Area 1 - Adelaide Road



Three-month look ahead

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Adelaide Road site	Adelaide stop'	Works at the Adelaide Road Ventilation Shaft and Headhouse site were brought to a 'safe stop' in May 2024, with the expectation that works would resume in spring 2025. However, as part of a recent and ongoing review of the construction programme, we do not now expect works to resume in 2025. Our shaft and headhouse site at Adelaide Road will remain in a 'safe stop'.
		The hoarding will remain in place, and there will be 24-hour security. Some non-intrusive works, such as monitoring, and design will continue.
		The local community engagement team and the HS2 Helpdesk will still be available to answer your questions.


Location 2 Camden Winding Vaults	Ongoing until August 2025	Ongoing surveys are taking place to understand the structural nature and condition of the Camden Winding Vaults. This will include installation of access scaffolding in the Vaults, ventilation and monitoring equipment.
Various locations, Camden	March to April 2025	We will carry out bridge and heritage surveys in various locations along HS2 London Tunnels route. The surveys will inform future works to protect these third-party assets during construction of the tunnels. We'll write to you if these works will impact you. Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Adelaide Road site	Ongoing 'safe stop'	Works at the Adelaide Road Ventilation Shaft and Headhouse site were brought to a 'safe stop' in May 2024, with the expectation that works would resume in spring 2025. However, as part of a recent and ongoing review of the construction programme, we do not now expect works to resume in 2025. Our shaft and headhouse site at Adelaide Road will remain in a 'safe stop'.
		The hoarding will remain in place, and there will be 24-hour security. Some non-intrusive works, such as monitoring, and design will continue.
		The local community engagement team and the HS2 Helpdesk will still be available to answer your questions.
Location 2 Camden Winding Vaults	Ongoing until Autumn 2027	We will continue carrying out surveys to understand the structural nature and condition of the Camden Winding Vaults. This will include installation of monitoring equipment and operation of ventilation. The surveys will inform any future

		monitoring and mitigation works needed in advance of tunnelling works through this area.
		The current phase of work will continue until August 2025 . We will clear the vaults of mud and flood water then install scaffolding into the vaults to allow safe access.
Finchley Road area	Summer 2025 to Spring 2026	We are planning to carry out gas diversion works in the Swiss Cottage area from July 2025.
		These works are planned to take place in phases with some lane closures and partial road closures required across Finchley Road, College Crescent, Hilgrove Road and Alexandra Road.
		The dates and details of the works remain subject to utilities design and coordination with other works in the area.
		We are working with Camden Council and TfL to agree the plans for these works. We will share more information when the details have been confirmed.

Area 2 - Euston Approaches



Construction look ahead

In the Euston Approaches, Skanska Costain STRABAG joint venture (SCSJV) construction partner will continue with utilities diversions, works on Granby Terrace Bridge, Hampstead Road Bridge and some tunnelling enabling works as well as monitoring and protective works to properties.


HS2 are rescheduling works in the Euston Cavern and Euston Scissor Box areas to ensure they are delivered at the lowest reasonable cost. We will keep you informed about our works programme.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 Vehicle holding area	Ongoing	The vehicle holding area will be in operation until major construction works are complete. This avoids lorries queueing in streets near worksites.
Location 2	Ongoing	Track-level weekend works
Camden Cutting		Track-level surveys and monitoring within the railway cutting.
		For safety, due to the proximity of the works to the tracks, these works can only be carried out overnight during the weekend when the tracks are not in use.
	Ongoing till Summer 2025	In the Euston Cavern , works are ongoing to reinforce and protect the Network Rail retaining wall. These works will continue until summer 2025.
Location 2a Mornington Street Bridge	Ongoing	We reopened Mornington Street bridge to vehicles on 8 January 2024. We have put a 3-tonne weight limit in place which we are managing with width restriction barriers at both end of the bridge.
		For safety reasons, Network Rail and SCS will continue to monitor the bridge whilst work continues beneath it.
		Please note the bridge will be closed throughout the tunnelling works and we will update you in advance. These are expected to take five years to complete.

Location 2b Camden Cutting south	Ongoing to Summer 2025	Euston Scissor Box We are continuing works to strengthen and protect the Network Rail retaining wall that runs along Park Village East, to ensure the wall can safely withstand the movement caused by our works.	
Location 3 Euston Throat worksite	May 2024 onwards	Granby Terrace Bridge works The Granby Terrace Bridge deck extension was completed in November 2024 and finishing works are under way. This will be ongoing until summer 2025. We will then continue to redirect utilities off Hampstead Road and on to the bridge. For safety, some of this work must be done at night during weekends when the tracks below are not in use. The bridge will remain closed to the public until construction works are complete. We cannot safely open the bridge to vehicles or pedestrians while carrying out major construction works in this area. We will endeavour to carry out noisy works during the day, and quieter works at night. Network Rail wall removal In March 2025, we will begin phase 1 works to remove a section of the Network Rail retaining wall. Due to the proximity of the wall to the live railway, we will install scaffolding to allow us to complete this safely during core working hours. We will work over the Easter weekend when the	
	Ongoing until autumn 2025	In March 2025, we will begin phase 1 works to remove a section of the Network Rail retaining wall. Due to the proximity of the wall to the live railway, we will install scaffolding to allow us to complete this safely during core working hours.	
Location 3a Zone 5 worksite	Autumn 2025	Zone 5 works/site preparation and pilling From autumn 2025, we will begin site set up ahead of piling, which will include installation of cabins and internal fit out and electrical connections. There will be a site office and welfare building with connection to mains power.

Location 3b, 3c Hampstead	Ongoing to Early 2026	Hampstead Road utility works Temporary utility diversion
Road and Varndell Street		We need to divert the utilities on Hampstead Road before we can begin works to extend the bridge. Once we have extended Granby Terrace bridge, we will divert the utilities on Hampstead Road across Granby Terrace. We completed phase 1 of these works in Spring 2022 and began phase 2 in April 2024. We will complete phase 2 by early 2026. Each phase will require road, lane or footpath closures and parking bay suspensions. The update on above works could be found here.

Area 3 - Euston Station



Construction look ahead

Locations are colour coded to help you easily understand if the works are carried out within one of our worksites or on the street:

- Purple: Works on site (inside our hoardings)
- **Blue**: Works on the street (outside our hoardings)

Recognising the Government's review of Euston Station design, HS2 construction partner MDjv are continuing with critical preparatory work to enable delivery of a future station.

This includes essential utilities and construction of a new Traction Substation (TSS) and construction of the ground floor of the former Maria Fidelis school building into a community hub.

Location of works	Proposed duration	Description of works
Location 1 National Temperance Hospital site	Paused	Works are paused on the main HS2 station site.
Location 2 Hampstead Road/ Harrington Street (2a) / Varndell Street (2b) William Road (2c)	Until May 2025	As part of our essential programme of utilities works in the area, we completed installation of the new 1000mm water main on Hampstead Road, Cumberland Market and Robert Street. Works to commission the new mains will continue until April 2025. Upcoming works include; remaining UKPN ducting along Hampstead Road, William Road, Harrington Street and Varndell Street. These works will help to enable the new electricity substations being installed. On completion of these works Varndell Street will remain closed to facilitate SCS works on Hampstead.
Cardington Street (2d)	Until May 2025	From April 2025 we will begin construction of a new sewer chamber in the existing manhole. These works will enable decommissioning of the existing sewer in the North of Cardington Street and Melton Street Upcoming works include;
Cumberland	Until May 2025	 Alteration of the existing hoarding line to facilitate works; Deep excavation of the sewer cofferdam; Secondary diversions; Ground clearance and; Decommissioning of the existing sewer In spring 2025 we will return to Cumberland Market and Varndell Street to decommission the existing watermain.
Market (2E) / Varndell Street (2F)	2023	 Decommissioning works include; Chambers breakdown down and excavation below ground level; Grouting works and; Reinstatement of the road and pavement Parking bays suspensions

Location 3 Robert Street	April 205	In April 2025 we will access the existing water chamber on Robert Street (one – two nights) to install a hydro-guard unit.
		Works include;
		 Temporary closure of Robert Street Temporary work sites where work is taking place; Lifting existing manhole cover; Installation of hydro-guard; and Parking bays suspensions
Location 4	Until Spring	Euston Community Hub
Former Maria Fidelis School site, North Gower Street	2025	During winter 2025, MDjv completed a partial hand over to The Euston Partnership (TEP). The final hand over to TEP will be completed in Spring 2025 and the new hub will come into use. Once operational, TEP will manage the new space, and local organisations can deliver community initiatives from there.
		Remaining works include; Installation of the permanent roof to the entrance Installation of roller shutter and sliding door
Euston Street (4a) North Gower Street (4b, 4c)	April – June 2025	From April 2025 we will undertake gas main works and diversions on Euston Street and North Gower Street (adjacent to Euston Street and Stephenson way). Works include;
		 Concrete breakout and excavations Replacement of the existing gas main Temporary work sites; Parking bays suspensions and; Noise mitigation blankets during concreate breakout
Starcross Street (5)	Until spring 2026	From April 2025 we will begin construction of a new UKPN Substation behind the hoarding. To enable future UKPN assets for two weeks in April 2025, we will install ducts beyond the hoarding line. These works will include;
		 Temporary site and traffic management; Concrete breakout to install the cables; Suspension of parking bays; and Reinstatement of road surface

Location 6 Cobourg St	Ongoing	We are continuing with critical utilities activities behind the hoarding on Cobourg Street. The gas and watermain installations are now complete. Our next phases of work include; • Connection into manhole adjacent to Euston Street; • Excavation for UKPN Power ductwork; • Backfill & resurfacing work UKPN Power ductwork; • Construction of UKPN substations; • Temporary footpath closure of Cobourg
		Street South to facilitate Virgin Media ducting works and; Ongoing realignment of hoardings and walkways to facilitate works Cobourg Street remains closed to vehicles.
Drummond Street (7)	Until autumn 2025	We completed the CCTV gas investigative works on Drummond Street in May 2024. To enable the gas main, Virgin media will relocate their existing assets. We anticipate that Virgin media enabling works will be completed by late July 2025. The Drummond Street gas main works will begin late Summer 2025 until Autumn 2025.
		 Works include; Temporary work site; Hoarding alignment; Full road closure of Drummond Street during final phase of works (approximately 12 weeks) Breakout of concrete to expose the gas main; and Parking and loading bays suspensions To facilitate on -going works we will relocate Drummond Street walkway intermittently, however access will be maintained to Euston Station.
Location 8 Melton Street	Until winter 2026	In winter 2024, we completed installation of the 42- inch watermain on Melton Street. Ongoing works include gas main installation behind the hoarding.
Location 9 Traction sub station	Ongoing	Work is progressing well to bring the new substation into use. We are beginning to complete key systems such as Mechanical Equipment Plumbing (MEP) installations throughout the new structure. We also completed the external trench for earthing, priming

		and temporary painting of the structure in summer 2024. The substation will become operational late summer 2025 and it will be used to power the Northern Line. The permanent façade will be installed at a later stage.
		Ongoing works include;
		 Floor finishing; Installation of lighting & Small power cabling; and Removal of acoustic shed Demolition of the existing substation (Drummond Street). This is anticipated to begin in 2026.
Location 10	Until May	We will undertake CCTV surveys to inform the future
Eversholt	2025	design of gas main on Eversholt Street;
Street (a/ b)		Works include;
		 Suspension of loading bays adjacent to Network Rail access steps; and Temporary work sites and two excavations are required. We will turn later in 2025 to complete the gas main installation.
