane access diversion

A452 southbound on-slip diversion


Road users wishing to travel southbound on the A452 from the roundabout should follow the diversion northbound onto the A446 northbound, to the M6 junction 4 roundabout (Coleshill Interchange) traffic will take the fourth exit and follow the A446 Southbound for approximately 1.4 miles where the diversion will end.

Packington Lane A452 southbound access diversion

Traffic wishing to access Packington Lane via the A446/A452 southbound will continue onto the A452 Chester Road southbound carriageway towards Stonebridge Island, taking the fourth exit onto the A452 Chester Road northbound carriageway until reaching the A452 Packington Lane access, where the diversion will end.

Packington Lane A452 southbound exit diversion

All traffic wishing to exit Packington lane via the A452 southbound egress point, will need to use the A452 northbound only. Motorists will need to continue along Packington Lane traveling through the A452 Chester Road underpass towards the A452 Chester Road northbound carriageway, continuing northbound joining the fully signed diversion route.
