



Ongoing works at North Embankment, Denham

High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. Work continues in the North Embankment area, just to the west of the A412 next to the Colne Valley viaduct.

What will be happening over the next few months?

We have now completed the installation of both parapets (walls of the viaduct) and noise barriers on the Colne Valley viaduct as it crosses the A412. Work began last October 2024 to prepare the foundations for the construction of the concrete noise barriers which begin where the Colne Valley viaduct starts and then stretch back northwards for nearly 500 metres either side of the railway line. The concrete noise barriers will be 4m tall and are part of the screening for the operational railway. These works will start in April 2025 until June 2025. You can see the noise barriers in the artist impression below.



In March this year we will also begin the final stages of the landscaping, which will include vegetation clearance, removal of the North Embankment compound, constructing the North Embankment access road for railway maintenance vehicles; topsoiling and planting; the restoring of the Old Shire Lane footpath and new access from the A412, as well as new bridleways and a viewing area.

Vegetation clearance; mulching machines; movement of site vehicles such as dump trucks, bulldozers and excavators for short periods of time

These works will take place Monday to Friday 8am to 6pm

Landscaping works also continue across the western slopes 8am to 10pm Monday to Friday and 8am to 6pm Saturday and Sunday

For all works there is one hours set and up and close down outside of working hours
