High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. The health and safety of our workforce and the communities we work within is our priority. You can sign up for regular updates in your local area at www.hs2innorthants.co.uk.

What are we doing?

As we progress the construction of Banbury Road overbridge in Boddington we will be increasing our working hours.

Permission for additional working hours has been agreed with the local authority, and noise levels will be closely monitored to ensure they remain within the permitted limits.

During our extended, overnight working hours, construction activities will be focused on the cutting underneath the bridge structure during the week. At weekends activities will be focused on new sections of highway being built as part of the scheme.

The machinery and equipment in use during the night work will be limited to keep noise levels to a minimum. Some additional lighting will be required for us to work safely.

When will these works take place?

From 22 April to 22 August 2025 we will be working 24 hours a day for some periods of time during these dates.

This is subject to local authority consents and approvals, and ongoing review.
